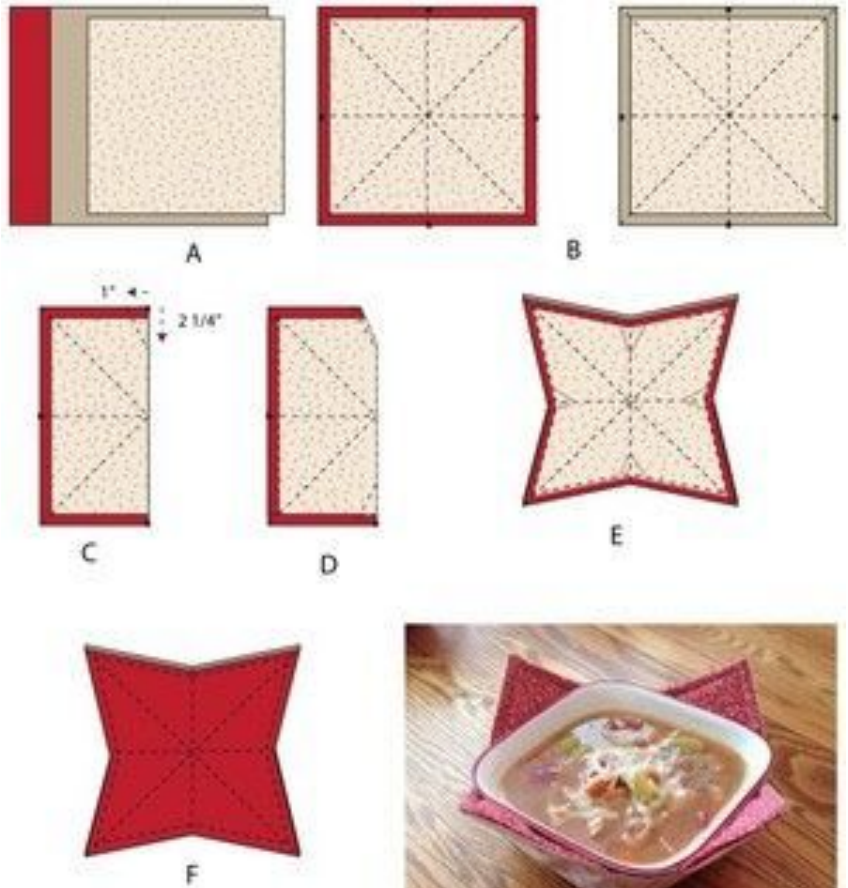
November 2022 Basket Tan, Fall colors print

Tan: A: Cut one  $8 \frac{3}{8}$  square, cut in half   
 B: Cut 2 strips  $3 \times 8$   
 C: To save fabric, use extra remaining half of "A" piece to cut  $5 \frac{7}{8}$  half square, cut in half  
 D: Cut three  $3 \frac{3}{8}$  squares, cut in half  
 E: Cut one 3 inch square

Fall print: F: Cut one  $8 \frac{3}{8}$  square, cut in half   
 G: To save fabric, use extra remaining half of "F" piece to cut  $3 \frac{3}{8}$  half square, cut in half   
 G: Cut three  $3 \frac{3}{8}$  squares, cut in half

Sew D to G = 6 squares; sew 3 together as in diagram. Sew E to top strip.  
 Sew B to G as in diagram. Sew A to F.  
 Sew side strip BG to side of A; sew top strip to top of A. Sew BG to side and bottom.  
 Sew C onto corner! Finished with Basket.

**Primary Technique**Sewing

**Materials List**

- Two 10 inch squares of coordinating 100% cotton fabrics
- Two 9" squares of Soft & Toasty
- 100% cotton batting
- 100% cotton thread
- Sewing machine
- Iron
- Fabric marker
- Basic sewing supplies

Microwave Heat Bowl Diagrams

**Voilà!**  
A safe way to heat soups and stews.

**Instructions:**

1. Cut out fabric and batting as directed above.
2. Layer batting on top of each of the fabric squares wrong side. Mark, then Stitch an x and + through both the layers of the batting and the fabric. Repeat using the second piece of fabric and batting.
3. Fold the stitched square in half and place a mark 1" out from the centerfold along the top edge. Place a second mark 2 1/4 inches down the center stitching line. Draw a line connecting the two marks, creating a dart. Stitch along the marked line. Repeat marking and stitching, creating a total of four darts. Repeat to create darts using the second piece of stitched fabric.
4. Trim away the bulk of the darts and press.
5. With right sides together, stitch the two pieces of fabric together, leaving an opening along one edge. Trim corners and turn right side out. Press well.
6. Hand stitch the opening closed. Top stitch around the Microwave Bowl Cover, sewing 1/2" away from the outside edge to secure all layers of the fabric and the batting together.

I made these recently for dinner and they were a hit!

## German Oven Pancakes

COURSE BREAKFAST

PREP TIME 5 MINUTES

This oven pancake cooks up so gorgeous – with big, puffy golden brown edges and buttery crispness across the top. Just 6 ingredients and 5 minutes prep time!

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### INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups whole milk
- 4 eggs large
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 1/3 cup all-purpose flour
- 4 tbsp granulated sugar
- 1/2 cup salted butter (melt in pan)
- 1 lemon for serving
- powdered sugar for serving

### INSTRUCTIONS

- 1 Place 1/2 cup butter in a heavy 9 x 13 glass baking dish.
- 2 Set baking dish (with butter) in the oven and preheat to 400 degrees.
- 3 In a blender, combine milk, eggs, vanilla, flour, and granulated sugar.
- 4 When the butter is completely melted (before it browns or burns, though!), pour the batter over a metal spoon into the baking dish.

Cook 30-40 minutes or until the pancake is set in the middle and the edges are very puffy and golden brown. 6 Remove from oven. Garnish with lemon juice and powdered sugar and serve immediately.

Prize Drawings – four winning tickets were drawn.

The Opportunity Quilt traveled to Fairfield this past week.

Historian Carol Holmes reported that the history book has been caught up to date. Photo prints for June July and August show and tell, and Town and Country Fair are available for pick up by members. Sandra Ellingson stated that the last of the fabrics from former guild member Carolyn

Spence have been placed on the stage-donation tables. There are cutting tables still left from the estate that are available to any guild member interested in

claiming them. Informational fliers for upcoming quilt and craft shows are available at the membership table.
