PERSECUTING THE SHEPHERDS!

Acts 13:14, 43-52; Psalm 100:1-3,5; Rev. 7:9, 14b-17; John 10:27-30

This Sunday is the fourth Sunday of Easter – traditionally called *Good Shepherd* Sunday because the gospel reading is taken from John 10, which portrays Christ as the Good Shepherd Who lays down His life for His sheep. For the Jews, particularly, during Jesus' time, sheep were the people's main source of meat, milk and cheese. They also provided wool for clothing. Sheep were also used regularly in liturgical sacrifice. Thus, Jesus identified Himself as a "Shepherd Who lays down His life for His sheep." Last Sunday, Jesus reminded us that by our baptism we committed ourselves to following Him. Although following Him might lead to our persecution, suffering and death, we are to remain faithful to our promises to reject Satan and all its wiles, and to obey all that the Church teaches about Jesus Christ. In today's readings we are reminded that loyalty to our baptismal promises requires sacrifice - endurance in the midst of conflict. You and I must know life is not "one joyous experience." Life has its own intricacies.

A large percentage of today's society has no love for the Church and would like it persecuted. This is not different from the society where Paul and Barnabas ministered. In today's first reading we learned that, "On the following Sabbath almost the whole city gathered to hear the word of the Lord (preached by Paul and Barnabas). (But) when the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy and with violent abuse contradicted what Paul said." The Bible further tells us that the Jews hated the disciples so much that they "incited the women of prominence who were worshippers and the leading men of the city" to stir up "a persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and expelled them from their territory." This action of the Jewish leaders shows that there will always be conflict with those who commit their lives to serving God and His people.

In his homily and comment on today's reading in regard to the dangers of conflict within a community, Father Edward F. Steiner writes, "Unfortunately, this (conflict) happens within the Church as well. Parishioners will leave a parish of many years if they feel they are not getting their way... The method used (by the Jews) to turn people against Paul and Barnabas was gossip and slander. This goes on within every area of our lives. If we do not like what we see or hear - or more realistically, if we feel threatened - justified or not - we attack the messenger. We do this often - to co-workers, supervisors, politicians, bosses, family and even our priests and religious. We do not just dismiss ideas; we also dismiss people. Further and worse, truth is always the first victim of gossip."

We live in a society where the majority of people take things for granted, including freedom. As preachers and/or doers of the Word, we must know that our mandate to preach and to teach does not come without challenges and persecutions. Like Jesus, the Good Shepherd, we would be hated, scorned, abused, persecuted and/or killed. But we must stand firm and never waver in our faith, believing that in the end we will be counted among "the ones who have survived the time of great distress...washed their robes...white in the blood of the Lamb." Thus, Jesus "Who sits on the throne will shelter (us)." We will not hunger or thirst anymore. The Lord will shepherd us and lead us "to springs of life-giving water." He will wipe away every tear from our eyes! Stay strong and believe that even if others fail you, Jesus, *The Good Shepherd* is always there for you.


