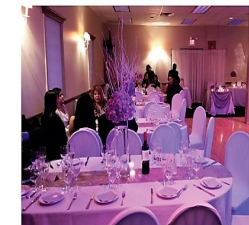

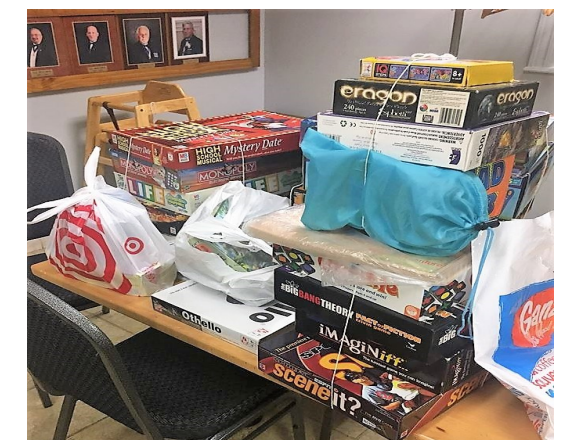

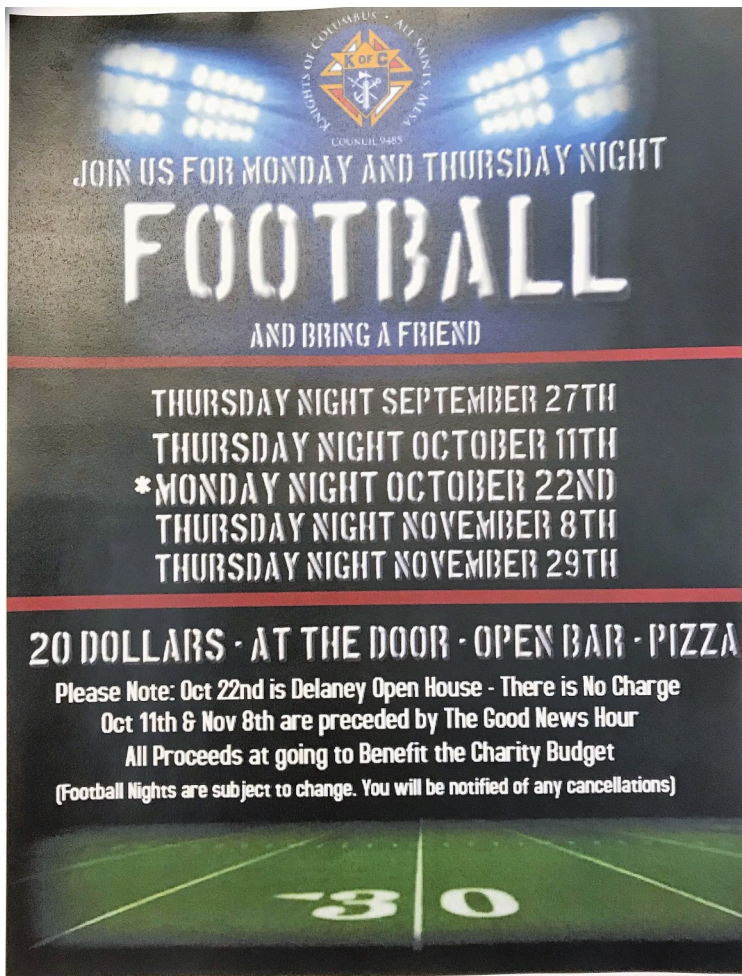

A CHOICE THAT SILENCES A VOICE

The United States Constitution gives the Right to Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of happiness. When a baby is aborted and the right to life is removed from that child in the womb then a choice is made that silences a voice for all our good.
