FORMED TO BE IMPERISHABLE

(Wis. 1:13-15; 2:23-24; Ps 30:2, 4, 5-6, 11-13; 2Cor. 8:7,9,13-15; Mark 4: 35-41)

"God did not make death, nor does He rejoice in the destruction of the living...For He fashioned all things that they might have being...For God formed man to be imperishable; the image of His own nature He made him."

If the above statement is true, why then do we have all the evils in the world? Why the various diseases? Why do our loved ones die? The truth of the matter is that it is "...by the envy of the devil, (that) death entered the world, and they who belong to his company experience it" (Wis. 1:13; 2:24). In the Book of Genesis God created the world and "saw that it was good." But Adam and Eve, by falling into the Devil's temptation brought pain and death into the world. Thus, St. Paul, writing to the Romans says, "...sin entered the world through one man...through sin, death, and later on death spread to all mankind, because all sinned" (Rom. 5:12).

A portion of the Book of Wisdom we read today as our first reading, was written about 100 B.C. to counter the adverse effects that the Greek philosophy was having on Jewish theology. The Greek philosophers had argued against the belief that God is All-Good: How could God be good, given the existence of evil suffering and death in the world? In defense of the theology of God's existence and His goodness, the writer of the Book of Wisdom wants you and me to know that the evil in the world is not caused by God, but rather by man's pride and disobedience.

Surely, you and I do suffer the effects of sin and death - we get sick - we feel for our loved ones who are terminally ill - we witness pain and sufferings when we visit hospitals and/or homes. We all love life, thus, it is quite painful to see a loved one dying. It is much more painful, when it is a young person who is dying or who has died. It can be heart breaking for a parent to lose a child through death. In today's gospel we see a parent (one of the synagogue officials, Jairus) approaching Jesus and pleading with Him saying, "My daughter is at the point of death. Please, come and lay Your hands on her that she may get well and live." God did not make death, but He formed you and me to be imperishable, thus, Jesus says to him, "Do not be afraid; just have faith...The child is not dead but asleep."

Jesus' word is true, because for those who believe, "death (of the body) is not the end." God made us "to be imperishable" when we have eternal life with Him in Heaven. Unfortunately, like the woman in the gospel who suffered hemorrhages for twelve years, you may have been suffering from an incurable sickness for many years - you may have been suffering from the ill effects of a drug or alcohol addiction. It may be that your loved one is experiencing excruciating pain or is on a respirator. Possibly, you are so depressed that life seems meaningless to you, and you may have even considered suicide or homicide. These are the effects of sin and death, but you must remember, "God did not create death, but formed (you) to be imperishable." Therefore, like the synagogue official and the hemorrhaging woman, bring your troubles to Jesus in faith and truthfully say to yourself, "If I but touch His clothes, I shall be cured." Believe, and hear Him speak tenderly to you: "Do not be afraid; just have faith...My child, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction."


