Alberta Schubel, 97, of Port Austin died Tuesday, Oct. 23, 2001, at Courtney Manor in Bad Axe following a long illness. She was born May 24, 1904, in Alma, daughter of the late John and Bertha Gobel. She graduated from Alma College in 1926 and came to Port Austin that year as a teacher in the Port Austin school system. Alberta and Ted H. Schubel were married in 1931. He preceded her in death in 1986. After teaching many years in Port Austin, she completed her teaching career at Bad Axe High School. She was a former clerk of Pointe Aux Barques Township, postmistress of Pointe Aux Barques post office, member of the Port Austin Priscilla Club, Order of the Eastern Star and United Protestant Church, and she was a volunteer worker for many years in the Huron Memorial Hospital gift shop. She also served as organist for the United Protestant Church and Kinde Presbyterian Church. She was an avid reader, gardener and traveled extensively to all parts of the world. Schubel and his wife, Margaret, of Boston, Mass.; four grandchildren, Ted Schubel and his wife, Susan, of Fredericksburg, Va., Sally Arndt and her husband, Kevin, of Port Hope, Susan Liss and her husband, Anthony, of Breman, Maine, and Kathryn Schubel of Easton, Pa.; and eight great-grandchildren.
