Acting Games

6th - 12th grade, Teacher: Ana Johnson

We will play games like charades, why are you late, dramatic death, and more.

American Literature: Poems & Short Stories

8th - 12th grade, Teacher: Dulci Corvin

**Homework required.

A brief look at short stories and essays by American authors. Students will be required to read a selection prior to class and come prepared to participate in group discussion.

Applied Math

6th - 8th grade, Teacher: April Turner

We will be working through math projects from Hands-On Math Projects to give real-life application of math concepts to the students. There are some projects that will require a small amount of data compilation during the week (for example: keeping track of physical activity for the week or taking a survey during the week).

Archery Off the Range

Archery off the range teaches aspects of various equipment, repairs, maintenance, and research to accomplish archery goals on the range for competition, recreation, and hunting. Homework consists of 1-2 topics per week that can be accomplished by the next class – estimated less than 2 hours per topic.
