# Ohio Veterans Hall of Fame Inducts MilWomen Life Member Frona Liston

Frona Liston of North Canton, OH, was inducted into the Ohio Veterans Hall of Fame, Class of 2017 on November 9th. The Ohio Veterans Hall of Fame seeks to recognize Ohioans who have worn the uniform of this nation's armed forces, performed their military duties and then continued to contribute to community, state and nation in an exemplary manner. The program is administered by the Ohio Department of Veterans Services.

"These are individuals who have served and also contributed to their communities," said Sandra Puskarcik, Ohio Veterans Hall of Fame coordinator. "It can be in the area of professional achievements, civic or public service, volunteerism, veterans' advocacy or other significant achievements over the life of the nominee."

"These people are truly high achievers," Puskarcik said. "These are incredible people deserving the honor."

Frona, who is 92 years young, served in the U.S. Navy (pictured at left) during World War II at the then-Long Beach Naval Hospital in California. She transcribed doctors' notes into the patients' records. "The wounded men were out there," Frona recalled. "You were thinking you were going to see all these sad people, but they were keeping our spirits up."

After her military service, she spent the next 50+ years holding a variety of jobs in medical and clerical fields, but most of her life has been dedicated to the service of others. A life member of Military Women Across the Nation, Frona remains very active in Northeast Ohio Women Veterans Unit 21 having served as the unit's president, vice president, treasurer and secretary. Additionally, she served as the 2000 WAVES National Convention Co-Chair when Ohio hosted the convention.

She was nominated by current Unit 21 President Jennifer Baun who described Frona as

someone who puts in a lot of work in a quiet manner. "But you get to see the successes of the things

she does," Baun added. "An individual like that has such an impact, needed to be nominated."

Frona worked with the Minerva (OH) school system and the village librarian to coordinate an adult literacy program helping adults learn to read. "I think it was the most rewarding thing I have ever done for other people," Frona said. "Then I came to North Canton. There I got involved in English as a second language."

Frona is an adult literacy tutor with the Sebring Area Literacy Council, a volunteer at the North Canton Heritage Society where she serves to preserve, protect and share history of North Canton, OH, and she tutors children and adults in English as a Second Language. In leadership and committee roles, Frona has mentored many young adults by encouraging high standards and promoting the ideals of responsibility and dedication. She also initiated a published history collection of Unit 21 members, a copy of which is housed at the Library of Congress.

#### **Stained Glass Program Discontinued**

The Stained Glass Window (SGW) Program has been disestablished. The program was originally created after a group of WAVES National (WN) members visited England in 1984 and saw a stained glass window in a cathedral which honored the Women's Royal Navy Service.



The SGW Program solicited donations to have stained glass windows featuring the World War II W.A.V.E.S. prop and anchor emblem created and mounted in buildings at military installations holding significance to military women.

The beautiful windows were installed at ten locations: the Navy Chapel, Washington Navy Yard, DC; North Chapel at Navy Training Station (now located at Veterans Memorial Center) San Diego, CA; Our Lady of Guadeloupe Catholic Chapel and Our Lady of Loretto Shrine, both in Corpus Christi, TX; the Music Building of Lehman (formerly Hunter) College, Bronx, NY; Naval Medical Center, Portsmouth, VA; Ida Mae Lewis Auditorium, Coast Guard Recruit Training Center, Cape May, NJ; (pictured above) the chapel at Recruit Training Command, Great Lakes, IL; 4th Recruit Training Battalion Headquarters, Parris Island, SC, and Cathedral of the Pines in Rindge, NH.

The Board of Directors disestablished the program for a number of reasons, the most notable of which was logistics. Because of base realignments and closures, many of the buildings housing the current windows are no longer owned by the government or located on military bases.



### Nora Patella: British by birth, American at Heart!

Nora Patella, an associate member of Northeast Ohio Women Veterans Unit #21, is originally from Ingatestone, a village in Essex, England, about 20 miles northeast of London. A young, patriotic girl when Great Britain declared war on Germany in 1939, Nora's thoughts turned to serving her country.

At the time, women were not permitted in the Royal Army or Navy, but that did not stop her. In 1940, just shy of her 17<sup>th</sup> birthday, Nora joined the Auxiliary Territorial Service (ATS) and was almost immediately assigned to drive a "lorry" (a large truck) at a transportation division in Essex.

As an early ATS volunteer, she received no specific training or uniform to conduct her duties. Nora moved supplies, materials, wounded personnel and even the fallen. When she wasn't driving she dug trenches or tended to the wounded as a first responder or when medical personnel couldn't care for civilians affected by the war.

She was also assigned in London for months at a time during the Blitz – a massive German bombing offensive against Britain from 1940-1941. When there was nobody else to pick up a task, women like Nora did what was necessary for the British people to survive the war, including caring for and getting the children who were orphaned or left in the streets to a safe place.

Nora proudly served until June 1944 and was only separated at that time when it was discovered she was six months pregnant. Following the war, with her husband, one suitcase and an infant on her hip she moved to the United States where she has lived for the past 70+ years.

Nora has been as equally proud and patriotic of her new country as she is of her homeland. For this reason, Nora was honored at the 2017 Patriots' Day program,

sponsored by Ohio Marine Corps League Detachment 494 in Austintown, Ohio. Annually, Det 494 recognizes a service member from each war era. Nora was singled out for her service as part of the Allied Forces during World War II.

Because she left England so soon after the war, Nora was never issued any of the medals or citations she earned. Her Unit 21 sisters corrected that situation by recently presenting Nora with a shadow box containing the 1939–1945 Star, the Defense Medal, and the War Medal 1939–1945 she should have received.
