

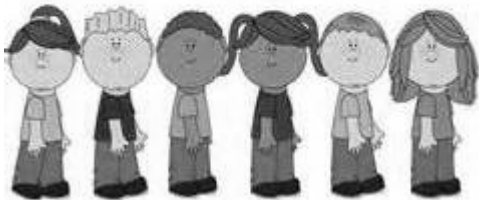
Convention presentation.

- 44. Dual membership shall not be counted in both clubs; the primary club (the one designated by the member) shall be given the credit. This applies to Standing Rules 46 and 47.
- 45. An award shall be given at Convention to the Club with the highest percentage gain in membership for the previous year.
- 46. The Federation Participation Award, the Chimes, shall be given to the Club participating the most effectively in Federation Activities during the previous year.
- 47. A perpetual award of a mantel clock inscribed "Fine Arts Festival Award" in writing on the plaque shall be presented to the Club with the best overall participation in the Fine Arts Festival.

AMENDMENTS

These Standing Rules may be amended at any District Board meeting by a 2/3 vote without notice or a majority vote with previous notice.

CLUB AWARDS

37. All Chairmanships may give awards.
 - a. First and second place awards may be given in each membership group as established by the District.
 - b. Chairmen shall forward to GFWC/CFWC any report meriting a first place award and any additional reports an award as requested by the State Chairmen.
 - c. Award certificates shall be given to Clubs, not individuals.
 - d. Certificates of Commendation shall be given to Club Chairmen whose report wins an award and also to any member who has a winning entry in contests such as creative writing.
38. Ten Award Certificates shall be made available to any club upon request. Additional certificates may be purchased.
39. Awards may be given in special fields or projects provided each has been approved by the Executive Board and announced in advance. Information shall be placed in the District Bulletin.
40. No reports received after midnight of the deadline shall be considered for judging.
41. Judges for Fine Arts should be knowledgeable in the field they are judging.
42. District Chairmen shall report winners to the District Dean who will provide certificates to the chairmen. The District Dean will determine the form for the certificate.
43. No winner shall be announced until the

for three-fourths (3/4) of each Board and Council meeting to qualify for 100% attendance award.

- a. Members of the Board who are GFWC/CFWC or GFWC officers or chairmen are excused when on itinerary.
- b. Members are not eligible for 100% attendance if another has attended for them. A Vice-President may represent a Club President and her Vice-Chairman may represent a District Chairman.

YEARBOOKS, BULLETINS

- 33. District yearbooks shall be distributed as follows:
 - a. Four copies for each Club for use by their President, First Vice-President, Corresponding Secretary, and the Treasurer.
 - b. Two copies to District Officers and Chairmen.
 - c. One copy to District Past Presidents, GFWC/CFWC and GFWC Officers and Chairmen residing in the District.
 - d. Five copies for GFWC/CFWC use, to be taken to the Fall Board meeting.
 - e. Club members may purchase yearbooks at a Cost to be determined by the Executive Committee.
- 34. Each Club shall provide the District with six copies of the Club Yearbook, or membership roster if there is no yearbook. Copies shall be given to the President, First Vice-President, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Public Relations Chairman, and the Parliamentarian.
- 35. The District Bulletin shall be sent to GFWC/CFWC and GFWC officers and Chairmen residing in the District, and all GFWC/CFWC District Presidents.
- 36. Members of the District shall pay for the Bulletin subscription, the cost to be determined by

27. A reserve account from the District Convention net profit shall be established for Convention speakers and entertainment.
28. The President's Expenses at GFWC/CFWC Conventions and State Board meetings shall be paid from the District Treasury. This shall include applicable registration, transportation covering airfare or mileage (amount for mileage to be determined by CFWC), half of a hotel room and official meals.
29. The District shall pay expenses for the newly elected President in the election year to attend the GFWC Convention. She shall submit an itemized statement of expenses.
30. When attending GFWC/CFWC Convention and State Board Meetings as First Vice President, she shall be reimbursed the following expenses: one-half of applicable registration, one-half the cost of transportation for airfare or mileage (amount for mileage to be determined by each administration) that is not to exceed the lowest airfare, one-quarter (fourth) of the rate of a two-bed hotel room, and one-half official meals
31. The Second Vice-President, Membership Chairman, when attending GFWC/CFWC State Board Meeting emphasizing Membership, shall be reimbursed the following expenses: one-half applicable registration, one-half cost of transportation for airfare or mileage (amount for mileage to be determined by each administration) that is not to exceed the lowest airfare, one-quarter (fourth) of the rate of a two-bed hotel room, and one-half official meals.

ATTENDANCE AWARDS

32. District Board members must attend and remain

18. Only members, in good standing, of a Federated Club may serve as a Chairman or committee member.
19. No Club President or Dean may serve as a District Chairman. A Club member cannot hold the same chairmanship in both her Club and the District. No member may hold the same chairmanship in more than one Club.
20. The Care and Concern Chairman shall send cards to members of the Executive Board who are ill. In the event of the death of a member of the Board, a memorial of \$25.00 shall be sent to the CFWC Itinerary Fund.
21. The Amenities Chairman, under the direction of the President, shall coordinate gifts to be presented to the District guests, Fine Arts Judges, and any persons to be honored. Gifts shall be purchased with District Funds.
22. The Amenities Chairman shall be responsible for the District sound system. The system shall not be rented to any organization.
23. Legislative concerns shall be referred to the Legislative Chairman for her investigation. Action by the District may be taken after her report. Both sides of an issue must be presented.

CONVENTIONS

24. The Executive Committee shall host the District Convention Reception on Sunday evening in the election year and by the Club of the President in the non-election year.
25. The President shall have the complimentary suite at the District Convention if one is offered by the Hotel.

9. Meals at District functions shall be \$15.00. When a District Club provides a luncheon, the district shall retain \$2.00 per meal.
10. Clubs may request permanent dates (as the first Wednesday in November) for Federation or Reciprocity Days. With approval of the Executive Board, these days shall be reserved for Clubs on the Master Calendar until the Club requests a change.
11. Club Reciprocity dates shall be cleared with the District First Vice-President at the June Board meeting.
12. All Workshops and Conference dates shall be cleared with the District Dean of Chairman.
13. Past Presidents of the District, GFWC/CFWC and GFWC officers in attendance at the Birthday Council shall have courtesy luncheons.
14. Clubs shall be responsible for ordering President's and Past President's pins. Membership and district pins may be purchased from the District.

OFFICERS, CHAIRMEN, COMMITTEES

15. The President shall be given a fifty-dollar monthly expense allowance. She shall be a guest of the District at the Garden Conference, and District Convention.
16. The President shall be given a monthly desk allowance of \$10.00.
17. Necessary supplies and small expenditures for chairmen and officers shall be provided for in the budget. The Executive Board shall approve a signed itemized statement for payment. Any budgeted money not spent will be turned back to the General Fund.

STANDING RULES

POLICIES, ETHICS, AMENITIES

1. The District Roster shall not be used for any other than business of the District.
2. Federation stationery shall not be used for other than Federation correspondence. All stationery shall be printed by order of the Executive Committee and be obtained from the person designated to keep it.
3. The Financial Reviewer shall be appointed and review the financial books of the district quarterly; reporting to the executive board in the months of September, December, April and June.
4. Authorization by the Executive Committee of non-budgeted expenses shall be limited to \$200.00.
5. Members shall not use their position in the Federation to endorse enterprises, furthering partisan politics, or distribute unauthorized literature, nor shall members receive pay for the use of their name with a Federation title.
6. The District President must give permission for the distribution of circulars and pamphlets at any District function. Sale of books, periodicals, or merchandise at any District meeting is prohibited unless the Executive Committee gives permission.
7. If necessary, savings account interest earned during the current year may be transferred to the District General Fund.
8. Meal reservations must be made in the name of a specific person. Reservations must be made or cancelled by the designated deadline. Members will be responsible for reservations not cancelled and the chairman will send a bill to anyone not abiding by these rules.

ARTICLE XVII METHOD OF AMENDMENT

Section 1. These bylaws may be amended by 2/3 vote at the annual Convention provided the proposed amendments shall have been included with the Call to Convention.

Section 2. These bylaws may be revised at any convention provided that the order for a revision had been adopted by a 2/3 vote at the previous Convention.

ARTICLE XVIII DISSOLUTION

Being a non-profit organization, dedicated to charitable purposes, and in order to comply with the Internal Revenue Code Law, in the event this organization is dissolved, the assets or any net profits remaining, after payment or provision for payment of debts or liabilities, shall be transferred or distributed to a non-profit fund, organization, or corporation as agreed upon at a meeting by a majority vote of the membership at the time of dissolution, which are provisions of 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Code of 1969 Revised.

No part of the assets or net income shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer, or member or to the benefit of any private person.

Section 3. The Executive Board may accept, reject, or may defer the resolution to the delegates at the next District Convention.

Section 4. Any resolution to be considered by the District Convention must be received by the Resolutions Committee by February 1st.

Section 5. Proposed resolutions shall be sent with the Call to Convention.

Section 6. Emergency resolutions shall pertain to subject matter that has arisen since preparation of the Call and shall receive the same consideration as other resolutions to be presented to the Convention.

ARTICLE XV ENDORSEMENT FOR STATE OFFICERS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. Before January 21 of the election year, the names of those qualified for State Office shall be presented to the State Nominating Committee. (GFWC/CFWC Bylaws, ARTICLE XIV, Section 3.)

Section 2. The District Convention shall elect candidates to be presented at the Area C meeting at GFWC/CFWC Convention.

- a. GFWC/CFWC Bylaws and Resolutions candidates shall be elected in the election year of the administration.
- b. GFWC/CFWC Nominating and Election candidates shall be elected in the non-election year of the administration.

ARTICLE XVI PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

The Los Cerritos District shall be governed by these bylaws and the latest edition of Robert's Rules of Order.

Our California State and General Federation Emblems



The golden emblem of the California Federation of Women's Clubs was designed in 1903 by Miss Bernice Scoville. The emblem is the insignia of a common cause and creates a spirit of cooperation among those who wear it.

The torch represents the educational work of the Federation and invites all to knowledge of the principles of American Citizenship

The wings pointing upward are symbolic of the higher thoughts and aspirations which are the aim of all. The band encircling wings and torch typifies the unbroken chain of strength and loyalty—loyalty to our clubs and to our state. A buckle symbolizing the strength of unity joins the "loyalty blue" band into a circle, universal symbol of friendship.

The state motto, "STRENGTH UNITED IS STRONGER", selected by Annie Little Barry, reminds us that in unity there is strength, and through the united efforts of the club women of California, it is possible to accomplish many things for the benefit of the people of the state.

The band encircling the center of the GFWC emblem signifies eternity. The crusader's shield emerging from the darkened world—represented by the field of black enamel—signifies enlightenment. The enameled colors are the colors of our country's flag. The red implies courage, the white, purity, the blue, constancy. The embossed letters GFWC stand for the General Federation of Women's Clubs. The words "UNITED IN DIVERSITY" is the motto of GFWC. The full risen sun on the blue field represents the enfranchisement of women.

The emblem may be worn by any member of a Federated Club. Emblems may be obtained from your District Membership Chairman.

Section 2. Election of officers shall be in even numbered years. Election shall be by ballot. A plurality vote shall elect. Proxy voting shall not be allowed.

Section 3. Elective officers shall be: First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President, Fourth Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Treasurer, and Financial Secretary.

Section 4. Officers shall assume their duties June 1.

Section 5. The Chairman of the Election Committee shall have supervision of the arrangements for voting and printing of ballots.

Section 6. The elections shall be held the first day of the Convention.
a. Voting hours, which shall not be less than one hour, shall be decided for each election by the Executive Committee at the February meeting.

Section 7. The chairman of the Election Committee shall read the Teller's report to the assembly.

Section 8. The Secretary shall destroy all ballots at the adjournment of the Convention.

Section 9. The incoming President shall call a meeting of the newly elected officers to ratify the appointment of the Corresponding Secretary, Financial Advisor, Public Relations, and the Parliamentarian.

ARTICLE XIV RESOLUTIONS

Section 1. The Resolutions Chairman shall chair a committee of three from the Executive Board. The Parliamentarian shall be a non-voting advisory member.

Section 2. This committee shall receive all resolutions proposed by member Clubs. It shall be the duty of the

ARTICLE XII ELIGIBILITY

Section 1. To be elected for office in the District, candidates shall be nominated by the Club in which they hold membership.

Section 2. Eligibility for the office of President:

- a. Shall have served one term of two years as District First Vice-President or District Second Vice-President.
- b. Shall have served one term as a District Federated Chairman.
- c. Shall have served one year as President of a Federated Club.

Section 3. Eligibility for the office of First Vice-President:

- a. Shall have served one term of two years (or major portion thereof) as an elected officer on the Executive Committee.
- b. Shall have served one term as a District Chairman.
- c. Shall have served one year as a President of a Federated Club.
- d. She shall fill the vacancy of the President if such a vacancy occurs.
- e. Shall not be a member of the same Club as the President.

Section 4. All candidates must be members of Federated Clubs in the District and shall have served one year on the District Board.

Section 5. Officers shall not hold the same office in more than one District at the same time.

Section 6. No officer may hold the same office for two consecutive terms except for the Treasurer who may serve one additional term.

ARTICLE XIII ELECTIONS

Section 1. There shall be an election committee of five elected at the January meeting of the election year, no one

- h. A Club of fewer than twenty-five (25) members may have one elected delegate,
- i. A delegate shall represent but one club and shall have one vote. Voting by proxy shall not be permitted.

Section 3. The President and Secretary of each Club shall certify the names of delegates and alternates and send to the Credentials Committee at least one (1) week before the Convention.

Section 4. A registration fee shall be established annually by the Executive Board. The fee to be paid by any member of the District who attends any session or function. Guests of members of the District, who attend a meal function only, shall not pay the fee.

Section 5. A quorum shall be a majority of the delegates registered at the Convention.

ARTICLE XI NOMINATIONS

Section 1. A Nominating Committee of five (5) and five (5) alternates shall be elected from the floor of the District Convention in the non-election year. Three (3) members shall be from the Executive Board. No member may serve more than one consecutive term.

Section 2. The Parliamentarian shall convene and instruct the nominating committee, at which time a chairman shall be elected.

Section 3. Clubs nominating members shall send a list of the nominee's qualifications to the Chairman of the Nominating Committee before the January Executive Board meeting. Nominations from Clubs will close February 1st.

Section 4. The names of the nominees shall be read at the February Board meeting. Nominations from the floor shall be in order. Consent of the nominee must accompany the nomination. The committee shall complete the slate by March 1st.

ARTICLE IX COUNCILS

- Section 1.** Two Council meetings shall be held each year.
- The March Council will honor all Past District Presidents.
 - The March Council will be designated as the Birthday Council. All new members in the Clubs will be recognized. It will replace the regular Executive Board meeting; all Board members are invited as well as members of the Clubs.
 - The October Council will replace the regular Executive Board meeting. All Board members are invited as well as members of the Clubs.

Section 2. Business cannot be conducted at Council Meetings without the approval of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE X CONVENTIONS

Section 1 The annual District Convention, of the election year, shall be held in April at a time determined by the Executive Committee. The Convention, in non-election year, may be a one-day Convention held in April with the date determined by the Executive Committee.

- The election year convention may be three days as determined by the Executive Committee.

Section 2. Representation, Voting Body

- District Officers.
- District Chairmen.
- District Reservation and Co-Chairman, Financial Review Chairman, Credentials Committee, Resolutions, and Bylaws Committees.

- Club Deans of Chairmen or their alternates.

Section 2. The Executive Committee shall:

- Have the power to act in an emergency between Executive Board meetings.
- Perform all duties delegated to it by the Executive Board.
- Fill all vacancies in elected and appointed offices and in vacancies in chairmanships.
- Ratify all appointments.
- Select banking institutions for deposit of monies and have supervision of all monies.
- Approve all fundraising projects for the year.

Section 3. The Executive Committee may:

- During the year, if necessary, recommend budget changes to the Executive Board.
- Omit July and August Executive Board meetings.

Section 4. A quorum is five members.

ARTICLE VIII MEETINGS

Section 1. The business meetings of the District shall be those of the Executive Committee, Executive Board, and the Convention.

Section 2. The Convention shall be held at a time and place determined by the Executive Committee.

Section 3. Regular monthly meetings of the Executive Board shall be held at a time and place selected by a majority vote of the Board members. Meetings may be omitted during the months of July and August. The Executive Committee shall meet prior to the Board meetings and at the call of the President.

Section 4. Special meetings may be called by the President or by written request of five clubs. Notice of the meetings shall be written and sent to all members at least forty-eight (48) hours before time of the meeting.

Section 12. The Public Relations Chairman shall:

- a. Be responsible for all District press releases including photos.

ARTICLE VI EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1. The Executive Board shall consist of the Elected Officers, Standing Committee Chairmen, Club Presidents, Club Deans, District Financial Review Chairman, and District Past Presidents who are a member of a Federated Club in the District.

Section 2. The Executive Board shall conduct the business of the District between Conventions.

Section 3. The annual budget shall be adopted at the September meeting. The budget may be revised during the year by a majority vote.

Section 4. District Chairmen shall give a report at the Board meeting (when they have information to share). They shall provide materials to individual Clubs, have annual reports judged, and make an annual report to be sent to GFWC/CFWC. At the end of her term, each Chairman shall give all papers to the incoming chairman.

Section 5. Failure of a Board Member to attend three times in succession, without legitimate excuse, shall cause her to be removed and a vacancy declared to be filled by the Executive Committee.

Section 6. Chairmen shall serve for the two-year administration and shall not be appointed for more than two consecutive administrations (total of four years) in the same chairmanship.

Section 7. A quorum shall be fifteen (15) members, five of which shall be officers.

ARTICLE VII EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section 1. The elected and appointed officers, shall constitute the Executive Committee.

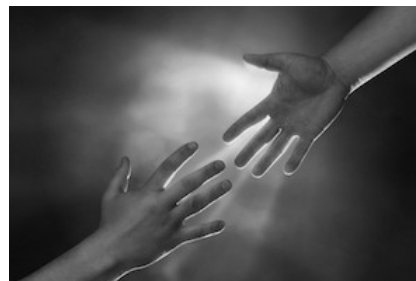

- b. Assume the duties of a President-Elect immediately following the adjournment of a non-election year convention and continue duties as Dean of Chairmen.
- c. Be a member of the budget committee.

Section 4. The Second Vice-President shall:

- d. Process applications for new club membership.
- e. Process reinstatement applications.
- f. Purchase Federation membership pins, emblems, maintain the inventory, and make reports as requested.

Section 5. The Third Vice-President shall:

- a. Be program chairman for District Council meetings and the Convention.
 1. Programs to be approved by the Executive Committee.
- b. Be responsible for Auditions.
- c. Assist the President under her direction.

ARTICLE IV DUES

Section 1. The officers of the District shall be:

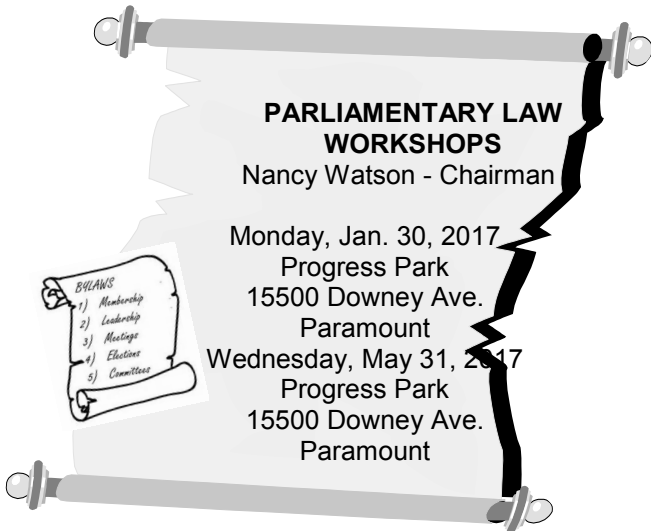
