grateful I am to be with you so that we could participate in the ministry of Jesus together. This summer our church participated in something new, partnering with the Great Plains Food Bank in the Summer Lunch Program. The program

began on June 4 and concluded on August 17. During that time, we served 954 meals and 193 weekend packs to children at our distribution point at the South Elementary Park/Playground. We had awesome helpers

to make the program happen. There were 30 people from CPC that helped over the summer and another 29 that came to help during their lunch from Blue Cross/Blue Shield. It took 59 people to feed the hungry children this summer! THANK YOU to ALL the people who worked together to feed God's children!

Our summer sermon series this year was on the Great Ends of the Church. It was a good reminder that as a church community, we are to follow Jesus' command to make disciples of all nations and we are to care for all of God's people. We are also to worship together, preserve the truth, and show the world God's Kingdom on earth and in heaven.

Because Jesus died for us, we have received the grace of God. We don't have to do anything to earn God's grace, it is a gift. We are family with everyone, all the children of God. In return, we reach out to others, not because we must, but because we want to care for our sisters and brothers all over this world God gave us to live in. Sharing the ministry of Jesus is one way we follow Jesus' commandments.

Throughout this newsletter you will find articles about the different ways and activities that we will be participating in together with Jesus. Sunday School is starting on September 9 for children of all ages, including adults. the proceeds with Churches United. We will be working even more closely with Churches United as one of their "Faith Partner" in the future.


The concept of "it takes a village" comes to mind when we look at





The mission focus for September and October is PATH.




PATH ND is a private nonprofit child and family services agency that began operations in North Dakota in 1994.

Shelter and Support in a Spiritual Setting

July 23, 2018

Dear Pastor Cathie Bishop,

Thank you so much for your gift! Isn't a great feeling to know that you are helping men, women and children who are experiencing homelessness? We have that freedom to help others. It must be July as I have been thinking about freedom a lot lately. I appreciated a sentiment from a recent guest who was moving out. She asked what she was looking forward to the most, she responded, "Eating meals of my choice." Our guests are so appreciative of the three meals a day served here at the shelter. However, when they eat and what they eat is never a choice. They eat when meals are served and what someone else cooks for them. For most of us, that is a luxury, but it truly gets old fast.

Another guest expressed that they were looking forward to privacy when they moved out. Again, folks are very grateful for the beds however, sleeping in a dorm style room with strangers who have different sleeping habits can be very difficult. Snoring, room temperatures and lights out are no longer choices. Bathroom sharing takes patience as well. These are freedoms that most of us take for granted.

These are also the things that keep people working hard to get into their own housing. People want the freedom to choose what to eat, when to go to bed and when to take a shower. We sure are blessed to have those things, are we? Thank you for supporting those who don't. Your gift is making such a difference. And each person staying at Churches United for the Homeless is grateful.
