A new Australian play written by Jeannie Haughton from Drouin who has written other historical plays such as Quilting the Armour, about the Kelly women, mostly produced in Melbourne.

It is about Gippsland's early settlement... a landscape of silence, secrets and one captive white woman. Who was Angus McMillan? His wife Christina seeks the man and the Myth.

'This play has a take on McMillan that bring to the fore his sometimes violent relationships with the aboriginal tribes and makes his vision of himself as Laird of Gippsland the starting point for his actions. It was the finishing point for lots of the aboriginies too.

Apart from the trains going by, and four military helicopters flying over - which I thought was a less than poignant anachronism on the director's part - the play is dressed well, the setting is terrific and the acting tops.' - Graham Scott:
