




The Northwestern Ohio Synod is one of 65 ELCA synods. Our synod consists of 162 congregations, 75,000 members, who synod wide contribute \$33 million. There are eight Lutherans per square mile in NW Ohio! "Each synod, in partnership with the churchwide organization, shall bear primary responsibility for the oversight of the life and mission of this church in its territory." - ELCA Constitution. Below are some of the synod staff, appointed within the last few months...



Bishop

Bishop Daniel Beaudoin is overseeing and administering the work of the Northwestern Ohio Synod (NWOS). He ordains and commissions candidates for ministry, installs lay and rostered ministers and provides pastoral care and leadership to the congregations and clergy of NWOS.

Director of Leadership Development and Congregational Care





Director of Leadership Development and Congregational Vitality

Kent Wilson provides leadership for stewardship development, congregational vision and mission processes, congregational redevelopment and new church starts, and will help develop a synod-wide culture of discipleship.

Program Assistant for Mission Advancement

Cheryl Sondergeld will be leading our event planning and coordination, coordinating volunteers, and will provide administrative support for our professional staff.



Coordinator of Communications and Technology

Caroline Guy is facilitating the synod's communications and media presence, in addition to providing communications and technological administrative support for the professional staff.

Where does our money go? In 2017, our congregation contributed \$38,000 toward our Mission Share. Approximately half of that amount was given to the ELCA for its work. The remaining monies are used toward the mission and ministries of the synod to provide pastoral care, leadership training and recruitment, and discipline for congregations and rostered leaders. The 2018-19 budget of the NWOS is \$1,702,134. Of that, 51% or \$826,200 is directed to the ELCA.

Where do our offerings go? Although we do not budget for Trinity Seminary, the Endowment Committee does provide scholarships for prospective students at Trinity. A portion of our offerings go to the eight ELCA seminaries through our Mission Share (benevolence). Individual gifts and special offerings, like the recent "Noisy Offering" help support our seminary in Columbus.

things"

I begin with "The Case for Reading Before Bed". "Research shows that reading can reduce stress by 68% - more than other traditional methods of relaxation. It doesn't take much time to reap the rewards: six minutes is all you need to slow your heart rate. Opt for something light and easy. Avoid anything that will reverse those feel-good effects, like a horror novel or a self-help book that requires too much introspection" —Brandi Broxson.

And on another topic, when you look for reasons to celebrate—no matter how small, you in crease your happiness, says Greg Hicks, coauthor of <u>Choosing Brilliant</u> <u>Health: 9 Choices that Redefine What It Takes to Create Lifelong Vitality and Wellbeing.</u> "It makes you feel more connected to the world and to the people and things around you," he explains.

When someone says "Thank you!" Celebrate. Highlighting the positives in your life and feeling the joy they bring really is as simple as that. Pure happiness is all about accumulating a bunch of joyful moments.

Not only do these bursts of bliss leave you feeling more optimistic and content, they also boost your immune system.

Unfortunately, it is human nature to look for the bad, not the good. There is power in negativity—the parents all complain about a teacher or coach, neighbors all complain about the addition to the neighborhood. When we join in a complain-fest, we might feel part of a group, but at the same time we erode each other, with sentiment of "poor us." In these situations, we see ourselves as victims and become even more unhappy.


