Seeking from the Heart

The Poor House finally put away most of our Christmas decorations last week, although I am still finding little Christmas things around the house that we didn't notice earlier. In all honesty, those things will most likely remain in place until next Christmas. Hopefully we'll get them stowed away next year. That is fine with me – I am happy to be reminded of the wonderful memories shared during the Christmas holiday all year long. One of the decorations that I noticed was left out are the Three Kings trio that we put downstairs. When I noticed it there last night, I was particularly thankful for the reminder of what these Magi symbolize and represent in our faith story: seeking. What an important reminder to have year round: to continue seeking God's light and to continue to be open to the wonder and awe of God's presence among us.

In our worship together 'seeking' has been a theme throughout this season of Epiphany. As we prepare to begin for the season of Lent and the journey we take together in this holy season, we continue to seek out the light even as the darker days of Jesus's ministry feel like they are closing in on us. What a stark contrast to Advent when the days are getting shorter and darker earlier yet we add more light each Sunday by lighting an additional candle. During Lent, our days are getting longer with each additional minute of daylight bringing more and more light to each day; and yet, during worship we will extinguish a candle each Sunday as we move toward Good Friday. Still, we remember and continue to seek the Light that is ever present. With hearts filled with the promise of God's presence with us always, we faithfully take this Lenten journey to explore and discover deeper meaning and, often, more questions about our faith.

I anticipate a holy and renewing Lenten journey with you. Our theme this year is Our Lenten Prayer Journey. Together, throughout Lent we will focus on the essential place of prayer in our lives as followers of Jesus. Prayer lies at the heart of who we are, yet how we understand prayer is varied, complex—and sometimes confusing. We will spend time with prayer throughout the season, both in reflection and action during worship. Each Sunday we will spend time with a different prayer practice as part of the worship service. Additionally, we will gather on Wednesday evenings for a Taize prayer service following a light meal together. I pray that as we take this prayer journey together, our hearts are further opened to seeking and discovering the Holy in our lives.


