#### **BUILDING PERMITS**

Residents are reminded that permits must be obtained for most property improvement projects such as: roofs, window changes (not replacement), fences, sheds, driveways, decks, retaining walls, additions, plumbing, electrical, porches, etc. Contact the Building Inspector or the Village Office if you are in doubt or have questions. Permit and zoning forms can be found on the website. The inspector is in the office on Monday's or as needed. When planning your construction project, please allow a two-week time frame for appropriate permits, estimates, locates, etc.

#### **OPEN BURNING**

Burning trash and garbage is prohibited. Fall burning of dry leaves and other non-offensive dry yard debris is <u>only</u> allowed from October 1<sup>st</sup> thru November 30<sup>th</sup>. Outdoor cooking and campfires are allowed per Village Ordinance but must be supervised at all times. See ordinance section 14-84 and 14-85 for more information.

## YARD WASTE SITE FOR LEAVES/BRUSH

There will not be a scheduled leaf pick-up in the Village; instead you can now take your leaves and any brush to the site located off Vince Street at the intersection of Savannah Trail. Site is open Monday – Friday from 7:30-3:30 and the 1st and 3rd Saturday of the month from 8-12 noon.

## **INTERESTED IN PUBLIC SERVICE**

The Village Board is encouraging residents to participate in their local government. Three Village Board trustee positions are up for re-election in April 2020. The candidate must be a Village resident and at least 18 years of age. Interested candidates may pick up the election nomination papers from the Village office on or after Dec. 3, 2019. The filing deadline to be a candidate for Village offices is no later than 5:00 p.m. on Jan. 2, 2020. The elected officials will begin their term of office the third week of April 2020. # 2020 State Hwy 22/Main Street Project

In the summer of 2020, the Wis DOT will be doing a paving project on Hwy 22/Main St. Their project will consist of milling and overlaying the existing driving surface and parking lanes.

In preparation of this project, the Village will be doing sanitary, water & storm sewer spot repairs. This work will take place earlier in the year, ahead if the Wis DOT work. We will post information on our website as it becomes available and hold informational meetings.

## **GARBAGE/RECYCLING REMINDERS**

Garbage and recycling pick up is every Friday. Items MUST be out by 7 a.m. to ensure collection. Items placed out late will NOT be picked up. Questions on what is recycling? Stop in and pick up a flyer.

Please place garbage and recycling bags/containers on a flat surface and **NOT** in the snow banks. During extreme weather conditions, pick-up times may be adjusted. Items frozen to the ground cannot be picked up.

Would you like to see the Village move to supplied garbage and recycle carts? This will be a referendum question on the April ballot. Informational meetings will be held early next year. Please vote if you would like to see this change take place.

## **WINTER PARKING RULES**

Winter parking rules are in effect from *November 15<sup>th</sup> to April 1st* between 1:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. Park cars on the odd or even side of the road that corresponds to the day from 1 a.m. to 6 a.m. (Example at 1 a.m. on the 16<sup>th</sup> you would need to be parked on the even side of the road.)

A SNOW EMERGENCY IS AUTOMATICALLY DECLARED when a snow is forecasted to be 3" or more during any period of 24 hours or less. Under a snow emergency **ALL** vehicles must be **OFF** the streets until they have been plowed. We will enforce our ordinance 32-155.

## **TAX COLLECTION INFO**

The Village Hall will be closed the following days for the holidays:

## Dec. 24 & 25; Dec.31 and Jan.1

For your convenience, real estate taxes can be receipted for the 2019 year if postmarked on or before Dec. 31 or placed in the drop box prior to January 2, 2020. The first half of your tax bill is due at the Village Hall by January 31, 2020 and the final payment is due at the County Treasurer's office by July 31, 2020.

#### **SNOW REMOVAL**

Don't forget that you must clear the snow/ice from your sidewalk within 24 hours after the snow has stopped. **Snow/ice should not be pushed or blown onto the street.** 

If there is a fire hydrant in the right-of-way on your property, please remove the snow around it. This is for your safety and the safety of your neighbors in case of a fire emergency this winter.

#### IF YOU HAVE A MAILBOX

The Village of Pardeeville <u>WILL NOT BE</u> <u>RESPONSIBLE</u> for mailbox damage caused by the plowing of snow (force of pushing snow).

## **CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION**

The Village will pick up your used tree the second week of January. Place the tree at the curb by Monday, January 13, 2019 for it to be picked up!

## **LICENSE YOUR PET(S)**

Dog and cat licenses are required annually. You must bring in proof of rabies vaccination from your veterinarian's office (this must include date of vaccination, tag # and manufacturer of vaccine; not your receipt of services). We will begin issuing license tags for 2020 on December 2, 2019. Licenses are due by April 1, 2020 or a late fee will apply!

License Fees: Spayed/neutered dog or cat \$5.00. Unaltered dog or cat \$10.00. You can drop off your rabies certificates with payment and a self-addressed stamped envelope and we will mail your tags if you cannot make it to the office during open hours. Contact the clerk with questions or concerns.

## **ELECTIONS & VOTER REGISTRATION**

Next election is not until February 2020 however, you must re-register if your name or address has changed since the last time you voted. Please visit www.myvotewi.gov or the office during open hours to register. Please bring proof of residence!

If you wish to receive an absentee ballot you may request that at any time up until the Thursday before an election. If you have questions on elections, registration or absentee ballots, please contact the office.
