



THE MUSIC OF LIFE

The exciting rhythm of October with the leaves changing color yields to a more thoughtful and reflective tone as November ushers in a cold winter of dormancy.

The month begins this Wednesday, with the celebration of All Saints' Day, a Holyday of Obligation. On this day, we remember all those whose lives have been crowned with sainthood, both known and unknown. Sure, most of us have our favorite saints whose feasts we celebrate throughout the year. There also exists a vast array of good individuals who have never been given that title, God alone knows the human heart; God alone can judge.

On Thursday, November 2, we commemorate All Souls' Day. We recall all those who have passed, who are still being prepared for their heavenly home. We assist them by our prayers, sacrifices and offerings. We remember them often.

On Friday, November 3, at 7:00 PM, we will pause especially to call to mind all those who have passed from our parish during the past year. While we especially pray for them, we also commend to God those who are grieving their loss. Adjustments are never easy, especially when they are as dramatic as the loss of a loved one.

In the light of celebrating the lives of all these good people, it is easy to see why the Bishop designates this first week as National Vocation Awareness Week.

Bishop Thomas reflects that these holy disciples form and inspire holy families, which in turn nourish and sustain holy vocations.

Please join with us this week, as you are able, in celebrating the saints, remembering the souls, and praying for vocations.


