Lakewood Forest is a Deed Restricted community. The Fund's Architectural Control Committee (ACC) must approve all exterior remodeling and building projects before the project begins. The Fund has the necessary legal authority to enforce this rule.

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What do people discuss on Nextdoor? Recommendations for service professionals and contractors. Descriptions of suspicious vehicles or people. Lost pets. Garage sales and individual items for sale. New restaurants to try. Businesses to avoid. School activities and community events. The range of topics is pretty extensive, although people should not discuss "emotionally charged" subjects like politics and religion. Guidelines for the website explain what is acceptable and what is not, and there are moderators who can remove inappropriate content.

Community groups also use Nextdoor to convey important information. The Harris County sheriff's office regularly posts information about safety and security issues. The Lakewood Forest Fund (our homeowners' association) and the Lakewood Forest Civic Association both use Nextdoor to share information all residents need to be aware of. Local libraries share their events and activities.





Tips to Keep Your Mail Safe

It's a sad fact that people in our community have had their mail stolen in recent months. Thieves are pretty brazen when they want to get their hands on your mail, which could contain checks, gift cards, or personal information that can be used for identity theft. Of course, package thieves are busy as well.

Here are a few actions you can take to protect your mail.

- 1. If you put outgoing mail in your box for the carrier to pick up, don't put the flag up on your box. The flag is a sign for thieves that something is in that box. The mail carrier will find your mail, whether the flag is up or not.
- 2. Don't put personal checks (such as for paying bills) in your mail box. Thieves can change the information on those checks and steal your money. Use online bill pay instead and spare the need to write and mail a check.
- 3. Don't leave mail in your box overnight. If you are going to be away, stop the mail delivery or have a trusted friend pick it up.
- 4. Get daily email notifications from the postal service of what should be delivered to you each day. This includes packages, too. The service is called Informed Delivery. Go to https://InformedDelivery.usps.com to sign up for this free service.
- 5. When you are expecting a package, track the delivery progress so you know when to expect it and when it has been delivered. Most carriers allow you to sign up for package notifications. If you know you have received a package and no one is home, ask a trusted friend to collect the package from your doorstep. Or, divert the package to a safe delivery location when you request shipping.

If you do experience mail or package theft, report it to the constable. This is a crime and law enforcement should be notified.

TRASH REMINDER

All trash/recycle containers must be stored out of view at all times, except for after 6 p.m. the night before trash pickup.

Trash cans/bags should not be stored on driveways or within view from the street. If your lawn service mows before that time, please stow the bags out of sight until the night before pickup.

Yard of the Month for October 2018 will be judged by garden club members the last week of September in Lakewood Forest Sections 14, 15, 17 and 18. The first-place winner will receive a \$50 gift certificate from Plants for All Seasons. Honorable Mention receives a \$25 gift certificate.







Guidelines for Judging

Tard of the Month

Judging for October to be done the last week of September in Sections 14, 15, 17 and 18.

Once a yard has received the "Yard of the Month" award, it is not eligible for further awards for one year. The first place winner for each month will receive a \$50 gift certificate from Plants for All Seasons and recognition in the next *Civic News*. An honorable mention yard will receive a \$25 gift certificate from Plants for All Seasons. Yards are judged in March, April, May, June, October, and November.

Judging is done by members of the garden club on a rotating basis, using the subdivision sections as listed in the Lakewood Forest Directory. It is usually done the last week of the previous month; i.e., judging for October would be held the last week of September.

Gardening Hints From the Pro, Sherri

September To-Do List

This time of the year, fall is in the air!

In the lawn – Water well but less often. With shorter days and cooler nights, begin to reduce the amount of water applied as needed. Avoid watering in the evenings, if possible, to prevent fungal diseases. It's time to feed your lawn to get it recovered from summer. Watch for chinch-bug damage and brownpatch, and treat it ASAP with the appropriate product. If you're not sure what's happening in your grass, bring in samples and pictures to the nursery, or email me at sherriharrah@yahoo.com, and I'll be happy to help diagnose it for you.

In the flowerbeds – Refresh your flowerbeds and containers. It's time for snapdragons, dianthus, mums, petunias, lobelia, crotons and more. This is my favorite time to plant flowers! Our fall flowers, for the most part, will last through the winter! You get so much bang for your buck this time of year!

In the veggie
garden – It's time to
start your fall vegetable garden.
Early September is your last

chance to get tomatoes and peppers in the ground. Cool-season vegetables such as these can be planted directly in the garden from seed or transplants.

Cauliflower, broccoli, brussels sprouts, cabbage, kale, mustard, lettuce and kohlrabi can be planted September through January. Look for seeds or transplants to add to your garden. Maintain watering on newly planted seeds and transplants. Do not rely on your sprinkler system! Get out the hose and hand water the first two weeks after planting.

Hummingbirds – Migrating hummingbirds can be found at your feeders and natural nectar sources. Keeping feeders clean, filled and in a shady area will encourage visitors.

were so many poolside parties, kids playing on the playground and volleyball court, and parents relaxing with friends!



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
