Signature gathering is underway to place an initiative measure on the ballot that would impose a massive \$6 billion property tax increase on both homeowners and business properties

The initiative, with the innocent sounding title of "Lifting Children and Families Out of Poverty Act," would impose a surcharge on more valuable properties.

This would reinstate a system where increases in home value would be penalized with much higher taxes as occurred prior to Proposition 13. Taxpayers know from hard experience that, for tax raisers, more is never enough. Once the door has been opened, less valuable property will be the next target. (Ironically, higher property taxes could become another a cause of poverty -- before the passage of Proposition 13, escalating taxes were forcing many retirees and those on fixed incomes from their homes.)

Please be alert: HJTA asks taxpayers to be alert and not inadvertently help the tax raisers. Proposition 13 sup-porters should be extremely cautious when asked to sign a petition to place a measure on the ballot. Signature gatherers are unlikely to volunteer that the "Raising Children" measure will raise taxes, so you should ask before signing on in support of any initiative measure.

How to Be a National Delegate

2016 is set to be one of the most important elections of our lifetime. You may apply to be a delegate or alternate delegate for the Republican National Convention by completing an application form through the CRP: http://www.cagop.org/cagop-national-delegate/ and listing your 2016 candidate of choice.

The California Delegation to the Republican National Convention will be comprised of 341 California Republicans (172 delegates and 169 alternates). By registering, you will help the CRP provide a comprehensive list of potential delegates and alternates to the Republican Presidential candidates for their consideration. You can also apply to be a National Delegate directly to the Presidential candidate campaigns – you do not have to apply on the CRP website.

The California Republican Party will send their final list of applicants forward to the Presidential candidates by **March 31, 2016**. Please note that Delegates are chosen by the Presidential candidates, NOT by the CRP or the RNC.

With only five weeks between California's primary and the RNC convention, the CRP must **provide candidates a list of potential delegates that will not drop out due to cost or time constraints.** You will need to consider the financial and time commitments required for being a delegate. Delegates will need to assume all costs for food, travel, lodging (the RNC *requires* 5-night minimum hotel stay, i.e. you pay for 5 nights lodging even if you do not stay all 5 nights) and a \$900 California Delegation fee (paid with personal funds). The estimated costs for a delegate can range from \$3,000-\$6,000.

You must be a registered Republican and a resident of the Congressional District you are representing. You must attend the Delegation Meeting on Saturday, June 25, 2016 near LAX and you must commit to vote for the presidential candidate by whom you are selected. If you are not selected as a delegate or alternate there will still be some opportunities to join the delegation as a guest. 
