

*Parish Membership:* Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

*Sick & Shut-ins:* The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

*Marriages:* In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

*Parish Council:* Meets on the Monday evening after the third Sunday of the month.

*Holy Name Society:* Meets on the Monday evening after the second Sunday of the month. President, Anthony Martelli

*Rosary Altar Society*: Meets on the Monday evening after the first Sunday of the month. President, Liz Mulvaney

#### Silence is Golden!

In our Christmas Play, Mary asked Elizabeth why Zachariah her



husband could not speak. She explained that it was because he doubted the Angel of God. Then she went on to happily tell Mary that she had come to realize that silence in a husband was indeed golden. She was cherishing it.

Well, I can understand why most spouses would love their partners to be rendered dumb, and probably mute for a few months. But beyond spousal silence, there's another reason why silence is indeed golden - it is and must be an essential element of our relationship with God. The best prayer or communication with God is really when we spend some quiet or silent time with God in front of the Blessed Sacrament.

I remember this beautiful hymn by Steven Curtis Chapman. We sang this so often from my first days in the seminary to the last. We sang it mostly as a post Communion hymn. It was so calming and reassuring.

## Be still and know that I am the Lord. (4x) I am the Lord that healeth thee, (4x) In thee, O Lord, I put my trust, (4x)

Parishioners who come to the rectory outside of the office time often comment on how quiet it is. Some wondered how we don't get bored. It doesn't get boring because we were trained to not tolerate silence but to love it. From 10pm till after Mass &

breakfast the following day, the entire seminary was just quiet. Think of St. Joseph's seminary and how quiet and peaceful it is, then add the fact that the men inside it observe silence for many hours.



Sadly, many may not connect to what I'm saying because they have not really experienced it. We're constantly on the go. Our families are constantly on the go. Our society is constantly on the go. And as if this is not bad enough, we end up pilling on more things – mostly social – to the list. By the end of the day, we barely have so little time, energy or interest to squeeze in some meager basic prayer, not to talk of any extended prayer, like say 20 minutes.

If we struggle with the basics, imagine going to that luxurious extra prayer where we could spend a beautiful hour with Christ! The world would probably disappear before we get back. Yet we need such prayer so badly. If only we knew what peace, love, trust (etc) awaits us when we spend enough time with Christ. If only we knew! Above all, we too, like Abraham, would be able to hear God calling and directing us.

This week, we have our Lenten Retreat. Will you be there to allow Jesus to speak to you? All through Lent we have adoration from 5-7pm before the Stations of the Cross. Come and spend some silent time and commune with Him who constantly awaits us.


