

HAVE YOU HEARD ...?

. . . . that on December 28, 2016, Pope Francis named Bishop Thomas as Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Cleveland IN ADDITION TO his responsibilities as the Bishop of Toledo? The Holy Father accepted the resignation of Bishop Richard Lennon for health reasons; he has served as Bishop of Cleveland for almost ten years.

According to canon (Church) law, the role of the Administrator is to maintain the operations of the diocese and provide for the needs of the faithful until the next diocesan bishop is named by the Holy Father. "It will be a privilege to be of service to . . . the people of Cleveland . . . during this time of transition," Bishop Thomas remarked when this announcement was made by the Apostolic Nuncio to the United States, the Most Reverend Christophe Pierre.

Bishop Thomas intends to honor commitments that he has made in our Diocese, but he asks for patience and flexibility as changes will inevitably need to be made. I ask that you would please keep Bishops Thomas and Lennon, as well as the people of Toledo and Cleveland, in your prayers.

. . . that this Sunday and next at 1:00 PM, our second grade students will be celebrating their First Reconciliation? They have been preparing since the beginning of the school year; after this, they will begin preparing for First Holy Communion in the spring. Let us also keep them and their families in our prayers.

. . . On Monday, we will celebrate Martin Luther King, Jr. Day? A reminder to us of the challenges that face us in living in peace and unity with each other. Prayers for this are most appropriate.

While it may seem that it is time for a long, winter's nap, there is much that is going on. Let us ask the Lord's blessings upon us, as we seek to build the Kingdom!

The Gifts of the Magi and the Gifts We Give

The three gifts of the visiting Magi are significant. Gold is a gift given to a king. Jesus is the King of Kings. Frankincense is used in the worship of God. Jesus is divine. Myrrh is an oil or ointment used in healing and, also, in anointing a body for burial. Jesus is human. But does the gold, frankincense, and myrrh only have meaning as gifts of the Magi or are they not meant to be our gifts as well?

Gold is precious. However, King David said that the Word of God was more precious. Studying the Bible and meditating on it can be a gift to God more precious than gold.

Frankincense was also expensive. Psalms speak of our prayers rising like incense before God. If we were to give God our gift of thanksgiving, our prayers of wants and needs, and just our time in conversation with God throughout the day, we would please God more than frankincense.

Because of the manner of its usage, myrrh was often associated with bitterness, pain, sorrow, death, but also healing. We can bring our own myrrh through our sorrow for sin, asking for forgiveness, but also by offering forgiveness and mercy to others. The healing of relationship with God and others is of greater worth than myrrh.

St. Basil the Great once said, "Let there be no one without a gift to offer, no one without gratitude as we celebrate the salvation of the world, the birthday of the human race."
