MEASURING & CHECK-IN: Sat & Sun: 7:00 - 7:30 AM See the forms page at www.k9cpe.com for a membership form. See "Registering with CPE" in the online rulebook for registration questions.	

MOVE-UPS AT THE TRIAL: Move-ups from Sat to Sun for duplicated classes will be taken until the end of the last class on Sat. No exceptions.

MEASURING: There will be no measuring of dogs after the judge's briefing begins each day. All dogs without a Permanent Card (P-Card) must be measured before the judge's briefing to show that day. **There will be no exceptions.**

PRIZES & AWARDS: Placement rosettes or ribbons will be awarded for 1st through 4th place for Qualifying and non-qualifying scores for all classes. Dogs with an NT (no time) are not eligible for any ribbons. Qualifying ribbons will be awarded to all dogs receiving a qualifying score, and Jr Handlers in Standard.

EXERCISE YOUR DOG RESPONSIBLY! PLEASE PICK UP AFTER YOUR DOG AT THE SHOW SITE AND HOTELS! ALL DOGS MUST BE ON LEASH EXCEPT WHEN IN THE RING OR WARM UP AREA. THERE IS A LEASH LAW IN OREGON.

OBSTACLES: The following obstacles may be used. Obstacle specifications shall meet the current CPE obstacle requirements.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

- The safety of the dogs is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.
- Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by action of the show committee.
- It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dog(s) and / or children. Any exhibitor whose dog(s) and / or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the show committee, be asked to leave the show site. In that case, no refund of any fees paid will be made.
- No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.
- Exhibitors are responsible for complete, accurate, and legible information on the entry forms: illegible or incomplete entries cannot be entered in the show.

Additionally:

- Confirmation letters will be sent by email except if there is no email address listed on the entry form or the exhibitor specifically requests to receive his/her confirmation letter by postal mail.
- 100% of entry fees will be refunded if requested before or on the closing date of October 23, 2019. Refunds for withdrawals requested after the closing date but before the first competition date listed in this premium will be made only for injured or ill handlers or injured, ill or in-season dogs. Owner/handler will receive a refund less a \$20 per dog handling fee. Verification from a doctor or vet may be requested.
- There shall be no refunds for withdrawals requested on or after the first competition date listed in this premium, regardless of the reason.
- Checks will be held until the closing date. There will be a \$20 service charge for returned checks. Payment in full of entry fees and service charges shall be made by money order or cash before the first date of competition listed in this premium.
- Exhibitors are advised that other public and private events may occur within the fairgrounds complex on the same dates as this trial. To ensure the continued availability of this site, exhibitors must conduct themselves in a responsible and respectful manner. Exhibitors are responsible for the appropriate conduct of their guests, children and dogs.
- Dogs must be exercised only in designated areas.

Each motel has its own prices and rules for dogs, and they vary widely between motels. Some motels have exceptions to their usual rules for 'show dogs'.

ON-SITE RV CAMPING

All RV camping arrangements are now handled by the Fairgrounds. Go to <https://www.bentoncountyfair.net/> and click on the link for Benton Oaks RV. Follow the instructions to reserve a space. You'll be asked to provide details about your camping rig, such as type, length, width, and amps. Disregard the statement in the reservation system about a 2 dog limit. The Fairgrounds is aware that our competitors may have more than 2 dogs. It is very important to clean up after your dogs and to make sure they're not disrupting other guests.

Most competitors prefer to camp at the lightpole spaces just north of the arena. This area is called the "C Loop". The reservation system does not allow you specifically choose C Loop spaces. To do so, you'll need to contact the Fairgrounds office at 541-766-6521 after you've completed the reservation process. Tell them you would like your space to be in the C Loop, and they will move you when space is available.

The Fairgrounds office will provide you with the RV camping map, passcodes for the restrooms, the wi-fi password, and contact information for the campground host. WAG will not be able to assist with RV camping matters.

DIRECTIONS TO SHOW SITE: Benton County Fairgrounds • 110 SW 53rd Street, Corvallis, Oregon

Take I-5 to Exit 228 (Hwy. 34 to Corvallis). As you enter Corvallis, Hwy. 34 becomes Harrison Blvd. Remain on Harrison through Corvallis to 53rd Street. Turn south (left) onto 53rd Street (Walnut Blvd. becomes 53rd at the light). Benton County Fairgrounds is approximately ¼ of a mile on the right.

Alternate route: As you approach Corvallis on Highway 34, do not cross the bridge into town, but turn LEFT at the light before the bridge; this takes you to the downtown bypass. Continue (west) to the light at 53rd St. (Bi-Mart will be on your left). Turn right (north) onto 53rd Street. The Fairgrounds is approximately ½ miles on the left.

PLEASE CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG

CPE trial rules – shortened version: see the online rulebook at www.k9cpe.com for registration info, “Registering with CPE” and further info on height categories and rules.

Jump Heights – no dog will jump lower than 4”

P-Card = Permanent Card: the lowest allowable Regular height a dog may jump in CPE.

General CPE rules for entries/show site:

- Dogs must be at least 15 months or older the first day of the trial
- Blind (both eyes), lame, in season or aggressive dogs may not enter the show. The Club may choose to exclude any of the above from the site.
- Dogs must be registered with CPE prior to the closing date of the trial, or by the trial date for Day Of Show entries. Registration forms are on the Forms page: www.k9cpe.com. Forms MUST be mailed to CPE and are processed 2-3 times per week. CPE ID numbers are emailed to legible email addresses. Registrations can only be processed from mailed forms.
- Dogs must be able to be measured at their first show. If a dog cannot be measured, the dog cannot run and no refund will be issued. Dogs within ½” of a jump height require at least one more measurement. When dogs reach their second birthday, a measurement is required. All dogs must be measured at their first trial regardless of jump height.
- Only CPE Judges can measure dogs.
- Electronic shock collars are not allowed at ANY CPE trial – training or bark.
- Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, prior to the start of the class. A warm-up jump shall be provided for all entered dogs. No relieving of dogs in the warm-up area.

Dogs in the ring, leashes, exiting the ring

- Dogs shall run without anything attached to its body. This is for the safety of the dog. This includes no: collars, stitches, wraps or any other item. The only exception is a small barrette or rubber band to keep hair out of a dog’s eyes.
- Leashes may not have anything (other than name/license tags) attached to them when used in the ring.
- Dogs may enter the ring on a collar, quick release harness or head halti/leader. If prong collars are allowed per the show site, they may *not* be used to take a dog into the ring.

- Handlers may not carry their leash with them on the course – if done so, an NT will result. Exception: Handicapped handlers that have a mobility problem in picking up the leash at the finish may put their leash in their pocket – the leash must be out of sight.
- Dogs must be under the handler’s control when leaving the ring or the judge may enter the run as No Time - NT.

For clubs that will allow Declared Training In the Ring

We (Host Club) will offer Declared training in the ring. The handler has the option if they want to use a toy or training aid at any time during their run, the handler must approach the Judge during Walkthrough or previously in that trial day for the Judge to approve the toy or training aid for use on the course.

- Handler must alert the Judge upon entry to the ring that the dog will be TIR.

Handler is then allowed to have a reasonably sized silent toy/aid with them for use once their run has started (this toy must be approved by the Judge of record PRIOR to the start of the class to determine its eligibility, absolutely no food/scents/audible devices). The toy is NOT allowed to be used in either gate chute or prior to the previous dog leaving the ring. See the online rulebook or current member letter for additional rules.

The following items are considered training in the ring (see Fix and Go):

- Violating the 4 paw safety rule (directing the dog back onto the contact)
- Start line stay – leaving the dog and going back again to reposition the dog after the handler passes the plane of the first obstacle (before the handler leaves the dog, repositioning or repeated commands can be a delay of start)
- Putting the dog back on the table in the point games

While running on course

- The handler will direct the dog through the course without a collar or lead.
- Food, toys, training devices (includes fanny packs and leash attachments) are not allowed within 10’ feet of the ring. Clickers, training whistles and squeaky toys are not to be used within distraction distance of the ring.
- The handler may not carry anything that could aid the dog in its performance. Exclusion: Handicapped/Differently Abled Handlers using a cane, scooter, wheelchair, etc., to enable their progression around the course.

The handler may use any verbal or visual commands to direct the dog through the course. The Judge may assess a 5 fault penalty to elimination for any command that is not given in a sportsmanlike manner. Faults can be, but are not limited to: foul or abusive language, display of anger, extreme frustration or excessive harshness. If the fault is severe enough, the Judge has the right to excuse the exhibitor from the ring and / or the remainder of the trial. If excused from the trial, a report would be filed with CPE. See Faults, Eliminations and Excusals in the rulebook.

No changes to trial results will be made once the trial has been completed – handlers are responsible for the accuracy of information in their confirmation from the trial secretary (dog's info, level, height category and/or jump height, etc), prior to running in a trial, and for reporting any discrepancies of posted results prior to leaving the trial site each day. This also includes if there was a correction to a scribe sheet – the handler must verify that the results were corrected as well.

CRATING SPACE

Crating space will be available in the main arena. Please be courteous in the amount of space that you utilize for your crating area so that everyone has enough room. Please do not set up your crating space before the time specified in the pre-trial email communications. That will allow us time to mark off space for vendors, scorekeeping, etc. Those that assist with unloading trailers, and setting up the rings, on Friday afternoon will be able set up their crating space before the arena is opened to the general set up. Please let Lisa know if you are planning to assist with Friday afternoon set-up.

FOOD

There will not be a food vendor on site for this trial but do not despair! If you work, we will feed you! Sandwiches and snacks will be brought in for workers. Some lunches may be available for purchase after all workers have had a chance to eat.
