The wrist watch reported as lost in previous newsletter was claimed by the owner.


Crime Watch

The Cleburne High School Yellowjacket Baseball Team battled deep into the playoffs this year. With a record of 35-3-2 they were ranked #1 in the state and one of the top 5 teams in the country. Two young men from our neighborhood were members of that team. Junior Marcos Guereca who played 1st base and sophomore Dryden Taylor who played centerfield.

The Yellowjackets were District Champs and went on to win 3 rounds in the playoffs before being defeated in the Region Semi-Finals by Prosper. Falling just short of their goal of State Champs.
