Dear Church Family and Friends,

During the coming month we are going to be inundated with political adds, phone calls, emails, and text messages to support a particular candidate. Every year we go through this process, but every four years it is particularly intense as we prepare to elect the president for the next four years.

We as the church do not support or reject any candidate. It is part of any church to remain separate from the political process. This is part or our religious freedom. Does this mean we can not talk about politics? No, we can talk about the process and even hold forums to discuss candidates as long as we are not promoting any particular party or candidate.

For this newsletter, as we enter into the final political battle ground before the November elections, let me remind you of a number of blessing that we have in this particular county.

I have had the opportunity to travel to 7 foreign countries during my lifetime. Every time I come home. realizing what a great country we have. Do we have anything to complain about? Yes, we do, but we have so much more to be thankful for. Food, water, shelter, clothing are the basic needs for every human being. These are things that we in the United States, rarely give much thought to. Maybe we think about updating our wardrobe, but as far as wondering where out next meal is, or hoping we won't freeze to death because of inadequate clothing or housing, are things that very few in this community and in this country have to truly worry about. During the pandemic, there may be more entering into a time of worries about basic needs, but we do have safety nets in this country such as SNAP benefits, disability, unemployment and social security. This is not the case in many of the countries I have visited. Going hungry is a normal part of the existence of many in other countries. Another area is health care. Our hospitals don't close down every night as they do in Haiti – even if you are dying, you have to wait until the doors open in the morning! Everyone is entitled to emergency health care whether or not you can pay for it. I experienced a hospital visit in Zimbabwe and the first question wasn't, "what is your healthcare need?" but rather, "do you have money to pay for this?" We have much for which to be thankful. Another thing that we can be thankful for is our election process. Yes, it does have flaws, but it has allowed for a smooth transition of government for over 200 years. We can in fact be thankful for the all the political ads! It is our freedom that gives us the chance to vote. Let us be thankful.

We as Christians do have a great responsibility. We have the responsibility to pray about our own decisions in the election booth. We also have the responsibility to pray for the process and our elected leaders. Here are some verses to help us.

<u>1 Timothy 2:1-2</u> - I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people— for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness.

<u>1 Peter 2:17</u> - Show proper respect to everyone, love the family of believers, fear God, honor the emperor. Romans 13:1 - Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God. Let us be thankful for this great country and prayerfully enter into the season of elections.


