



January and February 2025

The Book of the Month for both January and February 2025 is The Three Ordinary Voices of God by Matthew Kelly. We gave this book away as a Christmas gift to everyone at the parish, and we will have more copies of the book to give away as well as we begin the month of February. It is a very easy, enjoyable, and engaging read at just over 100 pages. Matthew Kelly, as usual, does a wonderful job of helping us to access the deep topic of prayer using gifted story-telling, analogies and examples that come to life, and practical tips to help us follow through with this most essential habit of our faith. Sometimes we do overcomplicate how we approach our spiritual lives, and recognizing how God speaks through three of our most fundamental human experiences: our needs, our talents, and our desires; Matthew Kelly brings to life how often and profoundly God wants to speak to us and move us closer to Him. This all leads to our ultimate desire, which is our desire for God Himself, so I encourage you to give this book a chance and please consider coming to our book discussion on Wednesday, February 26th from 7:30 - 8:30 pm in the Church social hall. This is just a quick reminder, but you don't have to read or book or be an expert in prayer to attend this meeting! It is a great way to simply hear my favorite parts, get a quick summary of the book, and talk to some other parishioners about prayer and how to live our Catholic Faith in a deeper way. 

The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings with your children

Think of a time when you had to wait for something very exciting. Was it easy for you to wait?

Most of us do not

think waiting is easy. In our readings today, we hear about two people who had been waiting for something for the entire lives. Simeon and Anna were part of the people of Israel. God made a promise to send someone who would bring salvation for the people and bring a new kingdom of justice, peace, mercy and love. The people waited for many, many generations for him to come.

Simeon knew he would see the Messiah with his own eyes because God had promised it to him. He believed God would keep that promise.

As devout Jews, Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the temple soon after he was born because they were part of the people of Israel, just like Simeon and Anna. Although Jesus was a very special baby, he looked like any other baby.

Simeon and Anna recognized Jesus because they had opened themselves to God's Word and believed God's promise would be fulfilled. Simeon thanked God for letting him see Jesus before dying in peace. Anna also blessed God and gave thanks for this newborn savior. Jesus was worth waiting for. Jesus reminds us that God never forgets his promises. Jesus was born, lived, died, and rose again for us.
