

Good Afternoon.

My name is Shannon Brumfield and I am a TCO Supervisor with the Missouri City Police and Fire Department. As you might be aware, our region and many others have experienced damaging weather and severe flooding. I am writing because one of our own has been affected by this.

Angelica has been with the agency for the past 8 years and is a dedicated employee. She informed me late yesterday afternoon that the bayou behind her house flooded within a short amount of time, forcing her and her family out of the residence. Angelica is a single mother of a beautiful 10 month old baby girl who lives at home with her family. She was only able to grab a few of the baby's necessities (such as milk, diapers, and a few clothing items) and nothing for herself; her family was also only able to grab a few items before everyone has to escape through the windows in the house.

Later in the day she tried going back to the residence to see if anything was salvageable but the area had been blocked off by the local fire department that was still trying to do search and rescue efforts. At this point, the extent of the damage is unknown because rain continues to fall which leaves them unable to even get near the house to check.

Angelica and her family are currently staying in a hotel but have little to no necessities with them. Any help would be greatly appreciated by Angelica, her family, and the her Missouri City Family. Thank you.
