Kerry's Korner

Definition of *psalm*. : a sacred song or poem used in worship; especially: one of the biblical hymns collected in the Book of *Psalms*.

Earlier this year, we had set up a special time in the worship service for individuals of the congregation to share their "testimonies" with the rest of the congregation. It was a wonderful time of insight and inspiration that I would like to have in the worship service again.

Recently, a member of the congregation came to me with an idea that really got me excited and I think it would make a wonderful addition to our worship service. This individual draws a lot of wisdom and inspiration from reading the Psalms of the Old Testament. His suggestion was to offer members of the congregation an opportunity to write their own Psalms that they can share with the congregation. We could call it: **Psalms of Burton**. I would like to launch this during our October worship services. This gives members of the congregation a month to prepare if they want to participate.

To help get those creative juices flowing, I thought I would share some basic information on the book of Psalms.

The book of Psalms contains 150 poems meant to be heard out loud and maybe set to music as part of a religious service. Traditionally, they were thought to have been written by David, but modern scholars tend to think that they were composed by many different individuals over the course of many years.

Psalms of praise generally focus on the nature of God and not on specific things He has done. They tell about God's attributes and encourage the believer to praise Him for his goodness, righteousness, judgement, and wisdom. They often refer to playing music, or singing and rejoicing.

Psalms of wisdom contain teachings and wise advice that are similar to the book of Proverbs, but in the form of a psalm. In studying the Psalms, we must remember that they were originally intended to be heard aloud. These general principles are meant to instruct believers on how to live a Godly life.

Royal Psalms express the belief that God does His will and good works through the authority of a king. Sometimes, royal Psalms celebrate the coronation or good works of an earthly king. Other Psalms compare God to an earthly king and even point to the coming of God's son, Jesus.

Psalms of thanksgiving offer the believer's praise and thanksgiving for what God has done for him or

her. Sometimes this is a specific good that God has granted, but sometimes thanksgiving for God's goodness in general.

Psalms of lament respond to a crisis, grief, or despair. They are intended to move a believer from hurt to joy. This type of Psalm expresses that God is present even when human beings cannot discern His presence in the world due to their own sufferings.

If you have a personal Psalm that you would like to share, pleased contact the church anytime during the week, or see Pastor Kerry Foote before or after the worship service.

Monroe County Fire Rescue Department will be providing *free blood* pressure checks in the Fellowship Center after the 10:30 am service.






<u>CDC News – Ms. Blue Educator of the Year</u>

Food Pantry Assistant Position Opening

BMUMC is seeking help from an individual in overseeing our Daily Bread Food Pantry operations. This is a paid part-time position (\$10.00/hour; approximately 50 hours/month) and the person who fills it will work closely with the church's Administrative Assistant and the Food Pantry Volunteers to ensure that the operation runs smoothly and operates in an accountable manner.



Key responsibilities of this position include:

- Coordinate volunteer workers to ensure that the Food Pantry is staffed during all hours it is open and also during regular major food delivery times. The Food Pantry/Delivery schedule is as follows:
 - Monday and Wednesday; 9:00 am noon.
 - \circ Tuesday and Thursday; 5:00 pm 7:00 pm.
 - Thursday; Food Delivery only 10:00 am noon.
- Work with volunteers to ensure that:
 - Measurable activities are logged onto the proper forms [volunteer daily work hours, client signin sheets, new client cards (with appropriate identification checked), daily shopping lists, receipts of food with weights and type of food noted].
 - Food received from Feeding South Florida, Publix, Winn Dixie, Star of the Sea (SOS)
 Farmshare, and other sources is sorted and stored properly.
 - Food Pantry shelves are continuously restocked.
 - Boxes are broken down and trash taken to the dumpster each day.
- Coordinate activities and reporting as required with God's Kitchen staff.

The person that fills this position should have good interpersonal skills, enabling them to work with a variety of groups and individuals, and be able to use a computer well enough to enter data tracking Food Pantry operations.

All applicants should apply by submitting a resume to the church office in person Monday through Thursday from 9:00 am – 4:00 pm, or by emailing bae_bmumc@att.net, or by sending a fax to 305-852-4917. The Staff Parish Relations Committee will conduct interviews and make the final selection. *The deadline for applications to be received by the church office is noon on September 7, 2017.* For additional information contact the church office at 305-852-2581.
