



January 20, 2022 – COVID update

Greetings from Midway Nursing Home

We continue to closely monitor our residents for any signs/symptoms of COVID per NYSDOH & CDC guidelines and continue ongoing testing.

There were 4 new resident COVID positive cases yesterday. All are asymptomatic and are placed on isolation. There are a total of 13 residents who were placed on or remain on isolation as a result of a confirmed positive COVID test. This includes residents who were admitted with a COVID positive test.

Some staff members remain on quarantine. All staff and residents will continue to be tested at least weekly until there are no new cases found for either staff or residents.

When you arrive for your visit, you will be screened, asked to sanitize your hands and put on a surgical mask which will be provided to you. Per the latest guidance, cloth masks may not be worn unless you do so over the provided mask. The mask should cover both your mouth and nose and be worn during the visit. Please maintain distance from staff, residents and other visitors. You will be instructed by staff as to any other precautions necessary to keep your loved one and you, safe.

Regardless of vaccination status, visitors are required to present proof a negative rapid COVID test that was completed within the 24 hours prior to the visit or a negative PCR result from a test that was conducted within 48 hours prior to the visit. If this hasn't been done, we will test you prior to the visit & show you how to do this yourself with the provided test kit.

If you feel ill in any way, please do not visit in person but arrange a virtual visit or phone call. For virtual visits please contact the Recreation Department.

If you or your loved one has not yet been vaccinated or received a COVID booster, we strongly urge you to do it now. This is best protection from serious illness, hospitalization and death.
