She married (1) ANTON HANAUER May 24, 1841. He was born 1817 in Wittenheim, Alsace, France, and died August 20, 1852 in Victoria, Texas Victoria County. She married (2) CHARLES WISSING M.D. March 31, 1856 in Victoria County. He was born March 29, 1830 in Germany, and died April 14, 1881 in at home in Victoria, Texas Victoria County.

Notes for ANTON HANAUER:

A native of Alsace, France, born 1817, emigrated to Victoria, Texas, in 1843. Engaged in merchandising until his death, which occurred August 20, 1852. Anton Hanauer is buried in Memorial Square in Victoria with a five year old daughter Nanette who died in 1842 after surviving the epidemic of that summer--- weakened heart, they say.

Marriage Notes for MARY SENGELE and ANTON HANAUER:

Castro Colonists leaving the port of Bremen Germany for America. Landed at the port of Indianola, Texas and established residence on East Forrest Street in Victoria, Texas instead of continuing to Castroville, Texas.

Notes for CHARLES WISSING M.D.:

Came to Victoria, Texas from Germany in 1856. Native of Hohr, Nassau, Germany. In conjunction with Drs. Thornton & Goodwin. Appointed on the Board of Medical Examiners in 1873. Was active in practice for 26 years. Died at age 52. Opened the first drug store in Victoria, Texas. Smoked cigars.

SOPHIE CAROLINE⁴ HANAUER (*MARY ANNA³ SENGELE, JEAN THIEBAUT SENGELE² JR., JEAN THIEBAUT¹ SENGELE*) was born December 10, 1843 in at sea from Bremen Germany to Indianola, Texas, and died September 05, 1920 in Victoria, Texas Victoria County. She married THEODORE HEYCK January 09, 1866 in Victoria, Texas Victoria County. He was born June 14, 1825 in Dockenhuden, Holstein, Germany, and died January 16, 1909 in Abilene, Texas.

Notes for SOPHIE CAROLINE HANAUER:

Born on the ship Jan Kay near Cuba. Was 76 years, 8 months, and 26 days old at time of her death.

Notes for THEODORE HEYCK:

Born in DEockenhuden, Holstein, Germany near the North Sea on the river Elbe left from Bremen for Galveston, Texas on the ship Solon arriving there June 1, 1852. Clerked there until January 1853 and then accepted the position as Bookkeeper of the firm G.W. Adams and Co. Shipping and Commission at Port Lavaca, Texas. He became a partner in the business with C.H. Jordan and thereafter established the shipping commission business of Heyck and Helferich at Port Lavaca. Served in the first Texas Cavalary, Col. Buchel from March 1863 til Lees surrender in April 1865. Opened up business agtain in Port Lavaca in 1865 until 1872 and thereafter moved to Galveston in 1881.

Marriage Notes for SOPHIE HANAUER and THEODORE HEYCK:

Lived in Port Lavaca and Galveston then moved to Abilene, Texas weher Theodore was in the mercantile business until his death. Later Sophie moved to Victoria, Texas until her death.

MARY ANNA⁴ HANAUER (*MARY ANNA³ SENGELE, JEAN THIEBAUT SENGELE² JR., JEAN THIEBAUT¹ SENGELE*) was born November 19, 1853 in Victoria, Texas Victoria County, and died April 08, 1934 in Victoria, Texas Victoria County. She married HENRY CARL GRAMANN October 10, 1882 in Abilene, Texas, son of HENRICH GRAMANN and ANNA STEINER. He was born July 28, 1855 in Victoria, Texas Victoria County, and died March 24, 1936 in Victoria, Texas Victoria County.

Notes for MARY ANNA HANAUER:

Mary Anna was the daughter of Anton Hanauer an immigrant from Wittenheim, Alsace, France and Mary Anna Sengele and immigrant from Sennheim, Alsace, France. Mary was born 3 months after her father died. Her mother married Dr. Charles Wissing on March 31, 1856, they had no children. Mary Anna was often called by the Wissing name while growing up. At the age of 28 she married Henry Charles Gramann and they had 7 children, 6 of whom survived.

Mary Anna stressed cheerfulness when her children were growing up. She would often pin up some happy saying on the mirror, so each could see it when they went by or when they combed their hair.

She was an accomplished pianist. She was a member of St. Mary's Choir for years. Along with Reverend A. Gardet she greeted the first 5 Catholic sisters to arrive from Brownsville to Nazareth Academy in Victoria on December 21 1886 to open a convent and school and assisted in many school endeavors until her death. She is buried in the Catholic Cemetery in Victoria, Texas in Victoria County.

She was petite with blonde hair.

Notes for HENRY CARL GRAMANN:

In an article for the Victoria Advocate (Victoria, Texas) in 1930 the following was written "Henry Carl Gramann was reared in Victoria, and after attending Private schools taught here by Capt. William H. Allen, later of San Antonio, and the late Prof. William T. Eichholz, he took a commercial course at Soule's Business College in New Orleans. Mr. Gramann served his apprenticeship in the grocery business under Adolph Goldman, and in March, 1878, he started his present business, which is the oldest established grocery business in Victoria, as well as one of the leading institutions of its kind in this city. In the summer of 1883 he was a Petit juror. In 1883 he was a member of Fire Co. #1 in Victoria. He was married in Abilene, Texas, October 10, 1882, to Anna Hanauer, the daughter of Anton Hanauer, a native of Wittenheim, Alsace, France, and Mary Anna Sengele Hanauer-Wissing, a native of Sennheim, Alsace, France, deceased. Mr. and Mrs. Gramann have had seven children, of whom six survive (as of 1930): Henry Theodore, Anna Augusta and Alfreda Columbia Gramann of Victoria and Mrs. William Frobese, Jr., Carl Anthony Gramann and Mary Louise Gramann of Cuero.....Mr. Gramann also has four sisters: Mrs. John C. Beasley, Sr., of Beeville and Mrs. August Klein and Misses Minnie and Ida Gramann of Victoria. "

Was a member of Victoria Hook & Ladder Company #2 in 1891. In 1908 was a trustee in the Knights of Columbus Victoria (Texas) Council #1329 and was one of the original 32 members when it was granted its charter on May 3, 1908 (certificate #4639).

The Gramann Grocery store was later a gift shop in Victoria, Texas.

Henry played the flute and was a tall handsome man with dark hair and a jolly disposition.

Gramann Grocery store was located on the east side of Main Street between Santa Rosa and Constitution Streets and later at 112 Santa Rosa Street.
