An Interview with Kerry Nobis of

Nobis Dairy

Brown Dairy Equipment interviewed Kerry Nobis of **Nobis Dairy in St. Johns, Michigan** about his purchase of the *Udder Gun Teat Scrubber System*. Nobis Dairy milks in a double 15 parabone style parlor with a two gun Udder Gun System with the Mixing Prep System. This Mixing Prep System mixes water with their hydrogen peroxide concentrate on demand. When they are finished prepping a line of cows, Nobis Dairy places the gun into the docking station for cleaning with fresh water. The free stalls at Nobis Dairy are bedded with sand.

Brown Dairy Equipment (BDE): Kerry, what was your reasoning for buying this type of product?

Kerry Nobis (KN): There were a few reasons:

We wanted more consistency in our cow prep, while making the job easier for our milking staff by eliminating repetitive motion, fatigue and injury. Specifically, we wanted better teat end cleanliness and more effective stimulation.

BDE: Did the Udder Gun meet your expectations?

KN: Yes, it did, and the employees like how easy it is to use.

BDE: Did you see any savings by using the Udder Gun?

KN: We use considerably less pre-dip and have been able to maintain our Somatic Cell Counts, and our coliform counts have been great.

BDE: Did the Udder Gun help you achieve results you had hoped for?

KN: We put a lot of cows through our parlor, the Udder Gun gave us better milk let down and shorter milking times.

BDE: Any other comments about the Udder Gun?

KN: There is a fair amount of maintenance, but service is easy and we do it ourselves. This product is not cheaply made. The repair parts are consistent in durability.

BDE: Would you recommend this product to other dairies looking to improve their prep procedures?


KN: Absolutely.


