There were 50 TON-80's thrown by 44 players thus far in the season. The players tossing two 180's are: Carl Stravinski, J. J. Jackson, Elmer Steiner and Frank Yeager.

The Group A players accounted for 29 180's, Group B scored 10 180's and Group C notched 11 180's. The Gem Division led all Divisions by scoring 14 180's with half of those thrown by Kreuzer, Stravinski, and Jackson.

Eight teams had more than one member scoring 180's and the Shroyer Pings (Red Division, Group B) need Mike Sanderson to toss one to match Bob Munday, Roger Walker and Jeff Stewart to make their team the first team this year to have all members accomplish 180's. Steve & the Big Guys (5 members) and Cactus John's Outlaws (6 members) need two players to complete their team's 180 sweep.

Perfect Cricket scores consist of throwing three triples as this score is near the accomplishment attained by throwing a 180 in that three darts were placed at the targeted maximum score. Triples 20, 19 and 18 were thrown by Ron Cloutier, Mike Mantia, Bill Nicoll, Jr., Ed Conduff, Sam Anderson, Dave Archer, Pete Mougey, Glen Cox (all A) and Jesse Walker (White, C). Triples 18, 17 and 16 were chalked by Carl Kreuzer, Greg Patrick and Stan Dewire; triples 17, 16 and 15 by Rick Davis, Mark Needles, Larry Kingery and Mike Wagers.

Bill Nicoll, Jr. (Gem, A) threw two games back to back scoring triples 20, 19 and 18.

A perfect game of cricket is obtained with 8 darts. Pete Mougey (Gold, A) threw a cricket game using 10 darts. What happened, Pete? Need to score a few extra points along the way?

DDA CITY CHAMPIONSHIPS THE PLAYOFF PICTURE

It's the time of year to begin thinking about our DDA League Championships and set aside these dates on your calendar. A lot of thought has been given to these events in the hopes of minimizing some of the problems that have been experienced in the past. We are planning on starting at 8:00 P.M. and with the "one game 501 tie-breaker" and smaller bracket formations, you should be able to get home at a decent hour (if you really want to!!). There will be only "single" championships this year (no doubles events) and only the game of "501" will be played. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact Tom Patterson at 299-DART.

Divisional Championships

There will be two sets of singles championships in the league this year. The first will be the Divisional Championships. Every DDA member in good standing is eligible to play in their respective Division playoff. The Divisional Playoffs will be held Wednesday/Thursday - April 20/21; specific sites will soon be announced.

The Division Championships will be played in a round robin format with all divisions in the "B" and "C" brackets playing best of **three games of 501**. For those of you not familiar with the "round robin format", this simply means that players will be randomly grouped together and each darter will play every other darter in their designated group, with a playoff being held between the group winners (those having won the most matches).

The "A" bracket divisions will play best of **five games of 501**. There will be a DDA Board representative present at each site to set up the round robin and resolve any disputes which may arise. We will be looking for the top three players from each division (who will then receive free entry into the Bracket championships) with first place receiving a plaque.

Bracket Championships

The second playoff will be bracket championships. These will be held on May 11/12; again, specific locations are yet to be determined. The format of play will be the same as that of the divisional championships (round robin). However, the difference here is that this playoff round will offer prize money. The top three players from each divisional playoff will be eligible to play in their respective bracket championship at no cost. Any player who did not attend the divisionals or wishes a second chance can play at a nominal fee, as noted below.

"C Bracket"	-	Entry Fee \$3.00
"B Bracket"	-	Entry Fee \$5.00
"A" Bracket"	-	Entry Fee \$8.00
"Women's"	-	Entry Fee \$3.00

This year we are going to have a separate women's city championship, also to be played on May 11/12. All women are invited AND ENCOURAGED to play in their respective divisional championships. **In addition, they may also compete in the bracket championship (i.e., with men) or in the women's championship, but not in both.** Again, any woman placing in the top three of their respective division may play no cost. The format will again be round robin, best of three games of 501.

All ties in any round robin will be resolved with 1 game only of 501

EASTER SEAL DART TOURNEY

In 1936, the Montgomery County Easter Seal Society was founded as a local branch of one of the oldest and largest voluntary health agencies in the United States -- the National Easter Seal Society. This National Society and its nationwide network of volunteers have been serving the special needs of people with disabilities since 1919.

Today, the Montgomery County Easter Seal Society provides services to over 900 residents who have a prescribed medical need but are unable to obtain help from any other source, such as insurance or welfare. Among the disabilities we serve are speech and hearing disorders, learning disabilities, stroke, amputation, blindness, cerebral palsy, muscular dystrophy, multiple sclerosis, polio, and disabilities resulting from accidents.

The following is a brief summary of some of our programs. Easter Seal purchases and loans a variety of needed equipment including wheelchairs, oxygen systems, bathroom equipment, crutches, eye exams and glasses. We also help in purchasing corrective shoes and prosthetic devices.

The Toy Lending Library was established for developmentally delayed infants and children enrolled in the parent training program at the Early Childhood Intervention Center. Participating in play not only improves a child's learning skills, it also unites parents and children emotionally, an essential interaction in child development. By lending both regular and specially adapted toys, the Toy Lending Library provides parents with the guidance and tools to continue their child's play-therapy at home.

In 1973, the Montgomery County Easter Seal Society, along with audiologist Dr. Mel Emanuel, originated a summer camp for hearing impaired and normal hearing children. This unique camp gives both groups of children the chances to learn about each other while enjoying various organized activities. Last year the children got a chance to learn about computers.

We also sponsor the Montgomery County Stroke Club. Since 1980, the club has been dedicated to helping stroke and head injury victims and their families understand the problems and accomplishments they may share.

Each month the Stroke Club meets for a variety of social and educational activities. Even more important, informal discussion gives members the chance to share their feelings and experiences, which enables the members to offer each other valuable moral support and encouragement.

These are just a few of the many things Easter Seal does throughout your community. As a non-profit organization, Easter Seals does not receive federal funding and is not a member of United Way. Therefore, we depend entirely upon the donations of individuals, corporations, clubs, and special events such as this Dart Tournament.

The Budweiser - Easter Seal Dart Tournament will be held on Sunday, March 27th at the F.O.P. Hall on Powell Road in Huber Heights. Food, beer and pop will be available with a \$2,000.00 guaranteed payout. All proceeds from this event will go to the programs and services of the Montgomery County Easter Seal Society. Help us help the disabled in our community lead productive and fruitful lives. Hope to see all of you there on March 27th.
