
February Meeting Project

Chalk Paint Snowman on Reclaimed Wood

The only prep for this project is to clean any dust and dirt off your reclaimed wood. You can sand if you prefer, but do it outside and keep as much of the character as you can. When I painted the original, I traced around a small plate for the head and then just sketched the hat, body and scarf on. You can do it that way or I'll have some patterns to use to put the pattern on at our meeting. The wood is too rough to do our usual tracing paper and graphite so we'll use chalk to sketch and/or trace around.

We will use white and black chalk paint for body & hat. For the scarf, I used Purple Cow & Grape Juice. If you want a different color for your scarf bring what you have.

Colors on face Cadmium Orange, Burnt Orange, Burnt Umber, Burnt Siena, White, Black.



Any colors will work for this though!

I'll provide a paint palette for \$1 if you just want to bring your wood, brushes and usual painting supplies. In addition to brushes we will use a wedge makeup sponge with the stencil. Suggested brushes are: large brush (1") or a sponge brush for base coating body & hat, Size 6 or close round or filbert for eyes, nose & mouth, wedge or flat for floating.

I'll have some Welcome stencils to share. Bring a snowflake stencil if you have one, but don't buy 1 just for this project.

Chalk paint is a little thicker than acrylic paint. (It is different than chalkboard paint which is used to make a chalkboard to write on.) It has good coverage and is popular for upcycling furniture. It can be used over painted or stained surfaces without much prep other than cleaning.

Hello everyone,


Jan will be teaching her black duck with daisies and cat tails on **Saturday February 25**th. I will get patterns and instructions out ASAP.


