




Grace & Peace from the Pastor's Desk

Matthew 25:34-40

"Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a...

...stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, [g] you did it to me.'

Those of us who have are blessed. We have food, shelter, clothing, we are in our own neighborhoods, we have water. There are people in Erie who are looking for these items. We most likely do not see them because we are not looking for them, but they exist. In the winter I drive by the old Citizens Bank on 10th and State. There are little alcoves incorporated into the building's structure. Every day in the winter I see a person sleeping in one of the alcoves.

I have received calls from people don't have enough money to pay their utility bills, or who are new in town and found a job but don't have the money for gas to get to the workplace. We know from our little food pantry outside of the church that there is a need for food, masks, warm clothing. I am so happy that we have started this ministry.

But what else can we do? How can we be connected to the community around us in a way that will be beneficial to the people, not to just give handouts, but to help them make a better way in life. How can we make a difference in our community?

Is there a possibility that persons may want to learn how to sew? Maybe there are people who need to be educated to pass their GED? Would a mother's day out or a parent's night out be helpful so our neighbors don't have to take their children shopping or just to give parents a break. Stretching that a bit farther, are there parents of disabled children who need a safe place for them to stay while they get a little break? Or maybe people need to learn how to cook so they can stop buying fast food meals.

These are just some ideas I've seen put to work at other churches, and you might be finding reasons we can't do them here at Immanuel. But if this excites you, or if you have other ideas, let's put our heads together and brainstorm about ways we can either use the building here at Immanuel, or find places in the community where we can go be the church. We can Dream Big!





SELECTING A CLEANER ELECTRIC POWER SUPPLIER IN PENNSYLVANIA

In Pennsylvania, most of us can choose who we pay to generate electricity. (Some electric cooperative customers may not have this choice available.) This means that you can switch to a supplier offering cleaner energy (like wind or solar) that better reflects our call to care for God's creation. You can compare rates for cleaner power with rates for older technology power and find that sometimes you can either save money or pay very little extra to get cleaner power.

Selecting a new supplier will not change your billing process or the electric lines coming into your home. You will still pay your total bill to the same company (your distributor), but the amount you pay for generation will be transferred from the distributor to your chosen supplier. The power generated by your selected supplier doesn't come directly to your home. It is fed into a "grid" network of power lines that collect power from many companies and transmit and distribute the electricity to homes.

The supplier switch procedure uses an internet website set up by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PA PUC). Following are steps for selecting your electricity supplier.

- 1. Go to <u>www.papowerswitch.com</u> (official electric shopping website of the PA PUC)
- 2. Enter your zip code.
- 3. Take note of the price charged by your current supplier. Call this company to determine what methods of generation (fossil, solar, wind, nuclear, etc.) is associated with their electricity and the percent associated with each.
- 4. Select "fixed price", all the "no fee" options, and one of the following types of renewable power: Renewable Energy, Renewable PA, PA Wind, or Solar.
- 5. Check the lowest supplier price to compare with your current source. The difference in price for renewable energy as compared to your current supplier may be a small enough difference for you to switch suppliers. Enrolling at a higher price can still be the right choice in that you are paying for generation of clean energy that's less damaging to God's creation, which we are called to protect. You can also opt to get more details on any company by clicking "Learn more about this offer".
- 6. Take note of the contract duration being offered. Usually, longer duration times have the higher prices. Note that your selection above of "no cancellation fee" means that you can end your contract at any time by selecting a different supplier. Regardless of the contract duration you choose, you should repeat this search when the contract ends. Prices will probably go up, but you can select another supplier at a better price.
- 7. The www.papowerswitch.com website allows you to click "sign up for offer" to begin the switch with any company you decide upon.
