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# **TSA Settles Breast Milk Lawsuit**

Los Angeles, CA. In a monumental victory for mothers traveling with breast milk, the United States Transportation Security Administration settled the highly publicized lawsuit brought by Stacey Armato, a breastfeeding mother who was harassed by TSA Officers at the Phoenix Airport when she requested her breast milk not be x-rayed.

In resolving the lawsuit, the TSA has again apologized to Mrs. Armato for the incident. More importantly for breastfeeding mothers traveling throughout the United States, the TSA has agreed to clarify its internal procedures for screening breast milk, update its public website to better guide breastfeeding mothers traveling with breast milk and train its screening officers on the new policies. The TSA also removed the embarrassing glass holding cages from the Phoenix airport shortly after the incident.

"We brought this lawsuit for one reason - to bring clarity and policy change for breastfeeding mothers traveling with breast milk" says Plaintiff Stacey Armato. "Hopefully what I experienced at the Phoenix Airport in 2010 will never happen to another mother traveling with her breast milk."

The lawsuit, Stacey Armato v. The United States of America, was filed in the District Court of Arizona in 2012, case number CV-11-2462-PHX-ROS. The lawsuit alleged that on January 25, 2010, TSA Officers harassed Mrs. Armato when she requested her breast milk not be x-rayed but instead undergo secondary screening per the TSA's breast milk policy. Incredibly, Mrs. Armato, who travels weekly from Los Angeles to Phoenix for work, was held by the TSA for over 40 minutes while they "researched" their own policy and urged Mrs. Armato to simply dump her breast milk.

Following the January 25, 2010 incident, Mrs. Armato lodged a complaint through the TSA website concerning her treatment. In response, she was told by the TSA to print out a copy of the TSA breast milk guidelines from its website and to hand it to the TSA screening officers the next time she flew.

The following week when Mrs. Armato was traveling home to Los Angeles from Phoenix with her breast milk, the same TSA Officers were at the checkpoint. They not only refused to allow Mrs. Armato to show them the TSA breast milk guidelines, they harassed her for an hour, placed her in a glass enclosure, called the Phoenix police, patted her down, screened her personal belongings multiple times, and finally refused to screen her breast milk claiming the bottles were "too full." After almost 40 minutes, the officers finally allowed Mrs. Armato to show them their own policy printed off their website. They finally capitulated; however before they would perform the alternate screening of Mrs. Armato's breast milk, they required Mrs. Armato to go back out of the screening area and pour her breast milk into multiple bottles. They then forced her to go through the entire screening process again - x-ray, metal detector, full body pat down and finally alternate screening of her breast milk. They harassed her for more than an hour, causing her to miss her flight.

"I am so incredibly proud of Stacey Armato" said her lawyer, Robert Mosier of Sanders Viener Grossman in Los Angeles. "To stand up like she did and take on the TSA so breastfeeding mothers would have a voice and be free from harassment took real guts and fortitude. Stacey stood up for what she believed, made the government listen and change its policies - it is a true David vs. Goliath story. It has been a difficult journey for her for well over two years."

According to Mrs. Armato, this never would have happened had she not found her attorney, Robert (Rob) Mosier. "Most attorneys I spoke with wouldn't touch a case against the United States of America, but Rob never once wavered. For more than two years, he battled and bloodied the United States and the four law firms it hired to defend this case. He is a true champion that was determined to make difference, for me and breastfeeding mothers everywhere."

# ADA Provides Correction for Standards of Medical Care in Diabetes 2014

The American Diabetes Association has published a Erratum stating they published incorrect information in their 2014 Suppl. 1 edition of the Standards of Care for Diabetes. The statement below is what appears on their website.

In the print version of the articles listed above, the plasma glucose value in SI units (mmol/L) is not correct in Table 6 ("Standards of Medical Care in Diabetes 2014"; p. S19)and Table 4("Diagnosis and Classification of DiabetesMellitus";p.S89) in the sentence "If the plasma glucose level measured 1 h after the load is 140 mg/dL (10.0 mmol/L), proceed to 100-g OGTT (Step 2). "The correct value is 7.8 mmol/L rather than 10.0 mmol/L.

In the same tables, the sentence "The diagnosis of GDM is made when the plasma glucose level measured 3 h after the test is 140 mg/dL (7.8 mmol/L)" is incorrect.

The corrected sentence is as follows: The diagnosis of GDM is made when at least two of the following four plasma glucose levels (measured fasting, 1 h, 2 h, 3 h after the OGTT) are met or exceeded: Also, the footnote to these tables indicates that ACOG recommends a lower threshold of 135 mg/dL (7.5 mmol/L) in high-risk groups; some experts also recommend 130 mg/dL (7.2 mmol/L)."

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# **ICD-10 Compliance Date**

A Provider eNews - Special Edition was released by the Medicare Learning Network (MLN Connect), on Friday 2, 2014, that provided an update on ICD-10 Compliance Date. Below is a copy of that eNews notice.

### ICD-10 Compliance Date

On April 1, 2014, the Protecting Access to Medicare Act of 2014 (PAMA) (Pub. L. No. 113-93) was enacted, which said that the Secretary may not adopt ICD-10 prior to October 1, 2015. Accordingly, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services expects to release an interim final rule in the near future that will include a new compliance date that would require the use of ICD-10 beginning October 1, 2015. The rule will also require HIPAA covered entities to continue to use ICD-9-CM through September 30, 2015.

July ICD-10 End-to-End Testing Canceled: Additional Testing Planned for 2015

CMS planned to conduct ICD-10 testing during the week of July 21 through 25, 2014, to give a sample group of providers the opportunity to participate in end-to-end testing with Medicare Administrative Contractors (MACs) and the Common Electronic Data Interchange (CEDI) contractor. The July testing has been canceled due to the ICD-10 implementation delay. Additional opportunities for end-to-end testing will be available in 2015.

Emphasis will be placed on practical application of evidencebased topics and implementation of a variety of risk management strategies in an effort to improve pregnancy and long-term outcomes for mothers and their families.
