- (3) Members should help work and attend the activities and fundraisers. When I say activities, that doesn't necessarily mean large events- it can mean a prayer service or special craft at a meeting. An activity can take on many forms and sizes. I also don't mean that every member must attend every activity, but I am hoping that we can all work at being a little more active in our courts. Take advantage of doing something new or something you have done before and share that with your sisters in Christ. I always enjoy my time spent with my fellow sisters.

In the year 2000, Pope John Paul II established the first Sunday after Easter as a universal Feast of the Church in honor of that Divine Mercy. In so doing, he was fulfilling a request our Lord himself made in his appearances to the Polish nun, St Faustina Kowalska. Just the thought of Christ's mercy fills us with confidence and hope, but it should also fill us with humility. If Christ is so eager to spread the news about his boundless mercy, it's because we need that mercy. It's because sin is a reality in our lives and in our world, and sin causes real damage that only Christ can repair.

In the revelations of his Divine Mercy, Jesus asked St Faustina to commission a painting. The painting would show Jesus standing, dressed in a white alb, with his right hand raised in blessing and his left hand opening his heart. Out of his heart there were to be streaming two beams of light - one white and the other red.

He explained what those rays symbolized:

- The two rays denote Blood and Water.
- The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous [baptism].
- The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls [the Eucharist].
- These two rays issued forth from the depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross ...
- Happy is the one who will dwell in their shelter, for the just hand of God shall not lay hold of him (Diary, 299).

Jesus is reminding us of the power and abundance of his mercy. We should be full of joy and confidence at this reminder. And the reminder he is giving us will bear fruit in our lives if we follow the **ABC's** of the

Divine Mercy.

A. Ask for mercy.

The best way to ask for his mercy for ourselves is through the sacrament of confession, entrusted to the Church on this very day 2000 years ago.

Here is what Jesus told St Faustina about confession:

- When you approach the confessional, know this, that *I Myself am waiting there for you*.
- I am only hidden by the priest, but I Myself act in vour soul.
- Here the misery of the soul meets the God of mercy. (Diary, 1602)

But we can also ask for mercy for others, especially by praying for those who don't trust or believe in Christ's mercy.

B. Be merciful.

- Jesus told St Faustina, "I demand from you deeds of mercy... You are to show deeds of mercy to your neighbors always and everywhere."
- This means doing good things for others not because they deserve it or to get a reward, but simply in order to follow in the footsteps of our merciful Lord.

But where can we find the strength to do that?

C. Completely trust in Jesus.

- Jesus himself will give us his grace, if we let him. He will make us into ambassadors of his mercy, just as he did with the first Apostles.
- Whenever we are afraid to Ask for mercy, when



we feel too weak to Be merciful, we should simply pray the prayer that Jesus told St Faustina to write underneath the image of his Divine Mercy: "Jesus, I trust in you."

And let's start right now.



To refresh your memory Nancy Bambenek, our National Supervisor brought these "gifts from God" enough for everyone in attendance to receive at least one. She told us these gifts are yours to do with as you wish: use it for a fundraiser, give it as a gift, keep it for personal use, etc. Her only request was that everyone was to let the State Board know what they did with their gift.

Some of the attendees did follow through and reported back what they did with their blankets and or quilts and here are the wonderful results.



- I gave one to my great grand daughter in MN for her birthday and the other one went to someone with Ministries on the Margin. I would like to thank Nancy for her generosity.
- Ascension parish in Bismarck gives quilts to parishioners who are sick, so that is where I donated my quilts to.
- This was such a treat to go through such beautiful blankets. I found one for my granddaughter, who loves barbies. This granddaughter has a sister who has some health issues, so it was her turn to have some extra special attention.
- Gave it to a niece in a nursing home. Was very much appreciated.
- I gave mine to an unwed mother for her baby boy,
- I took mine to the Women's Care Center in Bismarck.
 They were very appreciative and thankful to receive it.
 (There were a few women who took theirs here.)
 Thank you for this opportunity!
- There is a low-income family that members of my family have been gifting with clothing, school supplies, winter gear, shoes, toys, etc. Before the CDA gathering I had recently learned that they were expecting their fourth child. I gave one of the quilts to this family.
- The other quilt went to one of my nieces who has several young granddaughters. My sister (niece's mother) collected all things Precious Moments; when I saw the Precious Moments quilt, I took it to give to my niece so she could pass it on to one of her granddaughters.
- I took 2 back to members of our court who were unable to attend.
- I kept mine to use in my guest room to welcome guests.

- I gave one of mine to a person who had been diagnosed with cancer as a prayer quilt. She was so touched to receive this.
- I gave the other one to a person who had a brain injury who hasn't been able to work. It had cows and farm items on it. He always loved the farm so it made him feel at home.
- I gave both to Ministry on the Margins.
- My quilt was taken to the Eventide Nursing Home in Fargo. It was so special what Nancy did to be able to give away all those quilts!
- The quilts were given to the Women's Care Center in Fargo for moms and babies.
- I kept the quilt and use it; it was a welcome addition to the rest of my bedding to provide warmth & comfort over the winter.
- 2 baby quilts were taken to the Grand Forks Women's Pregnancy Center.
- The 2 quilts that I received; one a CDA sister that could not attend asked me if I had an extra quilt and so I gifted one to her and the other is on my bed to enjoy every night. Again, I say thank you for the gift!
- Mine went to Fraser to help the at-risk youth who are housed while getting their lives back on track.
- I gave one of mine to my granddaughter and I kept one for my bed.
- I took mine to the nursing home where they were very much appreciated.
- I gave mine to my home bound elderly aunt who greatly appreciated it.
- I gave mine to my 8-year old granddaughter whose parents were recently divorced.
- The quilts I took with me were delivered to the Domestic Violence Center in Dickinson.

#170 Court Saint Elizabeth, Minot - 110th Anniversary Established March 17, 1912

The Catholic Daughters of the Americas, Court Saint Elizabeth, #170, held its 110th Anniversary dinner on March 19, 2022. This court is over 100 years old and is the first established CDA court in the state of North Dakota. This includes women from the four Catholic Parishes in Minot, ND and the surrounding areas, always welcoming new members to join. The celebration was held at Our Lady of Grace Catholic Church. 
