


In our prayers this month we've been asked to handle:

In a visit in the past, another woman and I had talked about this same issue and we had read together the sentence in Science and Health (page 102) that says: "The pointing of the needle to the pole symbolizes this allembracing power or attraction of God, divine Mind." She had asked me why that sentence didn't argue for two poles, two minds, bi-polar. I pointed out that the needle points only to the north—one "attraction of God", one "all-embracing power".
