Daycare Licensing

A licence is required under the Child Care Licensing Act to operate a child care program that provides

care for seven or more children except for:

• An education program provided under the School Act;

• A day camp, vacation camp or other recreational program that operates for less than 12

consecutive weeks;

Supervision of children at a recreational facility, retail centre or other commercial establishment

where the parents of the children remain on the premises and are available; or

• Private babysitting in a private home for six children or less. The caregiver's own children are not

included in these six.

Approved family day homes are not required to be licensed as they are monitored by the family day home

agency.
