DESCRIPTION: This high-end Temujin was a project bow that I reconditioned and restored to the best of my ability (see before pics at the end of the flyer). This bow looks great from 3 feet away; up close you can see the wear and tear/flaws. Most of the flaws are cosmetic with the black/white decorative overlays. This is a fun bow to shoot, and is very smooth and accurate. I am able to shoot really tight groups with it. Fred Bear named the Temujin after Ghengis Kahn's family name (Temujin). It was the top bow in the Bear line after the Tamerlane. The Temujin model is fairly rare as it was only produced 3 years (1968-1970). It featured a "balanced opposites" design, every curve and flare on the top half of the riser was balanced with a corresponding shape on the lower riser. It was designed on the "Golden Triangle of Stability" and offered a comfortable two-way grip, quick dampening action, and reduced vibration. The riser is made from East Indian rosewood and African bubinga with hard-rock maple accent stripes. Bear sight plate and brush rest. Bow has no limb delamination; no cracks; limbs are straight. Overlays and tips are in great condition. No drilled holes; No chips, dings or cracks. No crazing or stress cracks; A few minor scratches and nicks here and there. The limbs have been refinished and you can tell up close that they were re-stained. Decals are in fair condition. Overall, this is a really nice shooting bow for its age. This bow sold for \$100 in 1968, which translates to \$840 in 2022 inflation adjusted dollars.
