Seeing a Better Way

A different, but effective practice technique

Would you like to change your throwing technique or handle stress better? Then let's look at the mental technique of visualizing. The basics of visualizing sound easy: sit or lie in a comfortable chair or couch, close your eyes and imagine yourself in the situation you need to practice. That's it.

"Bull****" you might say - but it's not! Every star in any sport has used - and is still using - this technique. But the key to effectivenenss is in the intensity. Here's how it works:

Let's say you have trouble doubling out against an opponent who's better than you. Ok, lets visualize it. Close your eyes and see yourself standing in front of the line. Imagine as much detail (color, sound) as possible. Hear the noise around you. Imagine your opponent standing behind you. Feel the weight of your throwing arm, feel your dart in your hand. Even smell the chalky odor of the scoreboards- the more details you can imagine, the more you will benefit. Now in your imagination step forward, aim, and kill the double. Could you see it? Feel it? Did your dart catch the edge of the double or stick the middle? With practice, good visualizers can "throw" in their imagination and "feel and see" their throw. And if you can truly imagine that feeling and remember it, you gain the confidence that makes all the difference when you face the "real life version". This is the big advantage: If you experience the feeling of a "perfect" throw in visualizing sessions, it's much easier to reproduce it in practice and then in matchplay. Sounds bogus - but it works!







DEAD RECKONING ON [PRACTICE]

Here's something I like to do regularly... it's a long match of pretty much continuous darts.... choose how many games you want to play, (we usually do a race to 11 or best of 21)... and diddle to determine who starts. The first game is 501, then Cricket, back to 501, Cricket - and so on. Each time the loser of the previous match starts - no diddle - until somebody has won 11 of the games...

This usually takes 2-3 hours depending on how long the cricket games go.... and since the format allows the loser to start each game, it is pure darts.... I have found that this format is long enough that you go from shooting well, to not so well, then back to shooting pretty good again.... and when shooting an equal opponent, you have to push yourself a bit to get ahead & stay ahead till you win....

This format also makes it tough to have a really onesided match, since the losing player always starts & has the advantage...

Which reminds me of something else...a single fat dart in a scoring number in cricket can really change a game....

I was shooting at triples in cricket & not hitting so well, so I backed off & shot my first dart just outside the triple into the bigger part of the number.... from there, adjusting to the triple was easier... plus I found that those extra points every throw add up and can help until the trips start hitting again....

In my mind, shooting at the single instead of the trip is also good practice for those times that you need a single (like setting up an out shot)....

Enough rambling for now.... the most important thing is to find a practice partner (or two or three) and get out there & play.
