Clergy Column

Congratulations to Trenten Boucher and Deborah Fitzl who were united in Marriage yesterday! The couple was married in the bride's hometown of Manley, Iowa, and they will reside in rural Oklee.

The Feast of Corpus Christi (The Body of Christ) is the paramount day of the year when we show our love and affection for Our Lord's Sacred Body and Blood which we receive in the Holy Eucharist. In my homily, I mention the joy and sweetness of being united with the Lord, but in this bulletin article, I want to make a point of addressing the matter of receiving Holy Communion worthily.

We must be in a state of grace, and not a state of mortal sin, when we receive Holy Communion. Devout reception of Holy Communion will forgive and heal any venial (lesser) sins we have committed, but it cannot repair a relationship with God that has been utterly broken by mortal sin. In fact, receiving Holy Communion in a state of mortal sin digs you in deeper into this unholy state and piles on yet another mortal sin on your soul. This is not joking matter. If you have committed grave and mortal sins, it is necessary to have them Sacramentally forgiven in the confessional before you receive Holy Communion, lest you eat and drink your own condemnation, as the Sacred Scriptures put it.

Another point of clarification...I am aware that many people in the past have given up going to Confession, or simply refuse to confess their sins. Whether you have come to this unfortunate state by the bad advice of some confused or unfaithful priest, or whether you (continued on page 2)

have made this decision entirely on your own, I am here to tell you that you cannot remain a Catholic with this attitude, and you certainly cannot continue to receive Holy Communion. One of the precepts of the Church is that everyone make a well-prepared confession at least once per year, but certainly more often if you commit mortal sin more often. This is the Church's standard advice for good and holy living. When we refuse to follow this advice, when we fail to comply with this Precept of the Church, we are (by that very fact) committing a mortal sin. How many people in our congregations are in mortal sin simply for the reason that it has been years since they have gone to confession? How many people in our congregations receive Holy Communion unworthily every Sunday? Now it's true that you have to know a thing is a sin in order for it to be a mortal sin, and some of you may have forgotten about this precept of the Church commanding you to go to confession once a year, so you might get a pass this year on it being a mortal sin, but now you have been reminded, and you know what is expected of you, and in the future you must realize that failing to make at least an annual confession is a mortal sin itself, even if you have otherwise lived a perfectly sinless life.

I am not trying to chase anyone away. I invite everyone to stay. First of all, I invite you to make a good confession, but if you are not yet ready and prepared to do that, then I invite you to keep coming to Mass, to stay close to our Lord, but simply refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have been forgiven of your sins in the confessional. Yes, all are truly welcome to the house of the Lord. Atheists, pagans, half-believers, doubtful believers, struggling believers, repentant sinners, and faithful believers...all of these people are welcome to come into our church and join us in worship to be close to and *feel* close to the Lord, but to be <u>unit-</u><u>ed</u> with him by receiving his Body and Blood, we must also be <u>faithful believers</u>, and by it's very definition, a faithful believer is someone who wants to be forgiven of his or her sins as soon as possible, in the way that Our Lord Jesus Christ Himself has established. The Lord is patient and merciful. He will wait for you until you are ready, and he will forgive you, but until then, do not load your soul down with further sin by brazenly deciding to receive Holy Communion whether or not you are in a state of grace. If this is you, continue to come to Mass and stay close to the Lord, but most of all pray that you will be relieved of your fear and anxiety (and sometimes even pride), so that you may be forgiven of all your sins and be reunited with our Eucharistic Lord.



FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI

The feast of Corpus Christi is a Christian observance celebrating the Eucharist — also known as Holy Communion. The feast, the date for which changes often, is celebrated mainly by Roman Catholics and it falls on the first Thurday in most countries or first Sunday in the U.S. after Trinity Sunday — 60 days after Easter.

The name "Corpus Christi" is of Latin origin meaning the body of Christ. The day commemorates the Last Supper before Jesus Christ was believed to have been crucified.

Feast of Corpus Christi is a <u>public holiday</u> in countries such as Austria, Bolivia, Brazil, Croatia, Dominican Republic, Poland, Portugal, and Trinidad and Tobago. However, the day is not an official holiday in countries like Australia, Canada, the United Kingdom and the U.S.

The day is celebrated with processions led by high-ranking clergy. A mile -long carpet is made out of flower petals, on which the procession is

carried on. In villages, streets and doorways are decorated with flowers and leaves. While, in recent years, the practice is no longer common, some communities still follow the tradition.

Feast of the **Sacred Heart** of Jesus. June 8th, the Solemnity of the **Sacred Heart** of Jesus, is a moveable **feast**, which means that it depends on the date of Easter Sunday. It is celebrated 19 days after Pentecost Sunday, which falls on the 50th day of Easter. **The Immaculate Heart of Mary**, June 9th, is a devotional name used to refer to the interior life of the Blessed Virgin Mary, her joys and sorrows, her virtues and hidden perfections, and, above all, her virginal love for God the Father, her maternal love for her son Jesus, and her compassionate love for all people.
