



NRA Basic Pistol Shooting / CHL Combo Course

Course Cost Per Person: \$275.00 (\$225.00 if paid in full 10 days prior to the first day of class)

Course Description

The entire course is about 15 hours in length.

Part 1: The first part of the course covers Basic Pistol Shooting topics and includes 1 The student will learn the basic knowledge, skills and attitudes necessary for owning and using a pistol safely.

Each student will learn about:

- pistol parts and operation
- ammunition
- gun safety
- shooting fundamentals
- legally transporting your handgun

Shooting exercises will include common shooting positions. As a part of the shooting experience, the student will learn about care and cleaning necessary for handguns.

Topics such as basic guideline for purchasing a pistol, legally transporting it to and from the range or field, and safe home storage are also discussed.

Part 2: This portion of the course is dedicated solely to teaching the student the Concealed Handgun License curriculum.

The law portion of class is 5 hours per new regulation (effective 10/2013). This does not include written testing or shooting qualification (approximately 2.5 hrs). Please plan on being in the class for at least 7-8 hours.

To apply for a Concealed Handgun License in Texas you must be:

- A resident of Texas.
- 21 and legally able to buy a handgun under both Federal and State law.
- Not judged to be chemically dependent or of unsound mind.
- Not ever convicted of a felony anywhere, and no convictions of a Class A or B misdemeanor in the past 5 years.
- Not subject to a restraining or protective order.
- Not delinquent in payment of taxes, child support or any money collected by any Texas Governmental entity.
- Out of state residents may apply for a non-resident license if they meet all other requirements listed above.

You must qualify using a .32 caliber or larger. If you qualify with a Semi-Auto or a Revolver you may carry any type or caliber handgun.

The shooting proficiency test will consist of 50 rounds of timed fire on the state specified target. 20 rounds at 3 yards 20 rounds at 7 yards and 10 rounds at 15 yards.
