Dressage Judge Activities Update

Hello Everyone,

I trust everyone has enjoyed the Christmas Break and also wishing you a Happy New Year.

Firstly, a big welcome to two new "G" level Dressage Judges, Wendy Muircroft and Ann Dodd. Great work done by both to become accredited Judges.

2022 has brought with it the new edition of Dressage Rules. The marked version is available at the EA website:

<https://www.equestrian.org.au/officials/dressage>

A summary of the general Rule changes is also available on the EA website.

All Judges should have received advice from EA EADC about the new system for technical faults – no longer 2.0 penalties but 0.5% from each Judge's score subtracted from the final percent, for each penalty. More clarity is available on the EA website.

The other important news is that March 2022 is the time when we all submit our Re-accreditation Summary. The form is available at <https://www.equestrian.org.au/officials/dressage>.

It is very easy to fill out electronically or you can print if you prefer, scan to send to Lee Howells. The ORBT for this will be released in early March. Please don't try and look on the website now, it's not there! Also, for new Judges, this is based on your time as a Judge being shorter.

The current DSA Club Calendar of Events for those planning their dates for judging and any upgrade opportunities has now been published and also the current EA National Calendar of Dressage Events.

I had previously given you the proposed dates for Seminars in 2022 and now have some more detail below. As you can imagine, due to the recent increase in COVID cases and the flow on effects, it has been difficult to secure an Interstate presenter for the A / B / C & YH Seminar, so the presenter has not yet been finalized. The venue is booked for Cromwell Park.

Please see below the amendments to the EA Dressage Rules which support the change to the marking of technical faults in EA tests as approved by the EA Board as of 1 January 2022

Rule 3.7 Entering the arena

3.7.f) failure to enter the arena within 45 seconds of the bell being sounded will entail ~~a penalty of 2 points~~ **a technical fault of 0.5%**

3.7.g) entering the arena at A before the bell signal has been given may entail ~~a penalty of 2 points~~ **technical fault of 0.5% per from each judge**

3.7.j)Failure to salute will entail ~~a 2-point penalty~~ **technical fault of 0.5%** from each judge

3.17 Penalties Technical Faults and Errors of Course

Technical faults and will incur a 0.5% deduction from the final percentage mark as per Annex E. **The deduction is from each judge and** all judges must have the same number of penalties recorded.

3.17.1 Other errors-technical faults with penalties

All of the following are considered ~~errors~~ **technical faults and 0.5%** will be deducted for each one, but they are not cumulative and will not result in elimination (including for Freestyle test)

SECTION 5 DRESS, SADDLERY AND EQUIPMENT

5.1 Compulsory dress by level and ~~penalties~~ **technical faults** for incorrect dress and equipment.

5.6 Whips

In FEI level competitions.....

- circling the arena carrying a whip will incur ~~a penalty of 2 points~~ **a technical fault of 0.5%** from each judge
- Entering the dressage arena with a whip will incur ~~a penalty of 2 points~~ **a technical fault of 0.5%** from each judge

5.12 Table of equipment permitted/not permitted

Column 1, row 7

Boots, bell boots and bandages ~~Penalties are cumulative~~

Column 3, row 7

- ~~2 pts~~ **0.5%** from each judge if worn in the space around the arena
- ~~2 pts~~ **0.5%** from each judge if worn in the arena

Last row, column 3

In FEI level competitions at Australian & State Championships

- **-2-0.5% deduction from each per judge** if carried circling arena in events where not permitted

- **-2-0.5% deduction from each per judge** if carried in the arena elimination if carried in test for more than 3 movements

5.17 Protective coverings/Boots/Bandages

5.17 a)~~Penalties~~ **Technical faults** are outlined on rule 5.12

7.6 Allocation of marks and scoring

d) these marks are then added together and any ~~penalty marks~~ **errors of course** are deducted.

e) it is essential that ~~penalty marks~~ **errors of course** are deducted from each individual score before it is totalled. **Individual scores are converted to % scores, and technical faults are then deducted**

SECTION 8 FREESTYLES

8.1 k) if the test is clearly shorter or longer than the stipulated time limit on the test sheet, ~~a penalty of 2 points~~ **technical fault of 0.5% deduction** from each judge will be incurred from the total of the artistic marks

SECTION 9 YOUNG HORSE and YOUNG PONY

9.1 t) If a horse leaves the arena with all four feet during a 4- year old state qualifying competition, this will not entail elimination but will incur ~~a 2-point penalty~~ **technical fault of 0.5%**, to be deducted

9.1.2 Dress and Saddlery

9.1.2f) a whip is not permitted to be carried in the 5,6,7 year old competition arena at the State and Australian Championships. A whip must be dropped before entering the space around the arena or the rider will entail ~~a penalty of 2 points from the total score out of 100 prior to conversion to a percentage~~ **technical fault of - 0.5% deducted from the final percentage.**

Annex G 8.2.1 Scorers must:

- double the mark where a coefficient is indicated
- add the marks in the total column
- deduct the errors of course
- convert the score to a % and deduct any technical faults and penalties from each judge from the total percentage**
- calculate the overall percentage by adding the percentages of scores of all the judges and dividing by the number of judges. the total by the total marks possible. For example, if 3 judges scored 350, 345 and 349 the total = 1044. Total possible marks for the test was 400. Multiply this number (400) by the number of judges (400 x 3) = 1200. Percentage = 1044 ÷ 1200 x 100% = 87%**

G 8.2.2 Allocation of marks and scoring

"A minimum of one score must be from a SA HOTY competition, the second can either be from a SA HOTY competition or from the same qualifying classes at a CDI competition"
- ⇒ Minimum % to qualify for each submitted test:
Advanced 64%
Small Tour 61%
Medium & Big Tour 60%

DSA State Young Horse and Pony Classic

DSA will once again be hosting a Young Horse Championship Event on Feb 13. It will be fabulous to see the South Australian young horses and ponies out and competing in a two round Championship event.

We have been very fortunate to have secured two Interstate Judges for the event. Maria Schwennesen is an extremely accomplished Judge, being an FEI 5* and YH Judge as well as an EA YH and A level Judge. Our second Judge, Suzan McDermott from Tasmania is also an EA YH and A level Judge.

While the Judges are here, we will be taking the opportunity for our Squads to have some one-on-one time with the Judges to work on movements and test riding.

From EADC

From 1/7/22 all Dressage riders will need to have their helmets tagged. DSA will be offering tagging times at the State Championships and we are facilitating the regional Clubs to get approved taggers in their areas.

There has also been a change to the amount deducted for Technical Faults, which used to be known as Penalties (Annex E of the Rulebook) from 2 points to 0.5%. The EADC believe this is much fairer for a mistake which does not impact on the actual judging of the performance.

Once again, I have been given the honour by Dressage SA to write about another dear friend of mine, Mrs Erica Taylor and her wonderful thoroughbred Dressage stallion, Crown Law.

Erica is undoubtedly South Australia's most successful AOR (Amateur Owner Rider) Dressage rider. She had outstanding success in National competitions up to and including Grand Prix and represented Australia at both the Olympics and the World Dressage Championships. The term AOR is a relatively new one in Dressage circles, but I use it to describe Erica to reflect the fact that she was purely a non-professional in sporting terms and owned and trained all her own horses. This status and what it involves makes the account of her Dressage journey and her subsequent success even more remarkable.

This is her story:

When you meet Erica and get to know her well, so many personal descriptions spring to mind. Humbleness, high intelligence, a great animal lover, perceptive, determined, kindness, humility, open mindedness and very, very wise. These personal qualities made me think that they must have had a huge influence on her ability as a horse trainer and Dressage rider, when wealth, status and privilege were never part of the equation. Many of her qualities were developed from an early age through hard work and perseverance and a variety of life experiences.

Where it all began

Horses have been a part of Erica's life from a very early age. She rode a pony to school and worked on her father's farm and trotting stables in the Southern Flinders Ranges after she left school. Early on in our chat, Erica starts to talk about a 'feel' when riding horses and believes it is a natural ability you are born with and is so important when training them. As I soon discovered, Erica is far keener to talk about the training and her understanding of horses than her life history - but I digress.

While working on the farm, Erica helped her father by driving his trotters and there, she believes, she initially started to develop a feel for the way a horse should perform. Her next big step was to own a pacing bred horse which she coerced her father into giving her. This fabulous chestnut, 'Silverado', was a star himself and Erica proudly divulged that he won the 'Olympic' Show Jumping at Jamestown Show. They also competed in novelties and hacking at all the local Shows – "he did everything and was definitely a one in a million horse". More importantly, Erica's early riding experiences were not Dressage orientated but her diversity would inevitably lead to the future development of her great seat and balance when she rode a Dressage test.

A Country and Western Singing Career

Another feature of Erica's riding was the fact that she always rode in such rhythm and harmony with her horses. Obviously, she did have a natural ability, but away from horses, Erica was a very talented Country and Western singer. One does think that there must be a link somewhere in this part of her story.

She began singing at school and eventually purchased a guitar so that she could follow her passion for 'Hillbilly Music', the term used for Country and Western in those days. As Ricky Jones, Erica went on to win Australia's Amateur Hour (the Australia's Got Talent equivalent) and performed in many concerts around Adelaide and on Radio 5AD on Saturday mornings. There were no rehearsals for these gigs – she just did what came naturally with no formal voice training. Her next accolade was to successfully audition in Sydney and she was one of the first Australian artists to be signed up by the Phillips Company. She also made a few records under the Festival label and continued to do gigs all over South Australia. Erica loved to sing and perform and felt very comfortable being on stage in front of an audience.



One can't help thinking that her time as a well-known singer and performer set the scene for her future life as a Dressage rider – the Olympic level Tests being the embodiment of top level Dressage 'performances'.

A move from the country

Erica moved to Adelaide in her late twenties and brought with her Beau Rae, her first Dressage horse. She had never heard of Dressage before her move but soon her interest was captured after she met the famous Tom Roberts. 'Robbie', as he was affectionately known, gave her wonderful direction in horse psychology, general horsemanship and the understanding of horse behaviour. Her love of Dressage started to develop. At the same time, however, she still competed in point to points and hunted on her other horse Autumn Vale. I believe that bravery and courage are more descriptions that can be associated with Erica and her life.

After marrying Les Taylor, they moved to Waterloo Corner in 1967 where Erica still lives with her gorgeous cats Bridgette, the Bengal cross and Velcro, the very lucky rescue cat and her much loved garden. She sadly lost Les in 2013 after nursing him through a long period of ill health. Les was such a support to Erica both at home and at competitions and over the years, made an enormous contribution to Equestrian Sports in South Australia.

Her next competition horse was the lovely Crown Prince with whom she won several National Championships including a Gold Medal in Perth. Her career as a Dressage rider was really starting to get on track.

William Arrives

However, it was with the arrival of William (Crown Law) into the Taylor family that Erica's life was about to seriously change. William's dam was given to them as part payment for a float acquired from Les's float building business and she happened to be in foal. William, being full thoroughbred, was actually bred to race however, from the very beginning, with his elastic, cadenced movement and superb temperament, a career in racing was never going to happen with Erica as his owner.

When she first rode him, he was very quiet but quite sensitive and jumpy. They 'pottered around' for a couple of years, instilling their legendary rhythm and relaxation into their early

training regime. He found everything easy, had natural suppleness and balance and very good paces.

This is where the story becomes really fascinating. Erica did not aim for any World Championship event or the Olympics (actually, it had never crossed her mind, she modestly told me). She loved the training and kept gradually going up the levels and training scale in a progressive way following the requirements of each of the Dressage tests.

So here is a person who quietly trained at home with no Coach or Trainer, no sponsorships and no Dressage arena or markers!!! Crown Law was educated in an open



paddock (it was kikuyu) which was a "nice surface but could be a bit hard or muddy at times". Erica says that she really had no need for more formal arrangements. "If the horse is on the bit and in balance you can put your horse anywhere in one step with balance and control".

William was completely in harmony with Erica at all times with not a hint of stiffness "Your horse should be mentally with you for the whole test and it is the rider's job to hold his hand". Erica never rode through a Grand Prix test at home before her trip to Canada in 1986 and had only ridden 3 competitive Grand Prix tests, in total, before that event – but again I digress.

While Tom Roberts initiated Erica's interest in Dressage training, it was Dr Wolfgang Holzel (National Dressage Coach at the time) who seriously guided them to success at Grand Prix level. William was already training at Grand Prix when Dr Holzel came on the scene in Australia, but he was able to successfully explain to Erica the importance of the strength and suppleness of the back and trained with the use of gymnastic exercises to improve the horse's physique and carrying capacity.

The Long Road (literally thousands of kilometres) to Canada

At the time (mid-eighties), no Grand Prix tests were ever held in South Australia, so Erica, Les and William had to travel vast distances to Melbourne, Perth and Queensland to gain the necessary qualifications for International Competition. In 1986, the pair were chosen to represent Australia at the World Dressage Championships in Toronto, Canada. Travelling to Canada was a lengthy process in itself, with



the journey taking a total of 5 days with numerous stops on the way. It was a testament to William's superb temperament that he arrived at the venue in great spirits and looking magnificent.

Their performance in Toronto, under the watchful eye of Dr Holzel, was superb and earned them a 17th place in the World. This result unfortunately left them just two places short of the opportunity to compete in the Grand Prix Special. She was given a 9th place by the Russian Judge which was a great thrill. Of interest is the fact that these Championships were the first to offer the KUR (Freestyle event) in their programme. It was held as a consolation event for those riders who didn't qualify for the Special. It certainly had no influence on the outcome of the World Championship competition! Erica was not informed, by the powers that be, of the possibility of competing in the Freestyle at the Games so did not have one prepared. This was certainly one of the disadvantages of coming from literally a 'backwater' in the Dressage world – they were not quite 'in the loop'. Nevertheless, they thoroughly enjoyed this competition experience. It was a well-organized event with a great atmosphere and wonderful hospitality provided by the Canadian organizing Committee.

More bad news came after the event. Erica and Les were told that their beautiful stallion could

not return immediately to Australia and William must spend a long period on an agistment property until he could be granted re-entry status by Australian authorities. The poor fellow had to endure a very cold winter at Windways, where fortunately he was treated like a king, before entering quarantine after 7 months there. This final month-long experience was very tough on him but in true thoroughbred fashion, he was completely resilient to the whole ordeal. A very thin and shaggy Crown Law arrived at Sydney Airport 8 months after the Championships on a very hot day there. After another 2 weeks quarantine, he finally arrived back in Adelaide on a truck to be greeted at his home (at midnight) by his very relieved and quite distraught owners. Certainly, travelling horses in those days was quite an experience for all concerned, but fortunately they all recovered very quickly and were soon getting ready for their next adventure.

Maybe the Olympics next?

So, after a bit of R & R back at Waterloo Corner and with William back on track with his Grand Prix work, Erica made the decision to attempt to qualify for the Olympics in Seoul. No pressure in training and definitely a 'see what happens' mindset was the reality of their Olympic preparation. With still no Grand Prix tests being held in South Australia, off to



Queensland Nationals they went to qualify for Seoul (another 4,000 km!!) and after more success up north they were chosen to compete at the 1988 Olympics!

Seoul, by comparison to Toronto, was quite a different experience for the Crown Law Team. Memories that have stuck in Erica's mind include marching in the Opening Ceremony in a drizabone on a 35 degree very humid day (I don't think the Aussies won any Best Dressed Awards that year), the lack of

camaraderie between all the Dressage riders and it being rather a lonely experience. There was no Australian Dressage Team as Erica was a sole competitor and after Canada, her experience could be described as rather underwhelming. The equestrian facilities were excellent but there weren't many spectators for the Dressage. In fact, the main attendees were 'rent a crowd' groups that cheered the horses as they came down the centre line at the **beginning** of the tests – a little unnerving for the competitors, to say the least.

The performance of Erica and William was again of great quality, but sadly their scores did not reflect this in Seoul. There was considerable dissent amongst some of the top riders who felt that the Australian combination was marked very unfairly. It was gratifying for Erica to be acknowledged by her peers and in particular, both Robert Dover and Kyra Kirkland were very supportive after the scores were posted. The Showjumping guru, George Morris also was quite vocal about the scoring and was furious that the Judges had not rewarded the pair in a more generous fashion. On an interesting note, they did beat an up-and-coming Anky Van Grunsven and the rest is history with that particular rider!!

This was William's last dressage event – he was officially retired when he came back to Australia.

A remarkable career in Dressage

All in all, the Olympic experience was a great achievement for the pair. Erica was only the second person to ever represent Australia in Dressage and the only South Australian to do so. In her career, she won 20 Australian Championships at various levels on 5 different horses including 3 Haig Cups (Prix St Georges



level) on William. They were all horses that she had owned and trained herself and this indeed was a remarkable achievement for an Amateur.

Her final words on Crown Law describe him as "such a sweet natured horse with a very special temperament". He never put a foot wrong, was never ridden at home with a whip or with spurs and was another 'one in a million horse'. Even as a breeding stallion, he was always well behaved – a true gentlemen and superb ambassador for the thoroughbred breed.

Outside of competition, until her retirement, Erica was a Judge, Mentor and Selector and spent many years on the Dressage SA Committee. She was the first recipient of the Lindy Wright Memorial Foundation Award as a 'Quiet Achiever promoting excellence in Dressage in South Australia'. A perfect choice.



Thoughts on Training

When chatting to Erica, it is the discussions about training that really animate her. Here are a few of her training insights that will enlighten you all, I am sure.

Horses must be happy in their work - "My horses apparently always looked happy".

It is so important to build a strong long-term partnership with your horse

Most horses want to please us, but we must be smart enough to correctly tell them what we want them to do.

Try different approaches in training to achieve an end result. Trial and error was a key part of Erica's training. She would read a test then work out in her own mind what she needed to do to ride it correctly and fulfill all the requirements that were set out for the Judges to assess.

Tests are a guide to the training but don't go up the levels too early. Erica never went out to compete until the horses was ready at a level. She would 'play around' with movements above their level at home to avoid putting too much pressure on her horse so he always remained happy and confident.

"It takes as long as it takes to train a horse to Grand Prix". Some horses are quick learners, some are not. Some may not be physically capable of doing the higher level work. If the horse is forced

or the progress is too quick, you end up with a tense and unhappy horse.

Erica stresses the importance of the outside rein influence. She learnt this in one particular lesson with the famous Hubert Eichinger from the Spanish Riding School. She believes that if you learn one good thing from a lesson with a trainer, then the lesson has been worthwhile.

If a horse is correctly on the aids and in balance, you can put him anywhere you want, in one stride.

Natural feel is so important when riding a horse – listen to him at all times.

If problems arise, try and get help. Don't keep repeating mistakes in your training.

Use the KISS system – don't over complicate things.

And finally – "Spend time thinking how to get through to your horse's mind – DRESSAGE IS A BRAIN, NOT A BRAWN, SPORT".

Erica has now retired from most of her involvement with Dressage but certainly still enjoys occasionally helping a few riders with the training of their horses and is an avid fan of horse racing on tracks all over the world.

I do thank Erica for the wonderful opportunity to chat to her about her life and involvement with our sport. She is a true inspiration to riders of all levels and to be able to share her story and words of wisdom with the Dressage Community in SA has been an absolute privilege. If we follow your advice, our wonderful horses will be so appreciative of our efforts to create the harmony, rhythm and relaxation that you always displayed when you rode yours.



Perfect Dancer BHI - otherwise known as Perfect Pete has had a super year!


He qualified easily in 2020 for DJWTS but unfortunately due to COVID it was cancelled.

President's Report

Happy New Year to everyone.

Our AGM was held on 21 January 2022 at the Club grounds and sadly only the previous Committee members and Bernie Biggs attended. Therefore the same Committee members were once again re-elected.

This report will be a short summary of last year's events as described in the AGM Report.

January 2021 was cancelled due to extreme heat which was such a shame, as we would have had six arenas running.

Then there was the Cherry Gardens Fire devastation! Fortunately our Grounds provided a safety refuge for many horses and owners.

AHDC arranged and paid for the vertidrainage of the grounds in May and then fertilizing to improve the riding surface.

Unfortunately there was a delay in the renewal of the water allocation lease so watering couldn't go ahead in November / December when it was needed the most. The Application has now been approved and watering has re-commenced. The green has returned!!!

We purchased three new sets of arena letters which can be pegged down in windy conditions. This is for safety reasons as well as looking more attractive. We now have a total of five new sets.

Along with the Showjumping and Soccer Clubs, AHDC paid a share towards the safety fence dividing the Soccer fields and the Equestrian grounds.

Several rules need to be clarified for competitors to fully understand (they are also posted on our website):

1. The Points allocation for the Members Only HOTY, POTY, & YOTY Awards excludes the Spring Festival, the Combined Training comp in February and the Protocol (Saturday event) in April. Presentations will be made at the November Competition.
2. Lunging on the grounds is NOT PERMITTED in the competition area (as per the EA Dressage Rules), in close proximity of arenas or in the arenas even during an "arena practice" session. This is for the safety of all riders on the grounds.

We offered new classes in late 2021 — "arena practice sessions" - the opportunity to have a 20 minute timeslot to introduce your horse to riding in an arena (for horses not entered in competition classes on that day). These classes are for practice only and are not judged.

We are in the process of changing accounts from the Commonwealth Bank to Bank SA and setting up internet banking.

Thank you to the Committee members for their continued hard work and time spent running the competitions throughout the past years. Thank you also to Bernie for his many years of service on the PA and Pauline for computing the test results.

Best wishes to all our competitors and members. Don't forget Memberships are now due for renewal. Keep well and stay safe in 2022.

From The Committee


We hope everyone had an enjoyable festive season and you are all ready and enthused for a new year of riding and competing.




