This is a chronological research into WMass High School sports history. 1920 is used as a starting point and base reference to list the teams / schools and individual titlists and champions in Varsity sports since then. Most schools had athletic teams prior to 1920 but naming or listing a WMass champ is subject to “interpretation”. The Springfield Republican and its sports staff took the lead in who they thought was the top team in any sport. Quite often the Greenfield Recorder, Berkshire Eagle and other WMass newspapers disagreed with the Republican's conclusions. The teams from the lower Conn. River valley usually got the benefit of the call due to strength of schedule or more games played.

In the late 1920's the Republican took the lead in ranking teams and declaring a “WMass champ”. A sports writer by the name of George Springer was instrumental in using a points system to rate each school / team based of several factors. Franklin and Berkshire Co. teams were not considered equal to Springfield city schools or lower valley teams. Eventually High School Headmasters and principals took over in selecting teams for tournaments in the 1930's to determine a champion. By the 1970's the MIAA organized the playoff formats used today.

Records have been researched from Springfield Republican Newsbank archives as well as other WMass newspapers, PVIAC records, Masslive, internet articles, Garry Brown sports columns, MIAA listings, etc. The goal is to provide a permanent record for sports fans and create a lasting history. A possible website or appendix to PVIAC's records of champions is the goal of this research. Access to view / review, add, correct, update by schools, fans, players, A.D.'s, coaches, administrators would be something to try and achieve as records are reviewed and oversights found.

I'm sure, there are errors and oversights with the sheer volume of data listed. Once posted on – line for review and history, hopefully coaches, alumni, A.D.'s and fans can add or correct any errors or missing facts by letting me or PVIAC officials of any changes, additions, etc. that need to be made.

Tournaments in 1920's – 30's started by WM Sports Writer's Assoc. 1940's Mass. Headmasters set up and organized events with coaches' committee input. This continued to the 1960's. 1972 is considered the start of the “modern” WM – state tournament era with the MIAA in charge.

^ Champions prior to 1920 are inconclusive due to no format or organized mechanism to select titles. On a yearly basis schools and newspapers would “claim” or “name” themselves, teams as WM or state champs based on “challenge” games played or declined. Sometime an EM vs WM game(s) would be played between schools and a “winner” declared state champ. EM schools frequently claimed themselves state champs over their “western” rivals. Same for lower Conn. River Valley or Springfield schools vs Berkshire or Franklin Co teams. Greenfield was the team most slighted in WM, especially in football, though Pittsfield usually bore the brunt of Valley “discrimination” in Berkshire Co.

In 1921 a New England High School basketball tournament was started in EMass. Teams were “invited” by an informal committee/s from WM/EMass as well as by the tournament directors. The issue of who should go or be invited was debated with some controversy. In those days the M.I.A.A. did not exist and headmasters/principals/superintendents really were not in charge of these type of events. Tournaments were new and many felt high schools shouldn’t participate. Some teams actually declined or refused to play in mid season/post season events due to costs, travel, missed classes, etc.

WMass “sent” teams to the New England tourney but they were chosen by a loose group of sports writers, sport enthusiasts (usually professionals/businessmen), coaches, etc from WMass area. This of course caused an issue as to who was picked to play. Always the Springfield area or Berkshire powers were invited. Ware 22-0, 1922 ,the only undefeated team in Mass. was not picked to go: weak schedule.

In 1926 members of this committee decided to hold a basketball tournament in Springfield to actually play and have a winner and runner-up to see who went to the N.E. tournament. They of course picked the teams from WMass who they thought best. Games were at Springfield College Field House. Teams were: Holyoke, Amherst, Drury, Northampton, Ware, Pittsfield, Easthampton, Agawam. They took in a \$700 gate for the games and paid off 80% of the cost and reimbursement to the schools for the tournament.

Holyoke, Northampton - 1st/2nd in Valley League. Amherst, Easthampton- co-champs Hampshire League, Ware, Agawam- 1st/2nd Twin Valley League and Drury, Pittsfield- 1st/2nd in N. Berkshire League.

Results: Holyoke 52 Ware 28. Agawam 25 Drury 17. Northampton 31 Amherst 10. Pittsfield 17 EHamp. 16 NHamp. 21 Pittsfield 16. Holyoke 26 Agawam 17. Finals: Northampton 32 Holyoke 30. Northampton had beaten Holyoke three times that season. They later forfeited their Valley League crown. Holyoke declined to go to the N.E.’s at Tufts and Agawam went instead. A 2nd tournament was planned for 1927 also at Springfield College. N.Hamp. beat Nashua 40-14, then lost to Medford 20-18. Agawam beat Meridan, CT. 25-24 then lost to Rogers/Newport, RI. 26-15. Brockton won the tournament in 1926. No N.E. tourney 1927-1930.

In 1927 Holyoke beat S. Deerfield 59-11 and Lenox 41-23 while Drury beat Chester and Pittsfield. Holyoke then beat Drury for the title 29-21. The paid attendance was 1,000 for the games and was a

“financial failure”. This ended the 1st attempt at a WMass basketball tournament. It would not start up again until 1937 when Springfield Republican sports writer George Springer helped to reorganize a new WMass High school basketball tournament based on a points rating system that determined the teams who should go. This system eventually was replaced by a committee of Athletic Directors/Coaches who used the Springer type system to chose the entries. In 1972 the MSSPA and later the MIAA instituted a state-wide play-off system based on class/division enrollments and a % of wins and records for entry. The tournament went from eight teams (open , no classes) four Valley, two Berkshire, two Worcester, to two eight team Classes: L and S in the 1967 to Divisions I, II, III in the 1972. C/EMass had their own tourneys.

The New England tournament ended in 1964 thus starting a real W/EMass tourney where the two WMass 1st/2nd place finishers went to the Boston Garden to play EMass teams. Chicopee Comp was the 1st “true” WMass champion in 1965. This format lasted as an eight team W/CMass set-up for two years. In 1967 it evolved into a Large and Small Division bracket. Again eight teams in each division with sometimes play-in games to narrow the field to eight entries. Chicopee won class L and Palmer class S. This schedule lasted to 1971. In 1972 a DI, DII, DIII tournament evolved. DI Commerce, DII Drury, DIII Turners Falls won WMass.

In 1937 the Springfield Republican sports writers led by George Springer, a Springfield College grad 1926 really got involved in setting up a true WMass High School Basketball Tournament played in Springfield. He was a sports reporter at the paper specializing in high school coverage, starting @ 1927/28. It was his idea to institute a tournament to determine the WMass rep to the New England basketball tournament which started in 1921. Some schools frowned on such an event. Westfield coach Merle Miles refused an invitation to the 1st tournament in 1937. He felt his Westfield High team (18-0) should have been the WMass rep due to the fact they were the best team in the area and shouldn’t need to win a tournament to prove it. They didn’t participate.

Teams who did: W.Side, Drury, Northbridge, Fitchburg, Bartlett/Webster, Worcester (South), Commerce, Classical made the eight team selection. CMass was then part of the “WMass area “ and had six of eight entries. W.Side was also undefeated but from the Valley Wheel League and supposedly not as good as Westfield that year. The games were played at Worcester South gym in March, 1937. W.Side won 25-24

with Drury winning over Fitchburg 28-19. Then W.Side beat Worc. South 26-22 while Drury lost to Worc. Classical 37-20. W.Side then beat Worc. Classical for the 1st true Wmass title 28-20. W.Side went to the N.E.'s and lost to Burlington, VT 30-28 in the 1st round. The next year the games were moved to the Howard St. Armory in Springfield and after WW II to Springfield College Field House. In 1938 George Springer helped revise the format with two teams from Berkshire Co. and two from Worcester Co. with the Conn.Valley sending four entries.

In 1965 the 1st real state basketball tournament was instituted. Eight teams were selected by a committee of coaches, A.D.'s and school administrators. The MIAA was then the MSSPA a loose board of high school educators who were now over-seeing the tournament. There was a preliminary play-off to reach an eight team final.

1st round: Commerce 53 Classical 52. Holyoke 78 Turners Falls 60. Holyoke 76 Commerce 50.

2nd round: Drury 91 Cathedral 88. Chicopee Comp 83 St.Joe/Pittsfield 55. Tech 59 Adams 44. Holyoke 48 Smith Academy 42.

Semi-finals: Chic.Comp 59 Drury 57. Tech 53 Holyoke 49.

Championship: Chic.Comp 53 Tech 49. Both teams qualified for the State Tournament at Boston Garden. Comp beat Oliver Ames/N.Easton 72-56, then lost to Durfee/Fall River 65 59. Tech lost to eventual state champ: Catholic Memorial/W.Roxbury, Boston 76-37. This format lasted one more year. In 1967 a Class L and Class S brackets were used. Chicopee was L champ, Palmer S champ. In 1972 a Division DI, DII, DIII was introduced. DI champ: Commerce, DII Drury, DIII Turners Falls. This system is currently in use today with the four zones: N,S,C,Wmass champs playing in a semi-final then final game.

Prior to 1926 WMass champs were determined by “committee” of sports writers and well known figures on the local sports scene who were involved in supporting High School sports and athletics. The WMass “champ” was chosen to represent this area of the state to go to the very popular New England Interscholastic Basketball Tournament at Tufts University. This Tournament ran from 1921 to 1964.

In 1926 it was decided to have a playoff - tournament to determine a rep to go based on a team that won a tournament and was not selected based on opinion or favoritism. This format started in 1926 lasted thru 1927 when it was canceled due to financial difficulties and poor attendance. From 1928 - 1936 a team was again selected to go to the N.E.'s based on the former “best team” from the WMass area to play. Often this created a controversy as to who the best team really was. In 1937 Springfield Republican sports writer George Springer helped set up a return to a playoff system involving eight teams from the WMass/CMass area to play in a tournament to determine the rep to go to the N.E. tournament. There was no state champ tournament playoff system until 1965 when the N.E. tournament ended.

In 1921 a New England High School basketball tournament was started in EMass. Mass teams were “invited” by an informal committee from WMass - EMass as well as the tournament directors. The issue of who should go or be invited was debated with some controversy. Originally in WMass the teams selected usually were the big schools from the Valley / Berkshire Co. Almost always Holyoke, Northampton, Westfield, Pittsfield, Drury, St. Joseph led the way. In 1926 a committee of WMass sports enthusiasts from the Springfield area decided to start a basketball tournament to determine the rep/s from WMass to go to the N.E.’s every year. Thus began the “1st” WM H.S. basketball tournament. It lasted only two years: 1926, 1927 and was discontinued after that due to financial problems.

At M.A.C. - Amherst a group of coaches: Harold “Kid” Gore, Lorin “Red” Ball and Larry Briggs decided to hold a tournament for the “small” schools that were generally left out of the NE tourney play-in format. So in 1928 they organized the 1st Small Schools H.S. basketball tournament at Amherst. The tournament was to run March 7-9 1928. Games would be played at Old Drill Hall - M.A.C. campus. Briggs sent out letters to schools in Franklin, Hampshire and Hamden Co., none from the Berkshires. Two teams from each county and two “at-large” selections were to be chosen. The teams chosen were: Arms Academy, Chester, Easthampton, Hopkins, Palmer, Smith Academy, South Deerfield, Turners Falls. South Deerfield won the event beating Arms Academy 14-11 in that initial tournament which drew 1,400 paid fans for three nights and seven games. In 1935 the games moved to Curry Hicks cage.

Results: 1st WM Small Schools basketball tournament:

1st round: Arms Academy 17 Easthampton 16. Turners Falls 22 Hopkins 19.

Deerfield 36 Chester 26. Smith Academy 18 Palmer 11.

2nd round: Deerfield 30 Turners Falls 22. Arms 16 Smith 10.

Finals: Deerfield 14 Arms 11.

The organizers of the tournament wanted to put an emphasis on : sportsmanship, team play, spirit of competition rather than an all-out slugfest that took away from the purpose of high school athletics. Over the years the format changed to include preliminary rounds and dividing the brackets into a quasi-large and small divisions. These were the days before regional schools and the advent of a state-wide tournament eventually put an end to it in the 1972. Some “little” schools who played but no longer exist are: Chester, Arms Academy - Shelburne Falls, Hitchcock Free Academy - Brimfield, Huntington, Cummington, Northfield, Williamsburg, Sanderson Academy - Ashfield, Charlemont, Orange, South Deerfield, Searles/ - Gt. Barrington, Adams, Williamstown, St. Michael’s - Northampton, Sacred Heart - Holyoke, Dalton, Williams/ - Stockbridge, Powers Institute - Bernardston, New Salem Academy, St. Joseph - North Adams.

The tournament ran for a week: usually Mon. - Sat. and would usually have three games per night. Generally teams were not invited for more than two consecutive years unless they were defending champs. This tournament became very popular and would far eclipse the state - WMass tournament which was more or less for the “big” schools from the Valley - Springfield - Berkshire Co. Attendance was high and 2-4,000 paid each night to watch their local entry play. A few teams “skipped” the WMass tourney to play at the Cage rather than in Springfield due to the popularity of the event. This tournament, in its day, was a “Hoosiers” type event and considered equal to the also popular Clark Tournament for teams in Worcester Co. and the Tech Tournament at Boston Garden for EMass high schools. The Clark tourney still operates for schools who don’t make the CMass tourney and is held at Clark University in Worcester each year. There has been talk of resurrecting a mini version of these games again and a four team event was played @ 2008 ? but discontinued after one year.

1928 - 1933 one bracket for all teams was the format. In 1934 a separate Supplemental division was added for smaller schools. The tournament evolved into a Main / class L and a class S or B group.

In 1972 the last March tournament was held at the Cage. The advent of the new state class L and class S divisions tournament created more opportunities for teams. Also less schools sought to enter the classic and operating expenses had depleted a fund to run the event.

It lasted until 1972 when a newer version of the state tournament created an opportunity to play under an M.I.A.A. state event. A Xmas tourney in Dec.1972 to replace it lasted two years.

In 1935 the “ 1st “ state baseball tournament was organized. The finals were at Fenway Park. There was no WMass play-in/tourney to send a rep from the WMass region. Holyoke 12-2 and St.Joe/Pittsfield 7-0 were the two teams from WMass. Pittsfield actually/eventually won the Berkshire Co. title later in the season but St.Joe went due to a better record at the time of team selection. Early tournaments: baseball and basketball sometimes clashed with regular season schedules and school obligations, thus some teams opted out or the actual best teams didn't always go. The tournament was held on June 13-15, 1935. Teams “invited”/chosen: Holyoke 12-2, St.Joe/Pittsfield 7-0, St.Mary's/Milford 13-1, Lowell 12-1, Taunton 11-1, Mission Hill/Boston 14-2, Somerville 13-3, Framingham 10-2.

A coaches' committee from WMass along with some sports writers picked the teams. Irv “Chief” Walmer/Tech, Carl Nichols/Greenfield, David Hosley/Drury, John Houlihan/St.Mary/Westfield, and George Reynolds/ Agawam. Earl Lorden/Turners Falls , president of WMass branch of the Mass.Coaches' Assoc. oversaw the committee and concurred with its selections. Holyoke and Chicopee were tied for 1st place in the Valley League but Holyoke got the nod by beating Turners (11-4) twice while Chicopee lost to TF once. Holyoke and Chicopee split their two games. Chicopee considered not playing in the Valley League the following year. These “little disagreements” among schools, coaches and teams occasionally happened in the absence of a strong state sports governing organization at the time. As for the Pittsfield scenerio, they were 8-0 but won four games by one run, so 7-0 St.Joe went. Pittsfield later beat St.Joe for the Northern Berkshire title and then Lee, Southern Berkshire champ for the county championship, record of 12-0.

In April, 1935 George Springer, lead sports writer at the Springfield Republican newspaper and other reporters of the State Interscholastic Sports Writer's Association met at the Hotel Lenox in Boston with coaches, A.D.'s business executives and Eddie Collins/Red Sox and Rabbit Maranville/Boston Braves to organize a state baseball tournament. Four writers from WMass newspapers were to meet at the Clinton Hotel in Springfield to discuss how to chose teams to represent WMass. The state was to be divided into six zones ,with a champ from each going to the state tournament ,along with two “at-large” selections to set up a tourney of eight teams. Some WMass coaches who helped set up the tournament were: Billy Wise/Cathedral, Harm Smith/Agawam, Earl Lorden and Joe Sheff/Turners Falls, Ralph Verney/Orange, Karl Miner/Ludlow, Joe Dagistino/Monson, Robert Walker/Enfield were the leaders from the WMass area.

Team rosters of 15 players were to be submitted and each school got \$3 a day expense money for each player and coach to cover costs. WMass was in zone one which was from Athol to Ware to Palmer (N/S line) all the way through Berkshire Co. Profits, if any ,were to go to scholarship fund for players/students. Preliminary round games were to be held at various towns/cities with a trophy (James Leary) awarded. Leary, was a well know promoter of sports and at the time and a former star athlete and current sports figure in Boston. The Red Sox would donate Fenway Park for the final game. Concern, at the time, was that football was fast replacing baseball as a more popular sport in high school and college. It certainly brought in more money/revenue than baseball and usually paid the athletic bills at most schools. The Major Leagues felt a loss of interest in “our nation's pastime” warranted the new interest in promoting the game of baseball in Massachusetts thus continuing grooming players for their leagues.

School officials gave their “blessings” to this new format, though many still thought it above and beyond the scope of high school athletics at that time. An MIAA type administrative body did not exist yet so there was really no one to set precedent or regulate the schools as there is today. EMass school and teams were very supportive of this tournament across a statewide format. Writers from all WMass newspapers were invited to attend organizational meetings to provide the public with news and also add their input as to how to set up the games. Somerville won the “1st” state baseball tournament: beating Lowell 20-8. Holyoke beat Taunton 6-3 and ST.Joe lost to Somerville 7-6 in 1st round. Holyoke lost to Somerville 10-4. In 1936 a WMass tournament, separate from EMass, was established to send a rep to the state finals.

1936 saw Templeton, a Central Mass team, playing in the “WMass” tournament, win it, beating Greenfield, 6-2 and then Somerville 2-1 for the state championship. Ironically Turners Falls who lost to Templeton 4-3 in the “WMass” semi-finals was the “mythical” WMass champ (11-4) during the regular season and the tourney favorite. Turners would win WMass in 1937 but lose to Lynn English in the state finals.

Berkshire Co. teams usually were short-changed. Games outside Conn. River valley or WMass or how many games played within or against who and points claimed often caused ratings issues. Hamden Co. schools usually got the nod over the other three WMass counties for title status until 1972.

Nov. 2021

In 1972 the M.I.A.A. started a playoff format for the three geographical regions of Mass. Eastern, Central, Western Mass. had a Super Bowl at the end of the season to determine a regional champion, sometimes within each area or against each other. These did not result in a state title but a zone champion. T-Day games played by most schools “blocked” a true state playoff system. This did however produce a partial state title on the field rather than by a points rating system from 1920 to 1971. In 2013 an actual state champ was established through a playoff system. A regional EMass, CMass and WMass champ in several divisions was created by games that sent the winners to a true Super Bowl at Gillette Stadium. This is a list of WMass champs in each division as a result. 1972 - 2012 WMass champs were based on a points rating system that sent a team(s) to a game vs a CMass team or a match vs another WMass opponent in a “bowl” game.

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Ranking WMass/CMass/EMass football teams was, until 1972, a matter of opinion and regional bias based on local newspapers, sports writers and area coaches, sometimes with input from referees who were interviewed by local newspapers. EMass usually claimed their geographical region as the area that produced the best teams thus the “de facto” state champions. Occasionally way back in the 1920’s, 30’s, 40’s and even into the 1950’s a team from WMass would play a “challenge” game with an Eastern Mass team determined to be the best by Boston newspapers in an informal poll/rankings system. WMass had a similar points rating system to determine a “mythical” champ from the area. These cross state games usually took place around Thanksgiving but sometimes were arranged before the season started or scheduled at the “last” moment during the season, if there was an opening in a schedule allowing it. WMass also did this to see “who was the best” by playing on the field and not ranking by press reports.

In 1928 a points system was set up by the Springfield Republican newspapers to pick a WMass champ. This system lasted until 1955 when the Class AA Conference was established. This put an end to the old points system that determined a WMass title. It was then assumed that the WMass champ was the winner of the AA Conference. The Springfield City League also held this status. Sometimes Berkshire Co. would claim they had the best team. No games were ever played to see who was the best due to Thanksgiving rivalries and cold weather in November/Dec. which precluded any “title match”. Class B, C teams were selected by opinion/papers from those “minor leagues” from the area. Valley Wheel, Class A, Inter-County winners. That left no clear-cut champion in WMass or at the state level.

In 1971 just before the season started two sports writers: Marvin Paye (Boston Globe) and William Abrahamson (Boston Herald) proposed to the MSPA (Mass. Secondary Principals Assoc.) that a playoff be held at Schaeffer Stadium at the end of the season between the top teams in class A and B in Eastern Mass. The proposal was supported by the MHSFCA (Mass High School Football Coaches Assoc.). The issues were planning on a short notice, WMass/CMass teams, a new rating system to determine who played, safety of astro-turf field use, late in the year weather, upcoming basketball season, and school administration who had always frowned on end of/late season games in any sport that might impact classes.

Headmasters rejected the plan but agreed to study the suggestion. An ad hoc committee of

principals

A.D.'s, and coaches was formed to study other states' playoff systems, set up guidelines, establish a ratings

system and set up a tournament format. They concluded that a playoff was possible and should be started.

In 1972 the first games were implemented. EMass played a North vs. South regional and WMass played

teams from CMass. Schools were divided into Class L and Class S to start the football playoff.

Sectional winners were crowned but no state-wide champions were determined. The regional

Super Bowls continued in a mixed playoff system between EMass (N - S) and WMass vs.

CMass / or with each region playing for a champ within each region's area. Finally, in 2013 a

state champion format was set up that resulted in a final Division titlist.
