

Other pre-game prepping is done by Darlene Savage who is busy pounding away at apples turning them into delicious applesauce to be served on the tables and in the to-go packs. Tickets are sold thanks to Dennis Biehl and Mike Lowery who split the task to distribute them to people to sell. They also made sure advertisement was set up to spread the word of the big day that soon would come.

Tom and Phyllis Heffner were the captains of the pot pie making ship starting Friday when they set sail coming to the church early in the morning to cook the chicken. Later other members of the church came on board to help debone the chicken and do other prep work, getting a jump start on the rough waters ahead, trying to keep the boat calm with the Lord giving his helping hand for the Saturday to come.

The great day did come starting early Saturday morning with the dough to be made. A new machine was brought to help things along and boy did it help. It moved the dough rolling process along saving at least 30 mins, things were looking good. But that wasn't all. While everyone helped to cut the rolled dough and set it out on the table to dry. Other jobs were being done, like pulling all the supplies out, making sure that there was enough serving spoons, sugar and bowls to go around to all the tables.

During Saturday morning everyone's favorite thing, DESSERT was making its way into the church. Thanks to Sally Miller who weeks in advance sends out half paper plates to let all know that their baking help is needed for the big day. As the many different desserts rolled in Sally, and her team of cake and pie cutters got to work, knowing just what size to cut and just how many to cut to make sure everyone had a great variety to pick from, and wow, there was a lot to pick from. You know you have a good variety when the hardest part of the night is what dessert to pick from. By afternoon a moment to take a break and grab a bite to eat was had by all, some going home to get a few last minute things done or get that last 30 minute nap, knowing a long night is still ahead of them.
