- Park in well lit areas during night parades & place all valuable items in the trunk of your car.

- Designate a specific meeting place for family members in the event you are separated.
- Do not throw anything at parade participant (float riders, band members, etc.)
- Expect traffic delays before and after the parade.
- Be courteous.
