Why do Christians encounter hardships, troubles and difficulties?

I. God sometimes sends us into difficult situations.

A. Jesus deliberately sent his disciples into a storm.

Mark 6:45 And immediately He made His disciples get into the boat and go ahead of Him to the other side to Bethsaida, while He Himself was sending the multitude away. 46 And after bidding them farewell, He departed to the mountain to pray.

- 3. He wanted them to develop stick-to-itiveness (perseverance). Would they continue to do what is commanded... what is right, or would they turn around?

III. God does this to teach us something that we had not known

[Background- In the feeding of the five thousand, they should have learned that Jesus was the Bread of Life. Joh 6:35,48.]

Mark 6:48b He *came to them, walking on the sea; and He intended to pass by them. 49 But when they saw Him walking on the sea, they supposed that it was a ghost, and cried out; 50 for they all saw Him and were frightened. But immediately He spoke with them and *said to them, "Take courage; it is I, do not be afraid." 51 And He got into the boat with them, and the wind stopped; and they were greatly astonished, [same word used for Jesus being crazy]
