WEEKLY THOUGHTS 24th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME SEPTEMBER 17th 2023

Dear Friends, last Thursday, we celebrated the Feast of the Exultation of the Cross a symbol on which Christ died and attained us Salvation. For believers, the cross is a sign of victory. On Friday, September 15th the Church celebrated the memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows- we can call it Mary' way of the cross. Let us pray for the virtues of obedience and humility for all called to be the disciples of Jesus.

In the Gospel Reading of last Sunday, we heard Jesus exhorting his disciples to be loving, forgiving and exhaust all peaceful avenues to bring back an erring brother or sister. The aim is to restore harmony, peace, unity and acceptance. We hear in the Gospel Reading of this Sunday Jesus responding to the question of Peter on the necessity and importance of the willingness to forgive in the parable of the king and his servants.

Indeed the king is a very wealthy man. He has the ability of lending big amounts of money and small or soft loans to his subjects. The king is committed to collect debts. In the process, the king realizes his desperate servant despite the promises, will never be able to pay back the debt. The king exercises mercy as he cancels the debt and let the servant go.

The forgiven servant and debtor behaves differently and harshly when he meets with a fellow servant owing him a small amount of money. He mercilessly mishandles the debtor, takes him to court and eventually have him thrown in prison. This matter makes the people disgusted. It is reported to the king's court. The king summons the wicked servant and gives him a punishment similar to his fellow servant.

Forgiveness is set before us as a way of life to discipleship and holiness. Jesus in his great pain prayed for his killers; "Father forgive them for they do not know what they are do-ing." (Lk. 23:34)

Nelson Mandela in his book "**A Long Walk to Freedom**" before he left prison said; As I stand before the door of my freedom, I realize that if I do not leave my pain, anger and bitterness behind me, I will still be in prison." Let us not imprison ourselves inside the walls of anger and bitterness. Holding on to grudges makes me weaker. Forgiveness makes me strong, free and joyful.
