Aloe vera

Aloe barbadensis

Has been widely grown as an ornamental plant. The species is popular with modern gardeners as a medicinal plant and due to its interesting flowers, form and succulence. Able to survive in areas of low natural rainfall, making it ideal for rockeries and other low-water use gardens. 3'H x 3'W. Full sun to part shade. Perennial.

Angelica

Angelica archangelica

Tiny green flowers in rounded clusters bloom on tall stems above large leaves. All parts of the plant are fragrant. Fresh leaves and young stems are edible, and dried leaves and stems are nice in potpourri. Likes deep, fertile moist soil. 4- 6'H x 2- 3'W. Full sun or part shade. Biennial

Arugula

Eruca vesicaria subsp sativa

Tender green, sharply indented, irregular leaves, like those of dandelion. Delicious sharp, nutty flavor. Delicious in green salads. Needs moist, well-drained soil. 12-18"H x 18"W. Full sun, afternoon shade. Annual. Plant in fall.

Aztec Sweet Herb

Phyla scaberrima

The leaves are sweeter than sugar or Stevia, but can't be used in baked goods. Tough and very drought resistant, it has bronze foliage and spicy scent in full sun. Compact bush bears a profusion of unusual, tiny daisy-like flowers from spring until fall. Very interesting plant. 6"H x 12"W. Full sun, afternoon shade. Perennial.

Basil, Mrs Burn's Lemon

Ocimum basilicum citriodora 'Mrs. Burns' Lemon'

A favorite among fine chefs and gardeners alike! This heirloom was discovered in New Mexico, and it is absolutely the best lemon basil available anywhere, with larger leaves and an intense, citrusy flavor. 18-24"H x 12-24"W. Annual.

Basil, Red Rubin

Ocimum basilicum 'Red Rubin'

One of the purple basil, thought to be a descendant of 'Dark Opal'. This makes a great accent plant in the garden with its purple-red showy leaves. 24 - 30"H. Annual.

Basil, Thai

Ocimum basilicum 'Siam Queen'

Spicier than common basil, with an intense licorice fragrance. Used in Asian cuisine. Purple-red stems bear violet pink flowers. Bushy growth with large leaves. Beautifully ornamental and excellent container plant. Prefers moist, well-drained soil. 30"H. Full Sun. Annual.

Basil, Sweet

Ocimum basilicum

A must in Italian cuisine! Wrinkled, 2-3" long, bright green leaves have sweet, pungent odor when brushed. Makes a beautiful bouquet for fresh scent in kitchen, that acts as a fly deterrent. White flower whorls on ends of branches in summer. Moist, well-drained soil. 24-36"H x 18"W. Full Sun. Annual.

Basil, African Blue

Ocimum kilimandscharicum

One of the largest basil with purplish-blue cast and a profusion of fragrant lavender blooms that attract bees, butterflies and birds. Flowers bloom mid-summer to mid-fall making this a great ornamental plant. Water regularly; but do not over water. 2-3'H x 2'W. Full sun or morning sun with afternoon shade. Annual/Tender Perennial.

Bay Laurel

Laurus nobilis

Slow-growing herb that eventually will grow into a tree. Used only for flavoring foods and teas. Do not eat the leaves, as they can cut into intestinal tissue. Does well in container as a smaller tree Easily to prune into a standard. Up to 25'H x 5- 7'W. Full sun. Tender Perennial.

Beebalm, red

Monarda didyma

Flamboyant scarlet blooms. Loved by hummingbirds and bees. Also known as bergamot. A hardy native used as tea substitute at the Boston tea party. 3-4'H. Full sun to part shade. Tender Perennial.

Beebrush

Aloysia gratissima

Beautiful, fragrant white flowers attracts bees and butterflies. Drought tolerant. 36-48"H. Full sun to part shade. Perennial.

Borage

Borago officinalis

Gorgeous with bright bluish flowers. It has long been grown in kitchen gardens, and yields excellent honey. Our great grandmothers preserved and candied the flowers. Borage loves dry soil and full sun but can tolerate some shade. Easy plant to grow. 18- 24"H x 12 -24"W. Full sun to partial shade. Reseeding Annual.

Butterfly Vine

Mascagnia macroptera

Fast growing vine. Dainty yellow blooms in the spring, papery pods turn brown and open in the fall, resembling butterflies. A Mexican native. Full Sun to part shade. The vine is frost tender but tolerates heat well.

Calendula

Calendula officinalis

Also called Pot Marigolds, these bright flowers are a familiar sight in cottage and country gardens. They will reseed readily. Petals have a pungent, spicy flavor and leaves have a bitter aftertaste. Used more for medicinal than culinary purposes. The petals are used in fish and meat soups, rice dishes, salads, and as a coloring for cheeses and butter. Prefers a rich, light soil. 12 - 24" x 12"W. Sun. Hardy Annual.

Catnip

Nepeta cataria

Mostly known as a useful plant to lure cats away from your garden when properly placed. It resembles mint in appearance, with grayish-green leaves; the flowers are white, finely spotted with purple. 2-3'H x 3'W. Full sun to partial shade. Annual/Tender Perennial.

Celery, Cutting

Apium graveolens

Celery flavor in a parsley-like plant. The variegated variety has green and pale yellow leaves and a milder flavor. Use fresh in salads or add to soups, stews and sauces. Makes a great border. 10"H x 10"W. Full sun to part shade. Tender Perennial.

Chamomile, Roman

Chamaemelum nobile

Roman chamomile grows in a soft mat and can be used as a ground cover among stepping stones. Flowers are white rays with yellow centers. The leaves have a fragrant scent reminiscent of apples. Drought tolerant. 4-12"H x 3'W. Sun to part shade. Perennial.

Chervil

Anthriscus cerefolium

A parsley relative with lacy light green leaves that turn red in the late fall. Its subtle flavor is a favorite with cooks. A cool season favorite in our region, chervil grows best in well-drained soil with some shade. 2'H x 1'W. Annual

Chives, garlic

Allium tuberosum

An upright, grassy plant topped with globe shaped white flowers on tall stems in spring or early summer. Mild garlic flavor is good fresh or dried in soup, salads or butters. 12-18"H x 6- 12"W. Pull sun to partial shade. Hardy Perennial.

Chives, onion

Allium schoenoprasum

Onion chives have tubular leaves and lovely lavender flowers which bloom all summer. Should be harvested often to encourage growth. Will die back in a hard freeze, but should come back from the bulb in the spring. 12-18"H x 6- 12"W. Partial shade. Tender Perennial.

Cilantro

Coriandrum sativum

Cilantro refers to the leaves, and coriander to its seeds. Cut and use the pungent leaves in salads, pesto or meat dishes. Widely used in Mexican, Thai and Vietnamese cuisine. May also be used to draw beneficial insects and repel harmful ones. 18- 24"H x 18- 24"W. Full sun, afternoon shade. Annual.

Cilantro (Coriander), Vietnamese

Polygonum odoratum

A spreading tropical that will sometimes return in the spring if mulched well. It has a flavor similar to cilantro and can be used in its place in the summer when cilantro has died out. Moist, well-drained soil. 6- 12"H. Full sun to partial shade. Tender Perennial

Coneflower, Purple

Echinacea purpurea

A striking North American native that makes it a wonderful addition to a flower border. Easily recognizable by their purple-pink daisy-like flowers with brown centers, it's a hardy plant that self-seeds. Well-drained soil. 2 - 3'H. Full Sun. Perennial.

Cuban Oregano

Plectranthus amboinicus

Aromatic, fleshy leaved plant that does well in partial shade. Cannot deal with the slightest frost. Up to 36". Full sun. Tender Perennial.

Copper Canyon Daisy

Tagetes lemmonii

Fall blooming shrub daisy with aromatic foliage. It is covered with yellow flowers from August until frost. It dies to the ground in the winter. It must have a well-drained location and likes caliche soils. Up to 4'H.

Curry Plant

Helichrysum italicum

An aromatic and ornamental plant with silvery foliage and golden blooms. Dried leaves and flowers into sachet bags can be used as insect repellents. The curry flavor is preserved when used fresh 1'-2'H. Sun to part shade. Tender perennial

Dill, Fernleaf

Anethum graveolens 'Fernleaf'

A smaller variety that's slow to bolt, Fernleaf or dwarf dill is grown especially for its dark green leaves rather than its seed. A good container plant. Performs better in cool months, but can survive year round. 18"H. Full sun to part shade. Annual.

Fennel, Bronze

Foeniculum vulgare var. nigra

Tall graceful plant with deep roots. Threadlike purple bronze foliage smells like licorice. Tiny yellow flowers in the summer. Larval food for black swallowtail butterfly. 2 3'H x 2'W. Full sun, partial shade. Biennial or Perennial, but often grown as an annual in Houston area.

Fennel, Sweet

Foeniculum vulgare

Looks like dill but the stems are solid and the plant smells like licorice. Clusters of yellow, umbrella shaped flowers adorn this plant. It can reach 4'H x 2'W. Full sun, partial shade. Perennial.

Fennel, "Zefa"

Foeniculum vulgare var. azoricum 'Zefa'

Also called finocchio, this herb was introduced from Italy over 100 years ago. Medium, slightly elongated bulbs have classic, sweet anise-like flavor.

Feverfew

Tanacetum parthenium

Fragrant, hardy member of the chrysanthemum family with tiny yellow and white blooms in the fall. The brightly colored leaves have an unpleasantly bitter taste. Grow feverfew in the rose garden to attract aphids away from the rose bushes. Feverfew will thrive in the poorest soils, but is susceptible to mildew in the shade. 8-18"H. Full Sun. Perennial.

Germander, Upright

Teucrium sp.

An old fashioned herb that has fallen out of favor. However it requires minimum care and with its small leaves and compact growth it can be clipped into a wonderful border plant in a herb garden. It thrives best in full sun and is easy to grow. 18"H. Full sun. Perennial.

Kaffir Lime

Citrus hystrix

Unusual double-lobed aromatic leaves make this a truly unique plant. Leaves are used in Southeast Asian cuisine, particularly Thai. The flesh and rind from the green, bumpy fruit have culinary uses, but the juice is quite sour. Give plenty of water during growing months and protect from hard drought and freezing. Fertilize at beginning of growing season. 6'. Full sun. Tender Perennial.

Lambs Ears

Stachys byzantina

Beautiful background plant with large, fuzzy, silvery gray-green foliage. They are grown primarily for the color and texture of their foliage. Thick flower stalks are covered with beautiful, small purple flowers. Keep the flowers trimmed off to favor the exotic foliage, or use the flowers in dried arrangements. Often recommended for children's gardens because of their soft feel. Well-drained soil. 1'H x 1'W. Full sun. Perennial.

Lavender, Grosso

Lavandula x intermedia 'grosso'

Forms a dense, tidy mound with lavender-purple flowers in color. Used for oil production. This fragrant shrub is both drought and deer resistant. 24-30"H. Perennial.

Lavender, Fernleaf

Lavandula multifida

This elegant lavender is the best selection for our area, since it can tolerate more humidity. Flower spikes are in three sections resembling a pitchfork. The flower continues to bloom even when the temperature dips just below freezing. Well-drained soil. 2- 3'H. Full sun to partial shade. Perennial.

Lavender, Sweet

Lavandula heterophylla

Silvery foliage, tall purple spikes and excellent fragrance make this a star in the herb garden. Does best when planted in raised beds and given a pea gravel mulch to keep the leaves dry and soil free. Don't over water. Blooming season, generally spring and early summer, can be extended somewhat by deadheading. 2-3'H (4' blooms) x 1-2'W. Full sun. Perennial.

Lemon Balm

Melissa officinalis

Clumping, spreading plant with lemon-flavored and scented leaves. Used for tea, cold drinks, fruit salads, and fish. Forms tiny white flowers around base and upper leaves. 6 -12"H x 18- 24"W. Full sun to partial shade. Perennial.

Lemongrass

Cymbopogon citratus

Aromatic, graceful clumping grass used in teas and Asian cuisine. Do not eat leaves; tender stalks only. 30- 36"Hx 30- 36"W. Full sun. Tender Perennial.

Lemon mint

Monarda citriodora

Also called purple horse mint or lemon beebalm. Has a citrus smell when crushed, and has purple flowers that prove irresistible to both bees and hummingbirds. Prefers alkaline soils, but is adaptable. Likes it hot and dry.

Lemon Verbena

Aloysia citriodora

An aromatic shrub, characterized by intense lemon fragrance, narrow leaves and small white flowers. Excellent for teas, baked goods and culinary use. 3- 4'H x 2W. Full sun and afternoon shade. Perennial. Protect from freezing

Lions Tail

Leonitis menthaefolia

This distinctive plant always attracts attention with its velvety orange flowers that bloom along the flower stalk in summer and fall. The felt-like foliage is gray green. Very attractive to hummingbirds, butterflies, and bees. Drought-tolerant when established. 18- 24"H. Full sun. Perennial.

Lovage

Levisticum officinale

Very large, hardy, strongly flavored celery substitute. Fresh or dried seeds, leaves and roots are used in soups, stir-fries and tuna fish. Sweet seeds can be used in confections. Tall yellow flower stalks make dramatic feature display. To stop scald, mulch or provide extra summer water. Loamy soil. 2-3'H x 18"W. Part shade. Tender Biennial

Mexican Mint Marigold/Texas Tarragon

Tagetes lucida

Leaves have a pleasant anise-like aroma. Cheerful golden yellow flowers are borne on top of plant in fall. Sometimes called Texas Tarragon since it is used in recipes that call for Tarragon. Moist, well-drained soil. 2-3'H x 2-3'W. Full sun. Perennial.

Mint, Red Stem Apple

Mentha x gracilis 'Madalene Hill'

One of the best for our area, this mint is a pleasing blend of apple and mint flavor. The erect reddish-tinged stems have large round leaves up to 3" long. Lavender blooms appear on long, slender spikes. Reaches a height of 2'. Full sun, part shade. Perennial.

Mint, Chocolate

Mentha x piperita

Small, very dark green leaves. Use a sprig of chocolate mint in ice cream, hot chocolate or other desserts. 6-12"H. Full sun. Perennial.

Mint, Orange

Mentha x piperata

Rounded glossy dark green leaves that turn bronze with cool weather have a distinctive and pleasant orange scent and flavor. Use to flavor teas or as a garnish or in potpourris. Small lavender flowers. 1-2'H. Full sun to part shade. Perennial.

Mint, Peppermint

Mentha x piperita

Strongly aromatic peppermint can be used in cooking—in drinks, salads, and baked goods—and in potpourri and other fragrant decorative items. Leaves can be harvested all season long. Grows in almost any soil condition. It grows so well, it's best to confine it to containers. 3'H. Full sun to part shade. Perennial.

Mint, Spearmint

Mentha spicata

Slightly crinkled leaves that are a lighter shade of green than peppermint. The whole plant has a sweet characteristic smell. Spearmint grows best in a somewhat moist soil and can be propagated by cuttings or division. Renew beds every 3 to 4 years. Growth is enhanced by frequent cuttings. 2-3'H. Full sun, part shade. Perennial.

Mint, Spanish

Mint, Swiss

Mint, Yerba buena

Mentha spicata 'Yerba Buena'

This trailing evergreen blooms from April - September. It will take light foot traffic, giving off a lovely minty fragrance. It is an attractive herb for ground cover and in shady garden borders. Grows well in rich, moist but well-drained soils. 6- 12"H. Full sun, partial shade. Perennial.

Nasturtium

Tropaeolum majus

An old-fashioned plant, producing a trailing profusion of large trumpet-shaped blossoms in yellow, gold, orange, and scarlet. The edible leaves, flowers and seedpods make peppery additions to salads. Plant in containers or hanging baskets. Poor, well-drained soil. 3' x 3'. Full sun to part shade. Annual.

Oregano, Greek

Origanum vulgare hirtum

The true Greek Oregano with flavor so intense its fresh, small leaves tingle your tongue. So many foods are seasoned with this herb, it would be impossible to list. Like all culinary oreganos, it has white flowers. Well-drained soil. 12- 18"H. Full sun. Perennial.

Oregano, Italian

The pizza herb, combines well with all tomato based dishes. Pungent rounded leaves, low growing in mounds. Prefers well drained soils. Perennial.

Oregano, Sicilian

Origanum x majorana

A white flowering oregano with a heady sweet pungent aroma. It's a smaller plant with lighter green leaves. Highly recommended as a culinary oregano. Try it on pizzas and all Italian cooking 18"H. Perennial.

Oregano, Hot & Spicy

Origanum vulgare 'Hot and Spicy'

This is for the chef that really loves intense, strong flavors. Indispensable Perennial with rich flavor and many culinary uses and belongs in every kitchen garden. Its round, soft, green leaves can be used either fresh or dried. 1- 3'H. Sun. Perennial.

Oregano, Russian

Origanum tytanthum

Foliage has a glossy look and a slightly reddish cast to the stems. It also grows low and spreads out making a good groundcover.

Patchouli

Pogostemon cablin

Produces white flowers on spikes. Pinch them off to encourage leaf growth. as the leaves are the main aromatic herb. Use in potpourris, incense and perfumes. Needs ample water. 3- 4'H x 2- 3'W. Dappled shade. Tender Perennial.

Parsley, Curly

Petroselinum crispum var. crispum

Tightly curled, bright green leaves are a culinary staple of any kitchen. Makes a great border plant. Tends to bolt once the weather gets too warm. Plant in fall for best results. 8-14"H x 12"W. Biennial, grown as an annual.

Parsley, Italian

Petroselinum crispum var. neopolitanum

Large plant with stiff, upright stems good for bunching. Large quantity of flat, glossy dark green leaves have a strong parsley flavor more pungent than curled types. More like a vegetable. Preferred for most Italian dishes. Moist, well-drained soil. 2'H. Full Sun. Biennial grown as an annual.

Passion vine

Passiflora sp.

Very complex flowers. Similar in growth to a grape vine. Covered much of the year with flowers. Host to Gulf fritillary caterpillars. Perennial.

Pomegranate

Punica sp

A small tree bearing funnel shaped waxy flowers. There are many cultivars, the dwarf ones are hardier and make excellent container plants. Give protection in the winter as it will only tolerate short periods of time below freezing. Requires full sun and long hot summers to fruit. 6-20'H. Tender Perennial.

Scented Geraniums

Pelargonium spp

Astonishing variety of fragrances. Leaves used in pot pourris and for scenting baked goods, sugars and jellies. Grow well from cuttings and make wonderful pot plants. They prefer a sunny spot, prune regularly to prevent leggy growth. Tender Perennial.

Rosemary, 'Foresteri'

Rosmarinus officinalis 'Foresteri'

Especially drought resistant, upright rosemary with excellent ornamental and culinary uses. It has beautiful blue flowers in the summer. Use with potatoes, chicken, beef, or just put a sprig in a letter. Well-drained soil. 1- 2'H. Full sun. Tender Perennial.

Rosemary, 'Gorizia'

Rosmarinus officinalis 'Gorizia'

Large, robust rosemary with broad deep green leaves, nearly twice the size of common rosemary. The large flowers are light blue with dark spots and bloom repeatedly. Attractive to bees, butterflies and birds. Average water needs; drought-tolerant. 4- 5'H. Try it as a topiary! Full sun. Perennial.

Rosemary, 'Tuscan Blue'

Rosmarinus officinalis 'Tuscan Blue'

This upright rosemary with beautiful blue flowers is suitable as an ornamental bush or hedge. Fresh, dried, or frozen, rosemary can be used with pork, veal, stews; herbal butters, vinegars, and jams. Unique, sweet pinewood scent in leaves, flowers and oil is valuable in perfumes, toiletries and sachets. Very drought-resistant Well-drained soil. 4 – 6'H. Full sun. Perennial.

Rosemary, Prostrate

Rosmarinus officinalis 'Prostratus'

In the garden, it is as handsome as any ornamental with beautiful blue flowers. Great for hanging baskets or hanging over pots. Uniquely sweet pinewood scent in leaves; flowers and oil is valuable in perfumes, toiletries and sachets. Very drought-resistant Well-drained soil. 18 -24'H x 36"W. Full Sun. Perennial.

Rosemary, 'Huntington Carpet'

Rosmarinus officinalis 'Huntington Carpet'

A good groundcover form of rosemary with deep blue flowers in spring. Great for cascading over walls. Thrives in the Houston area. Water lightly but often. 2-18"H. Full sun. Perennial.

Rosemary, 'Shimmering stars'

Rosmarinus officinalis 'Shimmering stars'

Broad green leaves, with a prostrate sprawling habit. Pink flower buds open to pale blue-violet flowers. The stems of this rosemary arch and twist like a bonsai.

Rue

Ruta graveolens

A hardy, shrubby evergreen with bluish green foliage and small yellow flowers. The entire plant has a pungent smell and bitter taste. It grows well in poor, sandy soil, but not next to basils. 20"H x 1'W. Full sun. Perennial.

Sage, garden

Salvia officinalis

A short-lived semi-woody shrub. It has intensely aromatic, thick, wooly, gray-green oval leaves. Flowers are blue, lilac or white. Best used fresh, but they can be dried. Besides the traditional use in stuffing, sage is good with pork, sausage, other meats, and cheese. It is often combined with thyme and used with beans and in soups. Fresh picked hands of sage tips can be used to make wreaths or tussie mussies. Well-drained soil. 3'H x 2'W. Full sun. Perennial.

Sage, 'Berggarten'

Salvia officinalis 'Berggarten'

This pleasantly mounded, compact sage has large, oval downy gray leaves with a superb fragrance that are easy to harvest. The plant develops a purplish cast in full sun. The flavor is just as good as the narrow pointed leaves of Garden Sage. Trim often by taking three or four inches of new growth, but avoid late fall pruning. 2'H. Sun. Perennial.

Sage, Ne'we Ya'ar

Salvia officinalis x S. fruticosa cv. Newe Ya'ar No. 4

A very decorative herb with sky-blue blooms starting in early spring, this shrubby variety is enjoyed for its pleasant flavor. Formerly known as Silver Leaf Sage, it was tested extensively by the South Texas Unit of the Herb Society of America. 36"H x 30"W. Sun. Perennial

Sage, purple

Salvia officinalis 'purpurascens'

The beautiful purple hued leaves are just as useful in the kitchen as the less showy common sage. Blooms in mid summer. 2'H x 2'W. Perennial.

Sage, Mexican Bush

Salvia leucantha

Attractive to bees, butterflies and/or birds. Average water needs; water regularly; do not overwater. Blooms in late summer to fall. They are very showy, especially when planted with other fall blooming plants. 3-4'H x 3-4'W. Full sun. Perennial.

Sage, Pineapple

Salvia elegans

The leaves of the pineapple sage are extremely fragrant and when dried can be used in potpourris. Fresh leaves can be used in salads, desserts, or drinks. It blooms at the end of the summer until the end of fall. The red flowers are very attractive to the hummingbirds. 3'H x 7'W. Full sun. Perennial

Sage, Clary

Salvia sclarea

This ornamental plant puts on lavender-blue flower spikes every other year. Its leaves are used as flavoring agents while the flowers are used in herbal teas, sachets, potpourris, and beverages. The essential oil is used as a fragrance and fixative in the perfume industry. Average water needs. 2- 3'H x 2- 3'W. Full sun to afternoon shade. Tender Perennial. Readily reseeds.

Salad Burnet

Sanguisorba minor

A dainty plant with arching stems and small round red flowers. It has small round-toothed blue green leaves with a distinct cucumber like taste. Use in salads, vinegars, butters, and other dishes. 6- 12"H x 12-15"W. Full sun, afternoon shade. Perennial.

Savory, Winter

Satureja montana

Small white-to-lilac whorls of star shaped flowers. Winter savory has a stronger flavor than summer savory. Use fresh or dried leaves to flavor vinegars, herb butters, creamy soups, and tea, but best known as the bean herb. Cut back by one-third or half in early spring to keep it from sprawling. 8- 12"H x 2'W. Full sun. Perennial.

Sorrel, French

Rumex acetosa

Sorrel produces a clump of long, arrow shaped leaves that resembles leaf lettuce. The soft leaves are high in oxalic acid. Sorrel has a bite and a mildly sour flavor that will add a 'zing' to any salad. Heavy feeder that depletes the soil of nutrients. Move every other year or refresh potting soil. 18"H x 6"W. Full sun to part shade. Perennial.

Stevia

Stevia rebaudiana

Intensely sweet leaves used in Paraguay. Easily cultivated on pots. Prefers full sun, but must be kept watered since it does not tolerate drought conditions. Up to 18"H. Full sun. Perennial.

St John's Wort, creeping

Hypericum sp.

An herb with a long history of medicinal uses and folklore attached to its name, St. John's Wort produces cheery yellow-orange flowers peppered with black dots. In Latin 'perforatum' means "perforated," and refers to the translucent dots in the leaves. Grows wild in many areas, and readily reseeds if not deadheaded. Open sunny area. Perennial

Sweet marjoram

Origanum majorana

Thyme, Creeping

Thymus praecox subsp. arcticus

Plant this beauty between stepping stones or somewhere it can trail over a wall or mixed pot. This is one of the best ground cover thymes because of its vigorous growth habit and pretty pink flowers. Tolerates light foot traffic. Low growing 3-6"H. Full sun. Perennial.

Thyme, 'Magic Carpet' Creeping

Thymus serpyllum 'Magic Carpet'

Rosy pink flowers and green aromatic foliage. Attracts butterflies. Requires well-drained soil, especially in winter. Full sun. Perennial.

Thyme, 'English Wedgewood'

Thymus vulgaris 'English Wedgewood'

Low growing, with slightly variegated leaves. Needs free draining soil as do all thymes. Drought tolerant once established.

Thyme, French

Thymus vulgaris

Narrow distinctly gray leaves. Needs some winter protection. Aromatic low growing bush or creeping herb, ideal for rock gardens, borders, or along pathways. Pretty pink or purple blossoms are a favorite of honeybees. Excellent culinary thyme.

Thyme, Lemon

Thymus citriodorus

This mounding thyme has dark green leaves with refreshing lemon scent and pink flowers. Plant in pots or between stepping-stones in walkway. Well-drained soil. 6-12"H x 12"W. Full sun. Perennial.

Thyme, Silver

Thymus vulgaris 'Argenteus'

Named for the silvered gray and green color of the evergreen leaves. Produces tiny lilac flowers. Rarely grows taller than one foot. Cutting it back from time to time keeps it from getting too woody and dead-looking in the center.

Violet

Viola odorata

A low growing, small delicate plant. Perfect as a ground cover in dappled light. Tiny purple, edible flowers in spring/early summer.

Yarrow

Achillea millefolium

Prolific growth with a creeping rootstock, must be controlled. Beautiful showy flowers in a variety of colors. Very drought tolerant once established, perfect for a large border or rock garden.
