CLUB MEMBERSHIP & CLUB SHOOTING EVENTS

THE BASICS

- Club nights are for women only
- The meetings start with a short opening program or club update usually 20 to 30 minutes and is related to gun laws, self defense, and many other gun related topics. If you want to shoot, you must attend the opening program.
- Regular shooters begin range time immediately following the opening program.
- Following the opening program, new shooters are offered instruction before entering the range to shoot.
- After your first two meetings, which you can attend for free (other than a \$5 range fee paid to Castlewood for use of the facility), membership is \$50 per year. Your membership year begins on the date that you pay.

WHEN DO WE MEET

We meet typically once a month on the second Monday at 5:30

WHERE DO WE MEET

Castlewood Rod & Gun Club

REQUIREMENTS:

Our members are required to take the NRA Basic Pistol course within three months of joining the organization. Our main priority is safety and the Basic Pistol course is THE course to learn safety and proper handling of your firearm. S2A members receive \$25 off the cost of Phase II of the course.

WHAT ELSE SHOULD YOU KNOW

• Meet at the clubhouse to sign in; Registration opens at 5:30. There is a \$5 range fee, which is paid to Castlewood for the rental of the clubhouse and range facilities, regardless of whether or not you choose to shoot you pay this each month.

- If you have previously attended 2 meetings, you must purchase a membership. Please bring a check (or cash) for your annual club membership of \$50.
- New shooters (those who have fired fewer than 500 rounds), or anyone who would like a refresher, will receive specialized instruction on firearm safety, as well as basic shooting fundamentals prior to approaching the firing line.
- In an effort to make club night safe for all members, instructors, range safety officers, etc ... the following rules and procedures have been implemented:

1. You must have your gun cased in either a rug, a holster, or a carrying case or you will not be permitted to shoot

2. Your firearm MUST BE UNLOADED. Firearms will be checked by a Range Safety Officer.

3. There will be a designated safe area where ammunition will be stored during classroom time. No one will be permitted to approach the safe area and handle ammunition until instructed to do so by a RSO. Please put your name on your ammunition. If you would like to leave it in your car, you can do that.

WHEN SHOOTING OUTDOORS

Outdoor shooting typically occurs from

May through October. When shooting outdoors, plan for the weather, for muddy terrain, and for bugs. Please wear closetoe shoes, long pants, and consider a shirt with a crew neckline. Hot brass burns are painful. We recommend wearing, or bringing, a ball cap to help deflect flying brass: You WILL get hit with ejected casings from the shooter next to you.

WHEN SHOOTING INDOORS

Indoor shooting typically occurs from November through April. Plan for a chilly classroom and range. Also, there are regulations regarding ammo and the indoor range at Castlewood Rod & Gun Club: If you shoot a .22, you can shoot indoors without any concern regarding type of ammo. If you shoot a caliber other than a .22, you must use Indoor Range Ammo. When you go to purchase your ammo, ask the salesperson for Indoor Range Ammo. If you are wondering the difference it is the copper plate on top of the bullet, Indoor Range Ammo only has 1/2 of a copper plate on the bullet. If you do not have indoor range ammo, we have EXTREMELY LIMITED quantites available for purchase. You will be limited to 25 rounds. Attendees will not be permitted to shoot without approved indoor range ammo. This is a rule of Castlewood Rod & Gun Club, and it is essential that the rules are adhered to for safety reasons. .40 or .45 caliber guns may NOT be fired on the indoor range.

Note: Please understand that all rules, requirements, and regulations MUST be adhered to. They are in place for your safety and the safety of the Instructors and Range Safety Officers.
