

We are seeking a full-time **School Based Mental Health Therapist** to work within the Southern Minnesota Education Consortium in multiple school districts to provide mental health services within the school setting. These services are provided within a federal Level 2/3/4 special education setting determined by the student's Individualized Educational Plan (IEP). Students within this setting spend part, or all, of their day within a Learning Center Resource classroom and transitioning to mainstream classes throughout the school.

Responsibilities:

- Conduct diagnostic assessments & develop individualized treatment plans
- Maintain accurate and timely documentation of services provided
- Provide individual, family and group psychotherapy to adults, adolescents and children using evidence & research-based practices
- Maintains and enhances knowledge of current clinical practice
- Attend & actively engage in individual supervision & weekly program meetings
- Collaborate with school systems, caregivers, outside agencies, and school staff
- Create effective working relationships with colleagues and community partners
- Ensures that therapeutic interactions are sensitive to and in accordance with the family's cultural needs and interests
- Maintain progress towards licensure and follow requirements of supervision as applicable
- This position follows an academic calendar and will begin in August, 2019
- Perform other duties as assigned

Requirements:

- Master's degree in one of the behavioral science field (psychology, social work, counseling, and/or related field)
- Licensure completed OR on licensure track as LMFT, LPCC, LP, or LICSW
- Excellent communication, advocacy and collaboration skills preferred
- Must have reliable transportation, a valid driver's license, valid automobile insurance, and acceptable driving record
- Must pass criminal background check based on agency and Department of Human Services requirements
