A WARM WELCOME FOR ALL

Welcome to the Willette church of Christ, where you will find the Bible as our only rule for faith and practice. We seek to speak where the Bible speaks and to be silent where the Bible is silent. We want to call Bible things by Bible names and do Bible things in Bible ways.

Jesus said, "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost" (Matthew 28:18-20). Our evangelistic efforts include several local and foreign mission works listed on the back of this bulletin. The home congregation is the most important work. Therefore, every month, we spend time door knocking, visiting, and helping our local community. We have a large benevolent building that operates every Tuesday from 8:30-12:30, which offers free clothes and other items to anyone in need. Our primary foreign work is found in Andhra Pradesh, India, where Brother *Jack Honeycutt* serves as our full-time mission coordinator. We are also blessed to have a regular prison ministry with services conducted each Sunday from 1:00-3:00. Brother *Tim McHenry* is our regular preacher. In addition to preaching, he teaches classes, works with youth events and community outreach. Our associate preacher *Mark West*, preaches, teaches classes, ministers in the nursing home, coordinates our visitation teams, and work with our Bible camp and youth in general. In addition, we have a radio program on 102.1 FM that airs each weekday around 12:15. If anyone has special needs our Christian Counselor, Dale Sadler, is ready to help by calling 615-513-3642

We are a Bible centered, mission minded, and family oriented church. Thank you for coming, and please return at every opportunity.

Tidings from Timothy

"I want to get some work done. My boss won't let me do my job. How can I do some work for the Lord?" This is an excellent question. I hope in this morning's lesson to help guide you to make some decisions that will result in the salvation of your soul, your family, and maybe someone you can teach as we go through these strange times.

If you are here with us today You are our honored guest. However, whether it be member or guest, if you are showing symptoms consistent with the virus, please leave. God will not hold you accountable for choosing wisely and we have elderly people in this building all the time. Think of others and how you would want to be treated.

For those who will be worshipping with us, please practice "social distance." This means to have your family unit sit separate from other units by up to 6 feet (according to whatever source - WHO, CDC, or whoever you consult on this). And try not to sit **directly** in front of or behind any other family. As for greetings, the elders have asked that at church we try to remember not to shake hands at this time.

Events: There are none. This a month and a half of our lives we will never get back. What are you doing with yours?

Construction update: Hallways, except for the floor, are basically done. Waiting on a few things, but downstairs they will begin soon with installing the actual kitchen items. Upstairs, the classrooms are almost ready to be painted.

Nursing Home, Jail, etc.: Until they get a handle on this Corona stuff or the state decides what they are going to do, there will not be any services or activities at the Nursing Home or Jail. Cards and stamps can still be got from the library, but the team will be mailing them individually if you wish to do that ministry. Please pray for the nursing homes!

The church – the body of Christ

The church which Christ said He would build (Matthew 16:18) and which was established on the first Pentecost after His resurrection (Acts 2:47) is called in the Scriptures, "the body of Christ." In Ephesians 1:22,23, Paul calls it "...the church, which is his body." In Colossians 1:18, he calls it "...the body, the church..."

The New Testament Teaches There Is One Body

The figure of the church of Christ as the spiritual body of Christ emphasizes the singularity of the church. Christ spoke of building "my church" - singular (Matthew 16:18). Paul wrote that "we have many members in one body" (Romans 12:4,5); also, "But now are they many members, yet but one body" (I Corinthians 12:20). Both Jew and Gentile are reconciled unto God in one body (Ephesians 2:16). "There is one body, and one Spirit, even as ye are called in one hope of your calling; one Lord, one faith, one baptism" (Ephesians 4:4,5). The church is the body. The body is one. Therefore, the church of Christ is one. Let each be sure he is a member of this one.

Christ Is The Head Of The Body - The Church

Christ's dominion over the church is complete. He was given "to be head over all things to the church, which is his body..." (Ephesians 1:22,23). He is "the head of the body, the church" (Colossians 1:18). As members of one's physical body are subject to his mind, so the members of Christ's spiritual body (the church) must do. What He does not command and teach, the church must not do or teach (II John 9,10). The "effectual working" of "every part" (i.e., every member) is dependent on growing up "into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ" (Ephesians 4:15,16).

Christians Are Members Of The Body Of Christ

The relationship of a Christian to Christ as the head of the body (the church) is that of complete submission (Ephesians 5:24). The relationship of a Christian to fellow Christians as members of the one body (the church) is that of complete union and harmony. Every joint is to supply his part to make the body strong (Ephesians 4:16). All the members are united in the one body (Romans 12:4,5; I Corinthians 12:12-20). Each member must perform his own work (I Corinthians 12:14-19). One member is as important as any other member. There must be no schism in the body (I Corinthians 12:24,25). There must be mutual sympathetic care for each other (I Corinthians 12:25-27).

The Importance Of Being Members Of The Body

Christ is the Savior of the body (Ephesians 5:23). If one wishes to be among the saved, he must be in the body. Men are "called unto the peace of God" in one body (Colossians 3:15). If one desires this peace, he must be in the body. Man is "reconciled unto God in one body" (Ephesians 2:16). If one is to have the benefits of this reconciliation, he must be in the body. The "fullness of him that filleth all in all" is in the one body (Ephesians 1:23). If one is to enjoy this fullness, he must be in the body. One cannot be subject to the head and united with Christ without being a member of the body.

How To Become A Member Of The Body

Paul wrote to the members of the church at Corinth (I Corinthians 1:2), "For by one Spirit are we all baptized into one body..." (I Corinthians 12:13). This is by being "buried with Christ in baptism" (Romans 6:3). Have you done this? --Joe Wilson--, edited
