





# **Please see GUIDELINES below!**

- The Vigil Mass. 5:00pm & the Sunday 10:00am Masses will take place in the parish social hall. The Sunday 8:00am Mass will be outside in front of the church. Please bring a chair if attending the 8:00am Mass.
  - $\circ$  (No access to the church proper at this time.)
- The social hall door will be unlocked 30 minutes before Mass.
  - (The social hall door will be the only point of entry for Mass.)
- Readings & Mass parts will be on the big screen.
  - (No hymnals, bulletins, booklets or any such items will be distributed)
- Please bring your facemask.
- Windows will be open for ventilation.
- Social distancing-- 6 feet apart. Limited seating will be available.
  - (Chairs are set up accordingly.)
- There will be no offertory procession.
  - (The priest alone will handle the vessels for Mass.)
- There will be no sacristans, altar servers or Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion.
- As you enter the social hall, there is a box for you to insert your offertory contributions.
- Reception of Communion will be done after Mass.
- The worship space will be sanitized after each Mass.

## Claims Notice for Victims of Sexual Abuse and Others with Claims Against the Roman Catholic Diocese of Harrisburg

If you were sexually abused by any person connected with the Roman Catholic Diocese of Harrisburg, a Roman Catholic parish or Roman Catholic school within the geographical area of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Harrisburg, or have any claim against the Roman Catholic Diocese of Harrisburg, you must file a claim by November 13, 2020.

#### Four Ways to Leave A Legacy

Did you know there are four easy ways for you to remember your parish in your will?

- 1. A Specific Bequest You can designate a certain amount of cash or specific assets to the parish.
- 2. A Residual Bequest You can plan for the parish to receive all or a portion of your estate after other specific bequests have been distributed.
- 3. A Percentage Bequest You can designate a certain percentage of the estate to go to the parish.
- 4. A Contingent Bequest You can make the parish the recipient of a bequest if others named in your will are not living at the time of your death.

No matter how you decide to remember your parish, a gift from your will accomplishes several key benefits.

- It sends a strong message to your heirs that the Church played an important role in your life.
- It guarantees that your generosity to the Church will be continued even after you are gone.
- It provides important assistance to our parish.
- It may even provide tax benefits for your heirs.

They will be able to guide you in the most appropriate manner for you to remember your parish in your will while also providing for other beneficiaries and charities that are important to you.
