

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

#### REFLECTION ON ALL SOULS THE SOULS OF THE JUST ARE IN THE HANDS OF GOD



Most often when I invited a family to come forward for prayers at the end of a Mass celebrated for their loved ones, I'd notice how fresh their sadness and sorrow still was. Many of them still ache from broken hearts over their loss. Some are still dealing with unresolved issues, like good-byes that were probably not said (as is the case with my Uncle that died this month in Nigeria), some may be suffering because of peace that was not made, gratitude that was not expressed, etc. Most of all, the gaping hole their

departure left in us, their loved ones, cannot really be filled by anything or anyone because they were unique. May the celebration of the feast of All Souls bring consolation for each of our families that have lost loved ones. As we pray for them and visit their graves this November month, may we take consolation in the fact that their souls are in the hands of God (Wisdom 3:1), and may we be consoled and healed by the Lord of the Resurrection.

Last year, through the Bereavement Ministry, we explored more ways to celebrate All Souls as a parish; to help bereaved families in their mourning; and to continue to aid the dead with our prayers. So, we had families that lost loved ones bring pictures of their deceased loved ones to Mass. We kept the pictures for a week. It was a good tradition and we wanted to build on that this year. So, once again, we will have families that have lost loved ones in the past year do the same. We will recognize them at the 10:00 am Mass and pray for them. We have not forgotten them and all they did among us. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed through the mercy of God rest in peace. Amen.

As we pray for them, we also ask them to pray for us, for our own consolation, peace and strength. As Catholics, we have the wonderful doctrine of our Communion with the Saints. This gives us a lot of hope and consolation in times of despair and sadness.

On this All Souls Day, we commend them into the hands of Our Blessed Mother, St. Joseph, and all the Saints. May they lead them (our loved ones) to Our Lord Jesus Christ who will escort them into the Kingdom of Heaven. They (our loved ones) will in turn, when our time is up on earth, escort us to Our Blessed Mother and St. Joseph and to Our Lord Jesus, Who will escort us to our heavenly home. For now, we must wipe our tears and journey on, like the soldiers of Christ that we are.

I personally have been slow in registering to vote since I became a US citizen some three years ago. 
